Unhappy student dies by suicide

Panikoili, May 27: Unhappy over the marks he had obtained in the Matric exams, a student, residing at Badabirua village under this police limits of Jajpur district, died by suicide late Sunday night, cops said Monday. He took the drastic step by hanging himself with a sari from the ceiling when he was alone in the house around 11.00pm at night. His family members had gone to a neighbour's house in the same village.

Family members said that the deceased, since the results were announced appeared depressed as he got 'C' grade in the exams. He had expected higher marks, they added. However, they stated that they never thought that the student would die by suicide. Police after being informed, reached the house of the deceased and sent the body for post-mortem.

Don't trust Guj govt: HC

The Gujarat High Court came down heavily on the state government and Rajkot Municipal Corporation while hearing the game zone fire mishap case in which 27 persons have died so far. It blamed the BJP-led state government for turning a blind eye to the mushrooming of a large number of game zones without proper licenses and fire safety certificates

Gandhinagar, May 27: The Gujarat High court Monday, while hearing the game zone case in which 27 people, including children, have lost their lives, expressed ire both at the state government and the Rajkot Municipal Corporation (RMC) for their joint failure to prevent the mishap. The high court also stated that it does not have 'faith on the state machinery' which only gets into action after lives are lost.

SC JUNKS BJP PLEA

New Delhi: The Supreme Court refused Monday to entertain a plea filed by the BJP challenging a Calcutta High Court order which had refused to interfere with a single-iudge verdict restraining the party from issuing advertisements that are allegedly violative of the model code during the Lok Sabha polls, A vacation bench of Justices JK Maheshwari and KV Viswanathan refused to interfere with the high court order, "Prima facie, the advertisement is disparaging," the bench said, Earlier a division bench of the Calcutta High Court had said it was not inclined to entertain the appeal against the interim order passed by the single-judge bench which restrained the BJP from publishing advertisements that violated the MCC and criticised the Trinamool Congress until June 4.

over 24 months each - without the required permits, including fire safety certificates, and said it could no longer 'trust' the state government, run by the BJP. "This has been going on for two-and-a-half years (referring to the Rajkot gaming zone). Are we to assume you turned a blind eye? What do you and your followers do?" the court thundered.

The bench also ripped into the state government. "Have you gone blind? Did you fall asleep? Now we do not trust the local system and the state," the bench raged when told fire safety certification hearings have been unresolved for four years.

Advocate Manisha Luv Kumar Shah, appearing for the Gujarat government, acknowledged that two other gaming zones in Ahmedabad did not have permissions to operate. The state said a gaming zone cannot open sans a fire certificate, to which the High Court, appearing increasingly irritated, shot back, "Then this rule was not followed in Rajkot.

Meanwhile in a separate development Monday, the Gujarat government ordered the suspension of five officials, including two police inspectors and civic staff, with immediate effect for negligence in the fire mishap. Three persons so far arrested in the case were sent to police custody for two weeks by a court in Rajkot, special public prosecutor Tarun Gokani

Desperate tactics: Panda

Kendrapara, May 27: Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik launched Monday a scathing attack on BJP's national vice-president Baijayant (Jay) Panda without naming him. He accused the two-time former Kendrapara MP of betrayal towards both himself and the people of the Lok Sabha constituency.

Breaking his usual stance of avoiding personal attacks, Patnaik aimed his criticism at Panda without explicitly naming him at an election rally where he endorsed BJD candidate Anshuman Mohanty.

"I made someone (Panda) the MP from Kendrapada for 10 years. However, he worked only for his own prosperity and the profit of his company without doing anything for the people," the BJD president said while addressing an election rally here.

Panda was elected to the Lok Sabha from Kendrapara in 2009 and 2014 when he was with the BJD. He contested from the same seat for the third time on a

BJP ticket in 2019, but lost the polls by a margin of over 1.5 lakh votes to BJD's nominee and cinestar Anubhav Mohanty.

"The people of Kendrapada gave him the responsibility of the area for 10 years. He did nothing for the constituency and worked for himself. He betrayed me as well as the people," the Chief Minister said.

Responding to Patnaik's accusations, Panda, an industrialist-turned-politician, dismissed them as desperate tactics, insinuating external influence on the

Chief Minister's statements. "I've heard about the CM's allegations. I don't hold him accountable, as it seems he's being fed these allegations by someone else, colloquially referred to as 'Tamil Babu', who seems to be prompting him while holding the microphone," Panda said. "Lord Jagannath has given us enough and I am here to work for the people," he added.

Senior BJD leader Kartik Pandian echoed Patnaik's sentiments, accusing Panda of prioritising personal interests over public welfare during his tenure.





Mobile phones claim 163 lives in '23

Bhubaneswar, May 27: Mobile phones are a potential source of distraction while driving, with Odisha witnessing 433 road accidents and loss of 163 human lives last year due to such dangerous tendencies during driving, said State Transport Authority (STA) officials, Monday.

In view of the rising fatalities caused by mobile phone distractions, the STA has urged drivers to not use phones while driving. In a message on social media, the STA said, "If you're using your phone while driving and think it's okay to do so then you're making a big mistake. Look at what has happened to many people who think like you.'

The message is a direct reference to the fatalities caused by ob-

sessive mobile addiction last year. An analysis of the 433 mobile phone-related road accidents last year revealed that 247 of those were serious in nature, STA said.

It is observed that when the signal turns red at the traffic in-

one takes out ones mobile phone and uses it to browse social media, and search videos, or read content. Even this is banned at traffic intersections, the STA said.

The STA said use of mobile phones, ear phones or Bluetooth devices while driving is strictly prohibited. Violation of the rules will invite a fine of Rs 5,000 as per Odisha Motor Vehicle Act, and Rs 500 as per Urban Police Act. "Commissionerate Police is also strict in this matter," the STA said.

Apart from use of mobile phones while driving, drunken driving, driving on the wrong side (in violation of the Motor Vehicle Act provisions) has also contributed towards the rising graph of road accidents in the state, said STA officials.



GET 3-YEAR IN JAIL OVER BRI

Bhubaneswar, May 27: A special Vigilance court here Monday sentenced a former revenue inspector (RI) and an ex-senior clerk to three years jail term after convicting the duo in a bribery case.

Baikunthanath Mohanty, the clerk, ex-senior Rabindranath Barik, ex-RI of Pratap Revenue Circle of Banapur Tahasil in Khurda were arrested and subsequently chargesheeted by the Vigilance under Sections 13(2) r/w 13(1)(d)/7 of the PC Act, 1988 and 120B of the IPC for demanding and accepting bribe from a person for grant of sand quarry lease. The court also slapped a penalty of ₹20,000 on

Kalahandi PEO lands in Vigilance net

KESINGA: Vigilance sleuths Monday arrested the panchayat executive officer (PEO) of Kaniguma gram panchayat in Kalahandi district while he was receiving ₹10,000 as bribe from a Gram Sathi for processing muster roll and facilitate labour payment in connection with construction of check dam under MGNREG Scheme, an official said.

"Based on a complaint filed by the Gram Sathi, Vigilance sleuths caught Sanyasi Nayak at Bhawanipatna town red handed while he received ₹10,000 from the complainant. The entire bribe money was recovered from the possession Nayak which was seized in presence of witnesses. Both hands wash as well as pant pocket wash of Nayak gave positive chemical reaction, confirming acceptance and handling of bribe money by him," said the official.

Following the trap, simultaneous searches have been launched at the residential house of Nayak in Bhawanipatna town, another house at Lanjigarh and his office room. "The accused has been arrested," said the official.

Khurda, May 27: BJP workers est outside the sub Collector office here, Monday demanding unconditional release of the party Assembly nominee Prasanta Kumar Jagadev who was arrested on charges of vandalising an EVM during polling, May 25.

