Patnaik, spanning over 24 years in Odisha politics, has come to an end. It was not a happy ending for the 77-year-old politician who took the mantle and entered politics in 1997 after the demise of his father, the legendary leader Biju Patnaik.

He lost the Kantabanji Assembly seat by a margin of over 16,000 votes to Laxman Bag of the BJP and scrapped through his traditional Hinjili Assembly seat by a paltry margin of 4,636 votes. In the 2019 election. he won the Hinjili seat with a margin of 60,160 votes, while in 2014, he registered a winning margin of 76,586 votes.

Naveen had won five times and was expected to take on the mantle for the sixth time to create a history in Indian politics of becoming the longest serving CM to break the record of Pawan Kumar Chamling, who has served five consecutive terms as the CM of Sikkim, completing a total period of more than 24 years of tenure-the highest so far.

New Delhi, June 5: Preparing to take oath for a third straight term as the head of a coalition government, Prime Minister Narendra Modi Wednesday chaired a meeting of the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA) members who unanimously elected him as its leader. NDA MPs will meet June 7 to formally elect Modi as their leader and the alliance leaders will then

(Secular) leader and former Bihar CM Jitan Ram Manjhi said after attending the meeting.

The NDA has won 293 seats in the elections, comfortably above the majority mark of 272 in the 543-member House, paving the way for Modi to take the oath for a third consecutive term, a first for any ruling alliance since 1962. However, it will be a different act for him this time as the BJP has fallen well short of the majority and depends on allies for the government-formation after enjoying a comfortable majority on its own in the previous two terms of his government. Earlier, senior JD(U) leader KC Tyagi said, "Our support is

unconditional. But the unemployment in Bihar will not end till Bihar gets special status. So, go to the President to submit keeping in mind the support their letters of support, HAM NDA has received from Bihar, we

hope there will be an initiative to give Bihar special status."

Similarly, TDP sources suggested that the party may ask for plum ministries at the Centre. A preferential status for Andhra Pradesh is another key issue that may come up in the negotiations. In fact, it was a dispute over a special status demand that had prompted N Chandrababu Naidu to part ways with the BJP in 2016.

Modi said at the meeting that it was a historic mandate for the NDA's third consecutive government which, he noted, was last received in the country over 60 years back. His allies lauded Modi for his clear vision for "Viksit Bharat" and asserted that they are partners in this goal.

The new government may be sworn in by the weekend.

Addressing the media after the nearly two-hour meeting which was seen as the alliance keeping its options open and not staking claim at government formation for now, he said the opposition leaders resolved to continue their fight against the 'fascist rule' of the BJP led by Narendra Modi even as they thanked the people for their overwhelming support to the INDIA bloc.

We will take appropriate steps at the appropriate time to realise people's desire not to be ruled by the BJP's government,² Kharge said while reading out a statement adopted by all the alliance constituents after the deliberations at his residence.

He said the decision has been taken by all constituents of the INDIA bloc in one voice. The Congress president had convened the meeting to discuss the political situation and the election results, explore any possibility of government formation and whether to reach out to their old partners Nitish and Naidu.

that 'the change of government is a process, and using this as a pretext to deprive people of healthcare is a social and constitutional offense'.

Nifty, Sensex bounce back 3%

Mumbai, June 5: Rebounding from their worst single-day slide in four years, benchmark stock indices Sensex and Nifty soared over 3 per cent each on heavy value buying by investors after NDA alliance partners started talks on government formation.

The 30-share BSE Sensex jumped 2,303.19 points or 3.20 per cent to settle at 74,382.24 on value buying in banking, auto and oil shares. All Sensex shares closed in the green. During the day, it zoomed 2,455.77 points or 3.40 per cent to 74,534.82.

The NSE Nifty climbed 735.85 points or 3.36 per cent to 22,620.35 with all its constituents ending with gains. During the day, the benchmark soared 785.9 points

or 3.59 per cent to 22,670.40.

Heavy buying in HDFC Bank, ICICI Bank and Reliance Industries helped benchmark indices log sharp gains. Investors became richer by ₹13.22 lakh crore Wednesday with markets making a strong comeback.

King Charles currency makes maiden entry

THE FOUR BANKNOTES WITH THE KING'S PORTRAIT ON THE FRONT CARRY VALUES OF 5, 10, 20 AND 50 POUNDS

London, June 5: British banknotes bearing the image of King Charles III entered circulation for the first time Wednesday, nearly two years after he succeeded his mother Queen Elizabeth II. The four banknotes with the king's portrait on the front carry values of £5 (\$6.4), £10, £20 and £50 and will be used alongside those bearing the image of Elizabeth, who died in September 2022. It is worth noting that coins

bearing Charles's head entered circulation in the United Kingdom in December 2022 The updates come as Britons



'We know that cash is important for many people, and we are committed to providing banknotes for as long as the public demand them," he added.