They also threatened to stage a blockade on the national highway and call for a bandh in Khurda town if the Chilika MLA was not released.

The saffron party workers also alleged that the ruling BJD hatched a conspiracy to arrest Jagadev, who is contesting from the Khurda Assembly segment this time, and demanded the CCTV footage of the polling booth be made public.

BJP MP and Bhubaneswar Lok Sabha candidate Aparajita Sarangi said, "Locals claimed that Jagadev did not destroy any EVM. Why is CCTV footage of the polling booth not being examined? The police must make the footage of the booth public.'

Jagadev was arrested by the olice Saturday for allegedly vandalising the EVM at the Kaunripatna booth in the Begunia Assembly segment where he, along with his wife, had gone to cast votes, May 25.

Khurda Superintendent of Police (SP) Avinash Kumar said the BJP candidate was arrested based on an FIR filed by the presiding officer of the polling booth in Bolagad block's Kaunripatna where he is a voter.

Jagadev was booked under various Sections of the IPC and the Representation of People's Act, the SP said

In his complaint, the presiding officer alleged that the MLA created disturbances at the booth, obstructed the voting process and abused polling personnel there, Kumar said.

On May 25, polling was held simultaneously for six Lok Sabha seats and 42 Assembly constituencies in the state.

Good news for farmers as IMD predicts above-normal rainfall

New Delhi, May 27: India's core monsoon zone covering most of the rain-fed agriculture areas, including Odisha, is likely to receive above-normal rainfall this season, the IMD said Monday.

Below-normal monsoon rainfall is expected in northeast India, normal in northwest, and above-normal in central and south peninsular regions of the country, India Meteorological Department (IMD) Director General Mrutyunjay Mohapatra said at a virtual press conference.

Retaining its April forecast, the IMD said the country could see above-normal rainfall in the four-month monsoon season (June to September) with cumulative rainfall estimated at 106 per cent of the long-period average of 87 cm.

"India's monsoon core zone comprising most of the rain-fed agriculture areas is likely to receive above-normal rainfall (more than 106 per cent of the long period average). This is good news for the country," Mohapatra said.

Large parts of Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Bihar, West Bengal and Uttar Pradesh form the country's core monsoon zone where agriculture is primarily rain-fed.

At 94 per cent of the long-period average, India had recorded below-normal cumulative rainfall during the 2023 monsoon season due to drier June and August.

Northeast India has been recording below-normal monsoon rainfall since 2021, according to IMD data.



The IMD chief said the country is likely to experience normal rainfall (92-108 per cent of the long period average of 166.9 mm) in June.

"Barring a few parts of southern peninsular India, normal to above-normal maximum temperatures are expected in the country in June," the senior meteorologist said, adding that conditions are favourable for monsoon onset over Kerala in the

next five days. With the crippling heat testing power grids and triggering drought-like conditions in parts of the country, the prediction of above-normal monsoon rainfall comes as a huge relief for the nation.

However, normal cumulative rainfall does not guarantee uniform temporal and spatial distribution of rain across the country, with climate change further increasing the variability of the rain-bearing system.

Climate scientists say the number of rainy days is declining while heavy rain events (more rain over a short period) are increasing, leading to frequent droughts and floods.

The monsoon is critical for India's agricultural landscape, with 52 per cent of the net cultivated area relying on it. It is also crucial for replenishing reservoirs critical for drinking water, apart from power generation across the country

According to the Central Water Commission, water storage in 150 major reservoirs in India dropped to just 24 per cent of their live storage last week, exacerbating water shortages in many states and significantly affecting hydropower generation.

June and July are considered the most important monsoon months for agriculture because most of the sowing for the Kharif crops takes place during this period. According to scientists, El Nino conditions are prevailing at present, and La Nina may set in by August-September.

While El Nino -- periodic warming of surface waters in the central Pacific Ocean -- is associated with weaker monsoon winds and drier conditions in India, La Nina -- the antithesis of El Nino -- leads to plentiful

rainfall during the monsoon. Data from the 1951-2023 period shows India experienced above-normal rainfall in the monsoon season on all nine occasions when La Nina followed an El Nino event. The country gauged above-normal or normal monsoon in 20 out of the 22 La Nina years.

Magic mushrooms show promise as a treatment for anorexia

norexia nervosa is a severe mental health disorder where people fear weight gain. Those with the disorder have distorted body image and hold rigid beliefs their body is too big.

They typically manage this through restricted eating, leading to the serious medical consequences of malnutrition.

Anorexia has one of the highest death rates of any mental illness. Yet there are currently no effective drug treatments and the outcomes of psychotherapy (talk therapy) are poor. So there is need of new and improved treatments

Psilocybin, commonly known as magic mushrooms, is one such novel treatment. But while it shows early promise, it's not used in clinical practice just yet - more research is needed to test if it's safe and effective.

What does treatment involve? The treatment involves the



patient taking a dose of psilocybin in a safe environment, which is usually a specifically set up clinic. The patient undergoes preparation therapy before the dosing session and integration therapy after.

Psilocybin, extracted from mushrooms, is a psychedelic, which means it can produce altered thinking, sense of time and emotions, and can often result in hallucinations. It also has the potential to shift patients out of their rigid thinking patterns

What does the research show? Research has shown improved effects of psilocybin-assisted psychotherapy after one or two dosing sessions, a couple of weeks apart. Most research to

date has targeted depression. Psilocybin has been found to increase cognitive flexibility – the ability to adjust our thinking patterns according to changing environments or demands.

People with anorexia similarly struggle with rigid thinking patterns. So researchers and clinicians have recently turned their attention to anorexia.

In 2023, a small pilot study of ten women with anorexia was published in the journal Nature Medicine. It showed psilocybinassisted psychotherapy (with 25mg of psilocybin) was safe and acceptable. There were no significant side effects and participants reported having valuable experiences

Although the trial was not a formal efficacy trial, 40 per cent of the patients did have significant drops in their eating disorder behaviour.

However, the trial only had one dosing session and no longterm follow up, so further research is needed

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A recent animal study using rats examined whether rigid thinking could be improved in rats when given psilocybin. After the psilocybin, rats gained weight and had more flexible thinking (using a reversal learning task).

These positive changes were related to the serotonin neurotransmitter system, which regulates mood, behaviour and satiety (feeling full).

Brain imaging studies in hu-

mans show serotonin disturbances in people with anorexia. Psilocybin-assisted psychotherapy is showing promise at modifying the serotonin disturbances and cognitive inflexibility that have been shown to be problematic in anorexia.

What's next for research? Further clinical trials in humans are very much needed and are underway from a research team at the University of Sydney and at Swinburne.

The trial will involve an initial 5mg dose followed by two subsequent doses of 25mg, several weeks apart. An initial low dose aims to help participants prepare for what is likely to be a new and somewhat unpredictable experience.

The trial will also examine the usefulness of providing psychotherapy that directly addresses body image disturbance.

ACTIVIST ALLEGES THAT OFFICIALS ENGAGED IN IDENTIFYING SENSITIVE BOOTHS **HAVE FILED FALSE REPORTS**

Jajpur, May 27: Allegations of severe irregularities in identification of sensitive booths have surfaced in Jajpur district.

The officials have identified 281 booths as sensitive out of 1,637 booths under the Jajpur Lok Sabha segment. However, allegations are rife that severe irregularities have been committed in identification of sensitive booths.

The matter came to the fore after a social activist Pratap Kumar Jena filed a complaint before the Election Commission of India (ECI), Saturday. The ECI admitted the complaint and apprised the concerned officer through the National Grievance Services Portal (NGSP) and also

forwarded the email to him for quick response on the matter. The ECI has also informed the complainant about the action taken by it on the issue.

The complainant has alleged that the concerned officials engaged in identifying sensitive booths have filed false reports on these booths at the behest of the ruling party in the state. They have done this to facilitate booth rigging and capturing in the actual sensitive booths.

Sukinda block is not the lone block in the district where actual sensitive booths have been written off from the list of sensitive booths. Such irregularity has allegedly been committed in some other blocks of Jajpur district. He has demanded before the ECI to issue a public clarification and ensure that no such irregularity takes place in future.

According to the complaint, 39 booths have been identified as sensitive booths under Sukinda Assembly constituency in Jajpur district. However, more than half of those booths are not at all sensitive, it is alleged.

The complainant has claimed that CCTV cameras have been esout any necessity, while the booths that are actually sensitive and hyper sensitive have been excluded from the list. It is apprehended that the law and order situation in these booths could go out of hands during the election scheduled for June 1,

The officials have not taken any preventive measure. As per past records, recent survey and intelligence reports, 32 booths under this Assembly constituency are hyper sensitive and the chances of rigging looms large on these booths.

These booths are Deogaon, Ardapal, Ragada, Benagadia-1, Benagadia-2, Chingudipal-1, Chingudipal-2 under Chingudipal panchayat, Gurujang, Kaliapani-1, Kaliapani-2, Kaliapani-3, Kaliapani-4 under Kaliapani panchayat and Kalrangiatta-1, Kalrangiatta-2, Kalrangiatta-3, Kalrangiatta-4, Ransol, Mahulakhai and Kusumundia under Ransol panchayat.

Similarly, Champajhar, Tomka under Kiajhar panchayat, Santargadia and Goudbahali under Uchhabali panchayat, Chandia under Chandia panchayat, Rabana-1, Rabana-2, Dasamania under Mantira panchayat, Jakhpura-1, Jakhpura-2, Jakhpura-3 and Jakhpura-4 under Jakhpura panchayat and the Chakua booth under Khapuriapada panchayat have been categorised as hyper-sensitive booths. Names of some of these booths have been uploaded in the civil evidence section of ECI portal and complaints have

Cyclone Remal brings havoc for Olive Ridley eggs, hatchlings

Kendrapara, May 27: The adverse weather conditions and torrential rain caused by Cyclone Remal in the Bay of Bengal have severely disrupted the emergence of Olive Ridley turtle hatchlings at the mass nesting sites of Nasi-2, the world's largest rookery of the species in Odisha.

DFO of Rajnagar Mangrove (forest) and Wildlife Division. Sudarshan Gopinath Jadav, said the turbulent sea, along with high tides due to Cyclone Remal, washed away several eggs. The incessant rain also damaged the turtle eggs, he added.

Official sources said about 1.20 lakh Olive Ridley sea turtle hatchlings emerged from the eggs at the mass nesting sites of Nasi-2 three days ago. However, the prevailing adverse weather conditions due to Cyclone Remal have halted the emergence of the baby

"We are now in a wait-and-

watch situation with fingers crossed, as we anticipate the eggs might have been destroyed due to Cyclone Remal," Jadav said. Around 3 lakh Olive Ridley

sea turtles came ashore en-masse to the golden beach of Nasi-2 within Gahirmatha Marine Sanctuary and laid eggs over five days, starting April 2. The mass nesting process of the sea turtles was also affected by the adverse weather, Jadav noted. According to Jaday, the hatch-

lings of the endangered Olive Ridley sea turtles started emerging six days ago at the tranquil sandy nesting ground at Nasi-2, located close to the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) at Wheeler's Island under the Gahirmatha Marine Sanctuary.

He said it was expected that the process would continue for at least the next five days, but Cyclone Remal has disrupted the emergence of the baby turtles from their eggshells.

Earlier, due to multi-layering at Nasi-2, more than 15 per cent of the eggs laid were destroyed in some segments during the mass nesting, as turtles were seen laying eggs on the same

flippers, and destroying previously laid eggs.

Female Olive Ridley sea turtles generally lay 100-120 eggs at a time. They lay their eggs at midnight in 45-cm pits, which they dig 2-3 feet deep with their rear flippers. Hatchlings emerge from the eggs after 45-55 days and find their way to the sea, creating a cacophony, the DFO said. Once hatched, the turtles dig their way to the surface and scurry to the ocean.

It is believed by some that imprinting on the Earth's mag netic field may occur upon their emergence from the sand. This imprinting is thought to guide the hatchlings back to the same breeding areas in adulthood. If the hatchlings reach the ocean successfully, they will spend the next several years dispersing in ocean currents, associating with sargassum rafts and floating debris, which provide them with food and shelter, Jadav said.

It is one of nature's rare phenomena where babies grow without their mother. The endangered species' mortality rate is so high that only one out of every 1,000 eggs laid hatches and survives to become an adult Olive Ridley turtle, Jadav explained.

Huge amount of explosives seized in raid

Balasore, May 27: Police here recovered a huge quantity of explosives from abandoned stone quarries near Khaniamahal under Mahumuhan panchayat and Soro block in Balasore district, sources said Monday. The explosives were supposed to be used for blasting in the quarries in order to extract stones.

The team found 1500 kg of gelatin sticks from a secluded place near Bagudi and also recovered 6000 kg of explosives and gelatin sticks from an abandoned stone quarry near Mahumuhan. Police registered a case (476/24) in this regard at Soro police station and launched an investigation into the matter.

The raid was conducted following allegations of stone smuggling from illegal quarries in Khanjamahal locality.

It is pertinent to mention here that miscreants use explosives to extract stones from illegal stone quarries after blasting

Char Dham Deaths

istressing news has come from Uttarakhand that 58 pilgrims have died in the last 16 days while on the Char Dham Yatra. Government sources have put daily 3 deaths on an average. The religious fervor spreading across India seems to have had its negative impact even though the religious minded are unwilling to accept these stark realities. The deaths are not isolated nor are they a rare occurrence. Take for instance the Madhya Pradesh Navaratri stampede in Ratangarh in 2013 which took the lives of 115 people and injured 110 and the Morbi bridge collapse during Diwali in Gujarat in October 2022 which killed 141 people and injured dozens. In a stampede at a fair in Gangasagar, six pilgrims died in a stampede in 2017. In another stampede at the Vaishno Devi temple in J&K, 12 people lost their lives and many others were injured on 1st January 2022. These few instances are but samples and there are numerous other incidents where large number of people have lost their lives and many have had near fatal injuries.

The Char Dham Yatra, like a few others across the country, is government sponsored and managed to infuse more religiousity amongst the citizens. According to Uttarakhand state government, as published in news reports, nearly three pilgrims have died per day during this current season of the Char Dham Yatra. It is undoubtedly a noble effort on the part of the people to take this ardous journey to liberate their souls by getting absolved of all sins committed during their lifetime. For people with such a high aspiration, the government seeks registration and a health certificate to distinguish who is physically fit to endure this pilgrimage.


Unfortunately, many pilgrims have been observed to be forging their health certificates which are a pre-requsite for availing this difficult journey. We have to keep in mind that they take all this trouble to get rid of their past sins. And yet many knowingly lie about their health condition on record. This disproves their keenness about the religion that they profess. Data shows that in 2022 in this same Char Dham Yatra, 300 people had died while 250 people had lost their lives in 2023. This means these huge number of deaths should ring a warning bell for the government that can, under present circumstances, be held responsible for those lives lost.

Therefore, the Char Dham Yatra consisting of Jamunotri, Gangotri, Kedarnath, Badrinath and similar pilgrimages should not involve the government machinery at any stage. Originally known as Chota Char Dham Yatra, which became bigger due to government sponsorship after 1962 China war, is a torch bearer of such pilgrimages. Seen in this background, the government has two options. First is to altogether stop approving such perilous journeys. Second, applicable only if religion overpowers, should be a complete withdrawal of government intervention in any religion linked journeys such as this Chota Char Dham Yatra or even Haj pilgrimage.