The Bank of England has asked people to return old banknotes that featured the portrait of Queen Elizabeth as new banknotes featuring the portrait of the King Charles III will now be in circulation in the UK. With this, King Charles III is now the second British monarch to be on Bank of England notes. The new notes are only different in terms of the image of King Charles III but other details remain the same. Based on a photograph owned by the royal household and made available in 2013, Charles in late 2022 approved the final designs of the notes featuring his engraved portrait.

The new currency note - made from polymer that has already been used to replace paper money in the UK since 2016 – will gradually replace the older notes.

Reports claimed that old banknotes can be exchanged. In order to do this, people have to exchange their old notes from of £300 for the new ones, the reports added.


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

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

legislators. "The party has decided to form a committee which will submit its report to the president," he said. "All have to wait for the report of the committee on the cause of the defeat," he added.

Earlier in the day, Patnaik

tendered his resignation to Governor Raghubar Das, following the defeat of his party in the Assembly polls.

BJP stormed to power in Odisha by securing 78 of the 147 assembly seats, while the BJD managed to win 51 seats. Congress bagged 14 constituencies and CPI (M) secured one, while three Independent candidates also emerged victorious. The results were announced on Tuesday.

Patnaik's resignation marks the end of an era in Odisha's politics. He took oath as the chief minister of Odisha for the first time March 5, 2000, and, was re-elected four times since then

Meanwhile, BJD MLA Arun Sahoo, who met Patnaik in the morning, said, "Naveen Patnaik has a big heart. He has asked us to serve the people of the state. We are grateful to him.'

Sunstroke death toll mounts to 36

Bhubaneswar, June 5: The number of sunstroke-related deaths rose to 36 in the state this summer, with two more confirmed cases, an official statement said Wednesdav.

A total of 151 cases of sunstroke-related deaths were reported till Wednesday, of which 36 have been confirmed due to heat-related illness, while 31 cases were not due to sunstroke.

The remaining 84 cases are pending inquiry, the statement issued by the state's Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) said.

Two suspected sunstroke deaths were reported during the last 24 hours, it added.

The government has asked districts to ensure post-mortem examination of every suspected sunstroke death for sanction of ex-gratia.

Also, a joint inquiry by the local Revenue officer and a local medical officer needs to be conducted to ascertain the exact cause of each death, officials said.

he world experienced the warmest May ever, with record heat, rain and floods wreaking havoc in many countries, according to new data released Wednesday.

It was also the 12 consecutive month of record-high temperatures, a result of the combined effect of now weakening El Nino and human-caused climate change, the European Union's climate agency Copernicus Climate Change Service (C3S)

said The update from Copernicus coincided with the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) prediction that there is an 80 per cent chance that one of the next five years will be at least 1.5 degrees Celsius warmer than it was at the start of the in-

dustrial age. It also said there is an 86 per cent chance that at least one of these years will set a new temperature record, beating 2023 which is currently the warmest

vear. The global average temperature for May 2024 was 1.52 degrees Celsius above the 1850-1900 preindustrial average, marking the 11th consecutive month (since July 2023) at or above 1.5 degrees Celsius, Copernicus said.

A permanent breach of the 1.5 degrees Celsius limit specified in the Paris Agreement, however, refers to long-term warming over many years.

The European climate agency said the global average temperature for the last 12 months (June 2023-May 2024) is the highest on record, at 0.75 degree Celsius above the 1991-2020 average and 1.63 degrees Celsius above the 1850–1900 pre-industrial average.

Carlo Buontempo, C3S Director, said: "It is shocking but not surprising that we have reached this 12-month streak. While this sequence of recordbreaking months will eventually be interrupted, the overall signature of climate change remains and there is no sign in sight of a change in such a

trend." "We are living in unprecedented times, but we also have unprecedented skill in monitoring the climate and this can help inform our actions. This string of hottest months will be



remembered as comparatively cold but if we manage to stabilise the concentrations of GHGs in the atmosphere in the very near future we might be able to return to these 'cold' temperatures by the end of the century," he said.

According to climate scientists, countries need to limit the global average temperature rise to 1.5 degrees Celsius above the pre-industrial period to avoid the worst impacts of climate

Globally, 2023 was the warmest year in the 174-year observational record, with the global average temperature at 1.45 degrees Celsius above the pre-industrial baseline (1850-1900).