THE KERALA MODEL

KERALA IS FAR AHEAD IN THE DEMOGRAPHIC TRANSITION AND AGEING AMONG ALL THE STATES OF INDIA

he class 10 state board exam results were announced last week in Kerala. One remarkable achiever was Shivrai Mohite from St. George's High School, Vennikkulam in Ernakulum district. He scored A+ in all his subjects. What was remarkable is this boy is the son of migrants from Maharashtra's Sangli district, and he had scored verv high marks in all subjects including Malayalam, which is also the medium of instruction of his school. His father is a salesman in a textile shop and settled here two decades ago, even before his marriage. Both his children have received free education, in a private school of fairly high quality, making it possible for his son to be a top scorer. Another girl, daughter of a migrant worker from Uttar Pradesh also scored A+ overall. This is very unlike in the migrant worker's village in UP, where girls do not even reach class 10. Here they are already planning further studies for the girl, whose elder sister is pursuing an engi-

neering degree in Kerala. The success of 85 such students in Ernakulum district is due to an initiative called ROSHNI supported by the district administration. The ROSHNI project helps migrant children acquire proficiency in Malayalam, English, and Hindi by taking extra morning hours of about 90 minutes before the morning classes. Services of volunteers who are proficient in Hindi, Bengali and Odia are used. There are hundreds of such success stories of children of migrant workers, who get free education, in the local language and move on to enhancing their careers by pursuing higher degrees, based on this solid foundation. A few years ago the topper in state-wide Malayalam literacy exam was a woman from a Bihari migrant family. Another case was the daughter of a Bihari migrant who topped a University B.A. exam. During the pandemic the migrant labourers and their families were helped with pro-

visions and rations and did not have to go back to their respective states. They got food, shelter and medical care.

Kerala is far ahead in the demographic transition and ageing among all the states of India. It also is the state which traditionally has substantial outmigration to the Middle East. Due to a combination of these and other factors its dependence on migrant workers is high. An estimated 4 million migrant workers are based in Kerala where they are called guest workers. But for the state, it goes beyond lip service as some of the anecdotes above illustrate. For starters, the average daily wages paid to unskilled workers in the state was ₹709 in 2021, as against the national average of ₹309. Workers do all sorts of jobs from working in plantations, construction, retail malls, or as cooks, waiters, security and helpers in workshops. Kerala also has skill development and vocational training programmes to enhance the employability of guest workers. Then there is the free Aawaz Health Insurance scheme covering hospitalisation and medical treatment of guest workers. Free education for children and assimilation into the local language is a high point and has already been mentioned.

There is also special attention paid to protect the legal rights of workers from exploitation, unsafe working conditions or illegal low wages. The state has established a comprehensive database to register guest workers which helps in planning and

implementing welfare schemes. In 2021 a survey conducted by Gram Vikas, an NGO in the Kalahandi district of Odisha. found that seasonal migrants from 26% of households chose to go to Kerala to work in various sectors (unskilled) and earned an average salary of ₹12.000. Two third of most of the migrants located outside Odisha reported Kerala as their destination. The internal migration of workers from the rest of the country to Kerala itself has created a mini-remittance economy as money flows from sayings generated in Kerala to the homes states like Odisha, Jharkhand, Assam and Bihar.

There are over 50 million migrant workers in India who are working outside their home state, of which 4 million are in Kerala. Ultimately Kerala's absorption rate of migrant workers will be limited by the size of its economy and its growth rate. Kerala used to get nearly 25% of its state income as remittance income from overseas workers. That has

dropped to less than 15%, indicating robust domestic drivers of growth and consumption. The state faces challenges of ageing demographics, lack of manufacturing investment and employment and unaffordable real estate. It has performed well in attracting knowledge industries, but much needs to be done in climbing the ladder of quality in education and innovation.

However, Kerala does offer a model for other states to follow when it comes to treatment of inmigrants, i.e. guest workers. The state goes to considerable length to extend welfare to the workers and their families, and especially taking care of the educational needs of the children. The special attention given to assimilating workers from the north, into the local language Malayalam, into society and culture is admirable.

According to the 2011 census, about 450 million Indians are on the go, as migrants, either within the state or inter-state. The migration can be seasonal, circular or semi-permanent. The Constitution gives us a right to move to any place in the country to seek economic opportunities. This is the great antidote or option available to escape lack of job or livelihood opportunities in one's own region. But not everyone can migrate, and even fewer can do so with their whole families.

People with land holdings, especially small ones are tied to the land. Only the able bodied can migrate. Migration is thus both a positive sign of enterprise as much as a response to lack of local opportunities. In much of the Western world there is a backlash against immigrants as they are seen as snatching away local jobs. But the case study of Kerala offers us constructive approach on how to harness the potential and energy of migrants without causing any negative disruption of local communities. That is the true spirit of calling the migrant worker a guest worker.

tudent suicides are a dis- 2023, the highest since such tragic the same time, there is a pervaquires a multifaceted approach: lights the profound mental health challenges faced by them while pursuing education. Between 2019 and 2021, there were over 35,000 student suicides in India, as disclosed by Union Minister Abbaiah Narayanaswamy. The figures escalated from 10.335 in 2019 to 12,526 in 2020 and 13,089 in 2021. The National Crime Records Bureau says that 6,113 students committed suicide during 2022 which accounts for 7.6% of the total number of the year. They are not limited to general colleges but also to premier institutions like IITs, IIMs, and medical colleges.

Kota, a city in Rajasthan, is renowned for its coaching institutes, especially for students preparing for various entrance examinations to prestigious engineering and medical colleges. However, beneath its glass house lies a grim reality – the alarming rate of suicides among students which has drawn national

and international attention. According to data from Rajasthan Police, 15 students died by suicide in 2022, and the number alarmingly increased to 27 in

tressing reality that high- end of lives have been recorded from 2015 onwards. The first quarter of the current year witnessed seven incidents where students, unable to bear the fear of failure and disappointing their families put an end to their lives. The government revealed in Parliament that 61 deaths by suicide occurred at IITs, IIMs, NITs since 2018. Around 130 medical students had died by suicide during the last five years. The issue of suicides is a multi-

faceted one, rooted in the intersection of socio-economic, psychological, family and academic factors. One of the primary reasons attributed to student suicides is the intense pressure from family as well as institutions to excel academically. The fear of failure and the relentless pursuit of success can take a toll on their mental health, pushing some to take the fatal step of despair.

Despite the glaring mental health challenges faced by students in the campus there is a significant lack of adequate support system. In most institutions counseling services are often nil or inadequate or inaccessible, leaving students grappling with their emotional turmoil alone. At

help for psychological problems, particularly in academic settings. Students may fear being perceived as weak or incapable if they admit to experiencing mental health challenges. This stigma often prevents them from reaching out for support when they need it most, leading to a worsening of their condition. The rigorous curriculum, de-

manding coursework, and high performance expectations create an environment where students feel constantly under scrutiny.

The financial strain is a significant stressor for many college students, especially those from low-income backgrounds or families facing economic hardships. The rising cost of tuition, accommodation, textbooks, and other expenses can create a heavy financial burden, forcing students to juggle multiple responsibilities, such as part-time jobs, to make ends meet. The constant worry about finances, combined with the pressure to succeed academically, can take a toll on students' mental wellbeing and contribute to feelings of hopelessness and despair.

Addressing student suicides re-

to educate students, teachers, and parents about mental health issues, stress management, and seeking help; training teachers and counselors to recognise signs of distress or mental health issues in students and provide appropriate support; ensuring students have easy access to mental health resources such as counselors, therapists, and support groups; fostering a supportive and inclusive school environment where students feel valued, respected, and connected; encouraging open conversations about mental health to reduce stigma and make it easier for students to seek help without fear of judgement.

It is also necessary to work with community organisations, healthcare providers, and mental health professionals to provide comprehensive support to students. By working together as educators, administrators, students, and community members, we can create environments that promote mental health, resilience, and academic success for all students.

Windfall dividend

J&K sees highest voter turnout in 35 years

ASSEMBLY POLLS SOON: CEC


New Delhi, May 27: The Election Commission Monday said the voter turnout in Jammu and Kashmir this time was the highest in a Lok Sabha election in the last 35 years with the Kashmir Valley witnessing a massive 30 percentage point jump in poll participation compared to 2019.

Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar said this achievement sits on a 25 per cent increase in the number of contesting candidates since 2019.

This active participation is a huge positive for the assembly elections to be held soon so that the democratic process continues to thrive in the Union Territory, he said

The poll panel also said the combined voter turnout at the polling stations for the entire Union Territory with five Lok Sabha seats was 58.46 per cent.

On Saturday, CEC Kumar told PTI Videos that encouraged by the voter turnout in Jammu and Kashmir in this Lok Sabha polls, the Election Commission will very soon initiate the process of conducting the assembly polls in the Union Territory.

The voter turnout of 50.86 per cent from the three parliamentary constituencies in the Kashmir Valley echoes the faith of the people in the democratic process, the Election Commission said, adding the poll participation percentage witnessed a 30-point jump from the 2019 general elections where it was 19.16 per cent.

The three seats in the Valley Srinagar, Baramulla and Anantnag-Rajouri -- recorded a voter turnout of 38.49 per cent, 59.1 per cent and 54.84 per cent respectively, all of which have been the highest in the last three

In December, the **Supreme Court directed** the poll panel to hold assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir by September 30

The other two seats in the Union Territory -- Udhampur and Jammu -- which fall in the Jammu region, recorded 68.27 per cent and 72.22 per cent voter turnout respectively, it said.

The Election Commission said that an increasing number of young people have asserted their faith and embraced democracy in a big way.

Another interesting perspective is the people in the age group of 18-59 years who constitute over 80 per cent of the electorate in each of the five Lok Sabha seats of the Union Territory, it underlined.

The high poll percentage in the 2024 Lok Sabha polls is reflective of their faith in democracy, which is a positive and heartening development, the poll panel stressed.

Whenever an assembly election is held in Jammu and Kashmir, it will be the first since the August 2019 abrogation of Article 370 of the Constitution and the bifurcation of Jammu and Kashmir into two Union Territories with the other being Ladakh which has one Lok Sabha seat and no provision for a legislative assembly.

Following a delimitation exercise, the number of assembly seats in Jammu and Kashmir has gone up from 83 to 90, excluding those allocated to Pakistan-occupied Kashmir. In December, the Supreme Court directed the poll panel to hold assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir by September 30.

Cash, liquor, freebies worth ₹95cr seized in J&K during election period

Srinagar, May 27: Election authorities and other enforcement agencies seized around ₹95 crore worth of cash, liquor, and other freebies, meant to be used to influence the voters during the five-phase Lok Sabha elections in Jammu and Kashmir.

The election process in J&K ended Saturday with voting in the Anantnag-Rajouri constituency.

Despite the voter turnout having broken a 35-year-old record in Kashmir, some candidates had tried to use money, liquor, freebies etc to influence the voters. We seized material and cash with a total value of ₹94.797 crore from the date of commencement of the Lok Sabha elections in J&K," an Election Commission official said Sunday

Officials credited the J&K Police with playing the most important role in checking the use of money and freebies as it accounted for ₹90.83 crore seized during the campaign.

Cash, liquor, drugs and other freebies were seized by various enforcement departments. Major department-wise seizures included seizures by the police valued at ₹90.831 crore, the Income Tax depart-



ment at ₹42 lakh, the Excise department at ₹1.01 crore while the Narcotics Control Bureau seized drugs valued at ₹2.32 crore, officials said.

'In order to ensure a level playing field for all contestants. we took action against over 40 government employees who were allegedly violating the Model Code of Conduct. We received 143 grievances on the CVIGIL app out of which over 80 have been resolved while the remaining are under the process of resolution," the EC official said.

"To monitor various related activities and also check the Model Code of Conduct compliance, we had established a command and control room at the CEO office in Jammu as well as

rooms were also established in every DEO's (district election officer) office and were functioning round-the-clock. All electronic media channels and social media platforms were monitored here. Any violation so detected was reported and the concerned RO/ARO issued a notice," the official added.

"All techno-savvy facilities, including GPS monitoring, live surveillance, telecommunication, etc. were put into use to secure one of the most exhaustive and elaborate poll processes in J&K amid concerns about the disruption of this democratic process by antinational elements in the past,' the EC official said.

Some respite from heatwave likely in J&K after three days

Srinagar, May 27: Weather office said Monday that there would be some respite from the ongoing heatwave in J&K after three days while another spell of high temperatures is likely to affect the UT from June 3 onwards.

Srinagar recorded 32.7, Gulmarg 22.6 and Pahalgam 28.1 degrees Celsius as the maxi-

mum temperature Sunday. Jammu city witnessed scorching heat as the maximum temperature reached 42.5 degrees Celsius Sunday. 

Out of 21 Lok Sabha and 147 Assembly seats, six Lok Sabha and 42 Assembly seats are going to polls in the last phase

Both the ruling BJD and the main Opposition BJP, meanwhile, have claimed that they will form the next government in the state. Both the parties had even announced the oath-taking day of the formation of the government.

As the final phase draws closer. the BJD, BJP and the Congress have planned to hold a series of public meetings to woo the voters in support of their party candidates before the campaign ends May 30.

The Prime Minister will visit Odisha again May 29 on his fourth leg of electioneering in support of party candidates.

BJP sources here said Modi will address three public meetings during his day-long visit to the state Wednesday as Odisha goes to the fourth and final phase of polls. The PM had already visited Odisha thrice May 6, May 10 and May 20 and addressed as many as seven public meetings, besides two roadshows, one at Bhubaneswar and the other in

the pilgrim town of Puri. 



Bakhtiyarpur, May 27: Congress leader Rahul Gandhi Monday claimed that the INDIA bloc, if voted to power, would scrap the Agnipath scheme of recruitment in defence services and deposit Rs 8,500 in women's accounts every month.

Addressing back-to-back election rallies in favour of Mahagathbandhan nominees in Bakhtiyarpur (Patna Lok Sabha seat), Paliganj (Patliputra Lok Sabha seat) and Jagdishpur (Arrah) in Bihar, he asserted that Narendra Modi will not be able to become the prime minister again since there is a clear "storm" in favour of the INDIA bloc across the country.

"There is a clear storm (toofan) in favour of the INDIA bloc across the country, including in Bihar and Uttar Pradesh. Narendra Modi will not be the prime minister of India after June 4," he asserted.

'When the INDIA bloc forms the government, Agnipath scheme will be withdrawn," Gandhi said at the Bakhtiyarpur rally.

The scheme, announced by the Narendra Modi government in 2022, envisages recruiting



voung soldiers, called 'Agniveers' after appointment, on a contractual basis of four years and retiring 75 per cent of them without certain benefits enjoyed by those who were not employed under this programme.

'The INDIA bloc, if voted to power, will throw the Agnipath scheme into the dustbin. Modi ji has turned soldiers into labourers. The Centre has made two categories in the Army -- Agniveer and others. If an Agniveer gets injured or is martyred, he will neither get a martyr status nor compensation. Why is this discrimination?" Gandhi said.

'He (Modi) calls himself a true patriot but he insulted jawans by implementing the Agnipath scheme," Gandhi said.

From July, Rs 8,500 will be deposited in the accounts of women from BPL households every month... this will change their financial condition. Initially, we will give you Rs 1 lakh annually, later we may increase it

to Rs 2 lakh annually," he said. Taking a jibe at the prime minister's 'sent by God' comment, the Congress leader remarked, "After June 4, if ED asks Modi about corruption, he will say I don't know anything... I was told by God to do this. This is the reason he concocted this story... he says he is not biological but a messenger of God. Did God send him to serve billionaires?

Gandhi claimed that Modi has created 22 billionaires, while the INDIA bloc government would create crores of ʻlakhpatis'.

He accused PM Modi of waiving loans worth Rs 16 lakh crore of his "billionaire friends", and said the country will never forgive him for this.

Voting will take place in Sasaram, Nalanda, Patna Sahib, Pataliputra, Arrah, Buxar, Karakat and Jehanabad Lok Sabha constituencies in the last phase June 1.

6 killed, over 29k houses damaged

Kolkata, May 27: Nearly 29,500 houses in 24 blocks and 79 municipal wards, mostly in the south coastal areas of West Bengal, were partially or entirely damaged by Cyclone Remal, a state government official said Monday.

Additionally, over 2,140 trees were uprooted, and about 1,700 electric poles fell in various parts of the state, he added.

Initial assessments indicate that out of the damaged houses, 27,000 suffered partial damage, while 2.500 were completely destroyed. The official cautioned that these figures might change as evaluations are ongoing, with data collection and damage estimation still in progress.

"The figures will probably change as the evaluation process is still not complete. Data is being collected from the districts and the estimation of the damage is being calculated," the official told PTI.

The administration had shifted 2,07,060 people to 1,438 safe shelters, he said, adding currently there are 77,288 people.

"In all, 341 gruel kitchens being operated at the moment. We have distributed 17,738 tarpaulins to the affected people in the coastal and low-lying areas," he added. The affected areas included Kakdwip, Namkhana, Sagard Island. Diamond Harbour, Fraserganj, Bakkhali and Mandarmani. There were minor breaches of embankments due to the cyclone, he said, adding that those were repaired immediately.

"No major breach of embankment has been reported so far. All those reported were minor ones and were addressed immediately," he said.

Kejriwal seeks extension of interim bail from SC

The Delhi CM, in his plea filed May 26, said he will surrender back to jail June 9, instead of June 2, the scheduled date for his return to prison

New Delhi, May 27: Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has sought extension of his interim bail by seven days from the Supreme Court to undergo a host of medical tests, including a PET-CT scan in view of his "sudden and unexplained weight loss, coupled with high ketone levels", which are indicatives of kidney, serious cardiac ailments and even cancer.

Kejriwal, in his plea filed May 26, said he will surrender back to jail June 9, instead of June 2, the scheduled date for his return to prison.

"The appellant prays for an extension of his interim bail by a week, during which the Appellant can get the prescribed tests done and obtain results of the same. The Appellant will get all these tests done in the working week from June 3 (Monday) to June 7 (Friday) and then surrender on the weekend, i.e. June 9," the fresh plea, according to the sources, said.

The top court had May 10 granted 21-day interim bail to the chief minister, who was arrested in a money laundering case linked to the excise policy 'scam', to enable him to campaign for the Lok Sabha polls.

It had directed that Kejriwal



shall surrender June 2, a day after the last phase of the sevenphase poll gets over.

The fresh plea, which is likely to be taken up in the coming days by a vacation bench, said during the incarceration from March 21 to May 10, the chief minister suffered a lot of healthrelated complications which are also "partly attributable to the negligent and callous behaviour of the jail authorities"

Kejriwal lost around six to seven kg of weight in the jail and has not been able to regain even after his release and renewing his earlier lifestyle to the extent possible, it said.

"In the meantime, recent test reports confirm that the Appellant has also developed an unusually high blood glucose level as well as high ketone levels in urine, which indicate that in addition to increased blood sugar level, the appellant may have also developed kidney related complications and kidney damage," it said.

Referring to his recent health check up at his residence by a senior physician of a private hospital, the plea said the doctor took note of Kejriwal's health complications and increased risk indicators and prescribed a host of full body tests, which are necessary to be carried out before he surrenders.

Hospital fire: Safety lapses flagged

New Delhi: In the wake of the Vivek Vihar hospital fire tragedy, the Delhi government has directed all state-run and private health facilities to conduct a fire audit, even as several safety lanses have come to light at the five-bed neonatal centre with police also investigating why 27 oxygen cylinders were kept there. Five of the oxygen cylinders had exploded during the deadly blaze Saturday night in which six newborns were killed and five injured. Delhi Health Minister Saurabh Bharadwaj Monday said it had been learnt that oxygen refilling was being carried out at the hospital and stressed that it is illegal for a hospital to have a refilling system since it can lead to fire. A delegation of the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR), which visited the site Sunday and spoke to officials and family members of the victims, said in its findings that emergency exits were absent in the hospital building.

Mob attack on police station

Davanagere: Police have so far arrested at least 25 people in connection with a mob attack on Channagiri police station in Karnataka officials said Monday. A police station was vandalised in Channagiri town in Davangere district and several vehicles were damaged by a violent mob over an alleged custodial death, during the small hours of Saturday. At least 11 police personnel were injured in the incident. Police said they have arrested 25 people in connection with a mob attack on the police station, personnel and properties under sections 353 (Assault or criminal force to deter public servant from discharge of his duty) and 307 (Attempt to murder) of IPC, and the suspects have been remanded in judicial custody.

Chandigarh: The Haryana government has announced advancing summer vacations in state-run and private schools to Tuesday. According to an order issued by the Directorate of School Education Monday, all schools in the state will observe summer holidays between Tuesday and June 30. Earlier, it had ordered the closure of schools from June 1 to 30. However. in view of the prevailing severe heatwave conditions in the state, it has been decided to declare summer holidays from Tuesday, official sources said. During the past few days, most places in Harvana have witnessed blistering heat, with maximum temperatures hovering in the 44-46 degrees Celsius range.

Mercury over 48 degrees C in 17 places

New Delhi: Temperatures in 17 locations breached 48 degrees Celsius Monday, with the relentless heat affecting health and livelihoods across large parts of northwestern and central India. However, some relief from the scorching heat is expected after three days due to a western disturbance and moisture incursion from the Arabian Sea, India Meteorological Department (IMD) chief Mrutyunjay Mohapatra said. The national capital stayed under the grip of searing heat as maximum temperatures in parts of the city crossed 48 degrees Celsius. The city was on red alert Monday and will remain so for the next three days, the weather office said. The IMD has predicted a higher number of heatwave days in northwest India and adjoining parts of the central region in June. "Normally, northwest India and the adjoining areas record two to three heatwave days in June. This time, we expect four to six days of heatwave in this region," Mohapatra said at a press conference. Except for a few parts of southern peninsular India, normal to above-normal maximum temperatures are expected across the country in June, he added. People endured the deadly heat Monday, with temperatures crossing 48 degrees Celsius in 17 places. At 49.4 degrees Celsius, Rajasthan's Phalodi was the warmest place in the country. At least eight more locations in the desert state recorded temperatures above 48 degrees Celsius.

In this regard, it may be noted that FSSAI has not permitted the processing and/or selling of human milk under FSS Act 2006 and rules/regulations made there under," the regulator said in the advisory May 24.

NEW DELHI: In a major crackdown on

SMS scammers, the government has

blacklisted eight 'principal entities' behind SMS headers that were used for sending over 10,000 fraudulent messages over the past three months. according to an official release. The Department of Telecom (DoT), in collaboration with the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), has taken decisive action to protect citizens from potential SMS fraud through the Sanchar Saathi initiative, it said, Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C) under MHA provided information about the misuse of eight SMS headers for sending fraudulent communications for committing cybercrime. It was noted that more than 10,000 fraudulent messages were sent using these eight headers in the past three months. The eight principal entities which were the owners of these eight SMS headers have been blacklisted. "All the 8 PEs along with the 73 SMS Headers and 1522 SMS content templates owned by them have been blacklisted. None of these Principal Entities. SMS Headers or templates can now be used to send SMS by any telecom operator. The DoT has prevented further potential victimization of citizens by blacklisting these entities," it said.

She was found guilty for parts of the speech concerning how the government then led by Prime Minister Prayuth Chan-ocha had amended laws to give King Vajiralongkorn more power to control the palace wealth, which is managed by the Crown Property Bureau.

Brussels, May 27: Relations between the European Union and Israel took a nosedive on the eve of the diplomatic recognition of a Palestinian state by EU members Ireland and Spain, with Madrid suggesting sanctions should be considered against Israel for its continued attacks in the southern Gaza city of Rafah.

Israeli Foreign Minister Israel Katz told Spain that its consulate in Jerusalem will not be allowed to help Palestinians.

At the same time, the EU's foreign policy chief Josep Borrell, a Spaniard, threw his full weight to support the International Criminal Court, whose prosecutor is seeking an arrest warrant against Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and others. including the leaders of Hamas.

The prosecutor of the court has been strongly intimidated and accused of antisemitism - as always when anybody, anyone does something that Netanyahu's government does not like." Borrell said. "The word antisemitic, it's too heavy. It's too important."

Angry words abounded Monday, with Katz accusing Spain of "rewarding terror" by recognising a Palestinian state. and saying that "the days of the Inquisition are over". He referred to the infamous Spanish institution started in the 15th century to maintain Roman Catholic orthodoxy that forced Jews and Muslims to flee, convert to Catholicism or, in some instances, face death.

Melbourne, May 27: The Papua New Guinea government said a landslide Friday buried more than 2,000 people and has formally asked for international help.

In a letter seen by The Associated Press to the United Nations res ident coordinator dated Sunday, the acting director of the South Pacific island nation's National Disaster Center

said the landslide "buried more than 2000 people alive" and caused "major destruction".

Estimates of the casualties have varied widely since the disaster occurred, and it was not immediately clear how officials arrived the number of people affected

Australia prepared Monday to send aircraft and other equipment to help at the site of a deadly landslide in Papua New Guinea as overnight rains in the South Pacific nation's mountainous interior raised fears that the tons of rubble that buried hundreds of villagers could become dangerously unstable.

Australian Defence Minister Richard Marles said his officials have been talking with their Papua New Guinea counterparts since Friday, when a mountainside collapsed on Yambali village in Enga province, which the United Nations estimates killed 670 people. The remains of only six people had been recovered so far.

LIC net profit rises to ₹13,763cr

New Delhi: Insurance behemoth LIC Monday posted a marginal 2 per cent increase in net profit at ₹13,763 crore in the fourth quarter ended March 2024. The insurer had earned a profit of ₹13,428 crore in the corresponding quarter a year earlier. The total income of the insurer during the reporting quarter rose to ₹2,50,923 crore from ₹2,00,185 crore in the same period of the previous fiscal, LIC said in a regulatory filing. LIC's income from first-year premium also improved to ₹13,810 crore in the latest January-March quarter against ₹12,811 crore in the same period of preceding fiscal. The income from renewal premiums in the reporting period rose to ₹77,368 crore compared to ₹76,009 crore a year ago. During the entire financial year ended March 2024, the insurer earned a profit of ₹40,676 crore as compared to ₹36,397 crore in the previous fiscal.

Nalco profit up 2-fold to ₹996.7cr

New Delhi: State-owned Nalco Monday reported two-fold rise in consolidated profit to ₹996.74 crore for the March guarter on the back of lower expenses. The company had posted a consolidated profit of ₹495 crore in the March quarter of FY23, National Aluminium Company Ltd (Nalco) said in a filing to the BSE. However, the consolidated total income during the quarter dropped to ₹3,663.09 crore from ₹3,726.76 crore in the year-ago period. The expenses of the company in the fourth quarter of FY24 dropped to ₹2,720.42 crore from ₹3,160.50 crore a year earlier. Nalco is a Navratna PSU under the ministry of mines. It is one of the largest integrated bauxite-aluminaaluminium-power complex in the country. The company has formed a JV company -- Angul Aluminium Park Pvt Ltd' (AAPPL) -- with Odisha Industrial Infrastructure **Development Corporation** (IDCO) to give a boost to ancillary, upstream and downstream products related to the aluminium industry.

Sumitomo Chemical profit jumps 52%

New Delhi: Sumitomo Chemical India Ltd Monday reported a 52 per cent increase in its consolidate net profit to ₹109.89 crore in the quarter ended March. Its net profit stood at ₹72.12 crore in the year-ago period. Total income rose to ₹700.90 crore in the fourth quarter of the last fiscal from ₹668.05 crore in the corresponding period of the preceding year, according to a regulatory filing. During 2023-24 fiscal, the company's net profit fell to ₹369.74 crore from ₹502.20 crore in the preceding year.

However, the margin of victory may be smaller than earlier expected, analysts and informal betting markets are speculating.

Here are the main themes and comments from over 10 fund managers Reuters spoke to on their expectations based on different scenarios.

HOW WILL MARKETS REACT? Indian equities outperformed most major markets in 2023 and are trading at expensive valuations. Yet, they could see a short term boost if the Modi administration comes back to power in a rare third consecutive term for any Indian government, fund managers said, as it would suggest policy continuity and political stability

The benchmark BSE Sensex is up 4% so far this year, with a Reuters poll of equity analysts indicating the index could double the gains by the end of the

Foreign investors poured in a net \$20.74 billion into Indian equities last year, the most in emerging markets in Asia, but have pulled back this year ahead of the election.

A lower margin of victory for Modi could lead to short-term volatility, fund managers said, while a win for the opposition could lead to a sharper correction due to policy uncertainty.

'The market is looking at continuity, so a coalition government or another party winning is not the expectation," said Mittul Kalawadia, senior equity fund manager at Mumbai-based ICICI Prudential Mutual Fund.

"There can be a knee-jerk reaction if the last scenario builds up," Kalawadia said.

will likely attract foreign investment inflows, said Vivek Bhutoria, co-portfolio manager at Federated Hermes' global emerging markets equity fund, based in London. TAX STABILITY

The election campaign has seen India's largest opposition party, the Congress, hint at policies aimed at addressing income inequalities in India but investors remain wary of such moves.

"We would like the BJP to stay away (from) over-reliance on welfare schemes," said Gary Tan, portfolio manager at Allspring Global investments in Singapore.

Overdependence on such schemes can stress public finances and disrupt India's macro stability narrative, Tan said.

Local media reports have also suggested the government may consider changes in capital gains tax, which the current administration has denied.

Nilesh Shah, chief executive officer of Kotak Mahindra Asset Management, does not expect the government to go down that route and instead introduce policies to deepen capital markets.

SECTORS IN FOCUS

With the current government focused on spending on infrastructure and pushing manufacturing, fund managers are leaning towards sectors that benefit from these policies.

Power, autos and infrastructure are some of the sectors that investors are positive on.

"We are constructive on beneficiaries from India's focus on manufacturing such as capital goods firms, automotives and metals," said Sanjay Bembalkar, co-head of equities at Mumbaibased Union Asset Management

Goldman Sachs ups India's growth forecast

New Delhi, May 27: Leading global financial firm Goldman Sachs has revised its forecast for India's GDP growth by 10 basis points to 6.7 per cent as it expects the government's heavy investments in big-ticket infrastructure projects to continue with the huge dividend coming in from the RBI.

"Going forward, we expect investment growth momentum to sustain with extra fiscal space for infrastructure spending given a higher than expected dividend transfer by the RBI. As a result, we recently revised our growth forecasts for 2024 slightly higher by 10 bps to 6.7 per cent," Andrew Tilton, head of emerging markets economic research at Goldman Sachs said in a note

"In India, growth momentum remains strong, and while we think core inflation will bottom out in April-June, we expect it to be around 4.0 - 4.5 per cent in July-December," the financial company said.

Sustained fiscal deficit reduction positive for India's ratings: Fitch

Mumbai, May 27: A sustained reduction in fiscal deficit, particularly if underpinned by durable revenue-raising reforms, would be a positive for India's sovereign rating fundamentals over the medium term, Fitch Ratings said in a note Monday.

The Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) larger-than-expected surplus transfer to the government should help ensure that the deficit target of 5.1% of GDP for the current fiscal year will be met and could be used to lower the deficit further, Fitch said.

Last week, the board of India's central bank approved a record surplus transfer of 2.11 trillion rupees (\$25.40 billion) to the government for fiscal 2024, sharply above analysts' and government projections.

In its post-election budget, the government could either opt to keep the current deficit target for FY25 or opt to offset upside spending surprises or lower-than-budgeted revenue, for example from divestment, Fitch said.

In the first scenario, the windfall could also allow the authorities to further boost spending on infrastructure, the note

"Alternatively, all or part of the windfall could be saved, pushing the deficit to below 5.1% of GDP. The government's choice could give greater clarity around its medium-term fiscal priorities," the note added. Transfers from the RBI to the

government can be significant at the margin for fiscal performance, but depend on various factors, including the size and performance of assets held on the central bank's balance sheet and the exchange rate, Fitch wrote.

'The potential volatility of transfers means there is significant uncertainty about their medium-term path, and we do not anticipate that dividends as a share of GDP will be sustained at such a high level,"

Bangalore, May 27: India will buy back 400 billion rupees (\$4.81 billion) worth of government bonds, the country's central bank said Monday.

The securities offered for buyack are four government bonds with maturity dates in the second half of 2024, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) said in a statement.

The announcement comes a week after the RBI, acting on behalf of the government, accepted bids to buy back only 52.7 billion rupees-worth bonds.

This was the government's third straight attempt with little success to infuse liquidity into the financial markets through a bond buyback. The government had also said earlier this month it will reduce the supply of Treasury bills by about 600 billion rupees until the end of June.



Spending by India's federal government is likely to remain slower for a few more months, which may prompt more steps to infuse cash into the banking system, Reuters reported last week.

The auction will be conducted May 30 and its results will be announced on the same day, while the settlement will occur

The 50issue barometer rose by 153.7 points or 0.66 per cent to hit a new lifetime high of 23,110.80 during the day. However, it tanked around 240 points at the fag-end due to selling in oil, energy and FMCG shares

Index heavyweight Reliance Industries declined nearly 1 per cent, dragging the benchmark indices into the negative. Selling in FMCG giant ITC also eroded

Equity benchmarks were on a record-breaking rally for the third straight day ahead of the results of Lok Sabha polls and a rally in global markers. The results of the ongoing general elections will be declared June 4.

Sensex breached the historic 75,000-mark for the first time April 9. It took 31 trading sessions for the benchmark to climb 1,000 points to reach the 76,000-mark Monday. The BSE benchmark took 21 trading sessions to reach 75.000-mark April 9 after hitting the 74.000-level March 6.

From the Sensex pack, Wipro, NTPC. Sun Pharma. Mahindra & Mahindra, ITC and Reliance Industries were among the biggest laggards.

IndusInd Bank, Axis Bank, Bajaj Finance, HDFC Bank, Larsen & Toubro and State Bank of India were among the major gainers

"The bulls are facing stiff resistance at 23,000 levels as investors start booking profit at higher levels to avoid any kneejerk reaction in the market ahead of the election result. Better earnings growth, the expectation of a revival in private capex, and a moderation in FIIs selling intensity are the key positive triggers in the market," Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit

Financial Services, said. "Nifty ended almost flat in a volatile session after hitting record highs in the early part of the session," said Deepak Jasani, Head of Retail Research, **HDFC Securities**

Ajit Mishra - SVP, Research, Religare Broking Ltd said that the tone was positive in the first half, but profit-taking in heavyweights in the second half erased all the gains.

In the broader market, the BSE midcap gauge climbed 0.63 per cent while smallcap index dipped 0.09 per cent.

NSE reduces tick size for select stocks to boost liquidity

New Delhi, May 27: The National Stock Exchange (NSE) has decided to introduce one paisa tick size for all stocks priced below ₹250 from June 10, in a bid to enhance liquidity and improve price discovery by allowing for more precise price adjustments.

Presently, the tick size for these stocks is five paise, which will be reduced to one paisa.

"All securities (excluding ex-

change-traded funds) available in EQ, BE, BZ, BO, RL and AF series with security price below ₹250 will have a tick size of ₹0.01 as against the current tick size ₹0.05. The tick size determined for securities in T+1 settlement will also be applicable for T+0 settlement (series T0)," NSE said in

Tick size is the minimum price increment between consecutive bid (buy) and offer (sell) prices. A smaller tick size allows for finer price adjustments



and potentially more precise price discovery. For instance, if

a stock has a tick size of ₹0.10 and the last traded price (LTP) was ₹50, the next possible bid prices would be ₹49.90, ₹49.80, ₹49.70 and so on.

In this case, bid prices like ₹49.85 or ₹49.92 are not allowed, as they don't meet the ₹0.10 tick

size requirement. The exchange said that tick sizes will be subject to review and adjustments every month, based on the closing price of the last

trading day of the month. In addition to changes in the Capital Market (CM) segment, the NSE has announced revisions in the Futures & Options (F&O) segment.

The exchange said that the stock futures will have the same tick size as applicable for securities in the cash market segment from July 8. Further, revisions in tick size will be applicable for all expiries -- Near-Month, Middle Month and Far-

Last year, rival bourse BSE lowered the tick size for scripstrading below ₹100 to 1 paisa from 5 paise.

KKR defeated Sunrisers Hyderabad by eight wickets in a completely one-sided final to win their third IPL title.



Apart from these four, the American duo of Fabiano Caruana and Hikaru Nakamura will complete the six-player line up. Caruana and Hikaru are pitted against each other in the first round.

Xavi wins his last game as Barcelona coach

Madrid, May 27: Xavi Hernández ended his stint as Barcelona coach with a 2-1 win at Sevilla in the final round of the Spanish league.

Robert Lewandowski and Fermin López scored for Barcelona, which announced Friday it was parting ways with the former midfielder with a year left on his contract.

"We didn't want this to end, but these are decisions made by the club," Xavi said. "We didn't win titles but we were on the right track. But soccer is like this, the

directors will make their decisions. The response by the players was wonderful.'

"We will always wish Xavi the best," goalkeeper Marc-André ter Stegen said. "He's been a friend for many years and it's not easy to let him go ... He deserves the best."

Barcelona had already clinched second place and a spot in the lucrative Spanish Super Cup in Saudi Arabia next season. It finished with four consecutive victories.

Youssef En-Nesyri scored for Sevilla, which ended 14th place after four straight losses

En-Nesyri's goal came in the 31st minute, after Lewandowski had put Barcelona ahead in the 15th. López netted the winner for the Catalan club in the 59th.

Xavi's departure came a month



after he had walked back a previous decision he made in January to leave the club this summer. In April, he said that he had changed his mind because the team was playing better and he believed it could bounce back from a trophy-less season. Barcelona president Joan

Laporta had publicly celebrated Xavi's commitment to stay at that time. But last week the president was reportedly unhappy when the head coach spoke openly about how the club's poor finances would impede it from competing with fierce rival Real

"Those who made the decision need to explain it," said the 44-year-old Xavi, who plans to take a break from coaching.

There was little to be decided in the league's final round Sunday. Champion Madrid, focused on the upcoming Champions League final against Borussia Dortmund at Wembley, drew 0-0 with Real Betis Saturday.