The warming may set a new record in 2024 as scientists say El Nino -- periodic warming of the ocean surface in the central and eastern tropical Pacific Ocean -- typically has the greatest impact on global climate in the second year of its development.

The world is witnessing weather extremes under a combined effect of the 2023-24 El Nino and human-caused climate change

Amid a brutal heat wave, India recorded nearly 25,000 suspected heat stroke cases and 56 deaths due to heat-related illnesses from March to May, PTI reported last week, citing data from the health ministry.

However, the data does not include deaths from Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, and Delhi, and the final numbers are expected to be higher, a source said.

Global weather agencies, including the India Meteorological Department, are expecting La Nina conditions by August-September.

While El Nino conditions are associated with weaker monsoon winds and drier conditions in India. La Nina conditions -- the antithesis of El Nino -- lead to plentiful rainfall during the monsoon season.

Groundwater to get over 3°C warmer by century's end

roundwater is projected to warm by 2 to 3.5 degrees J Celsius before the turn of this century, potentially risking water quality and safety, apart from threatening ecosystems depending on the resource, a new research has found.

The 'world's first global groundwater temperature model' predicted the highest warming rates in Central Russia, Northern China and parts of North America, and the Amazon rainforest in South America.

A team of researchers, led by those from the Karlsruhe Institute of Technology, Germany, said while a lot of focus on climate change concerns weather events and water availability. we also need to think about how it impacts groundwater, critical to life on the planet.



adversely impact ecosystems relying on them, they said. Rivers rely on groundwater

to keep flowing during dry times. Warm waters hold less dissolved oxygen," explained study co-author Gabriel Rau from the University of Newcastle, UK. The model also estimated that

by 2100, 60-600 million people globally could be living in areas where groundwater exceeds the highest threshold for drinking water temperature guidelines set by any country.

According to the World Health Organisation(WHO), currently only 18 out of 125 countries have temperature guidelines for drinking water. Warmer groundwater raises the risk of diseasecausing microbial growth, thereby, affecting drinking water quality and potentially the lives of people, said Rau.





"This is especially concerning in areas where access to clean drinking water is already limited, and in areas where groundwater is consumed without treatment." he added.

Based on how heat spreads in water, the researchers modelled current groundwater temperatures and also projected changes

between 2000-2100 around the world. Groundwater is present beneath the Earth's surface in pore spaces in rocks and soils.

'We show that groundwater at the depth of the water table (excluding permafrost regions) is conservatively projected to warm on average by 2.1 degrees Celsius between 2000 and 2100 under a

The warming of groundwater can be a cause for concern, although it depends on whether the climate change issue can be mitigated by cutting down greenhouse gas emissions, the researchers said.

Warmer groundwater can also impact water quality by affecting its chemistry and microbiology, they said.

'If temperatures increase, we may see significant impacts to our local aquatic animals, including their spawning processes which will impact industries and communities that are reliant on these ecosystems," said co-author Dylan Irvine, Charles Darwin University, Australia.



Rourkela, June 5: The poll results have brought cheers for all the political parties in Sundargarh district as all of them, including BJD. BJP and those in the INDIA bloc, took something back home and had reasons to be happy.

The Sundargarh Parliamentary seat remained in the saffron kitty as BJP's sitting Member of Parliament (MP) Jual Oram defeated his nearest rival, former Indian Hockey Team captain and president of Hockey India, BJD's Dilip Tirkey.

In the beginning, it was expected to be an even fight with Dilip having some edge, but Jual, the old war horse of BJP, secured the seat quite comfortably. Jual was leading by a margin of over 50,000 votes with a few rounds remaining

In Biramitrapur, where the battle was evenly poised for some time as initial counting suggested, the lead needle kept on changing sides. Finally, Rohit Joseph Tirkey of BJD defeated his nearest rival BJP's sitting MLA Shankar Oram.

The battle for Raghunathpalli was evenly balanced between BJD and BJP. Archana Rekha Behera, wife of sitting BJD MLA Subrat Tarai, lost to BJP's Durga Tanty by a margin of 5,774.

In the fight for Talsara Assembly constituency, Bhimsen Bhoi, the sitting BJP MLA retained his seat by defeating Binaya Toppo of BJD by a margin of

15.673 votes. Talsara has remained a classic case for psephologists because despite a good presence of tribal Christians, the seat has always elected a Hindu candidate.

The INDIA bloc parties won two Assembly seats. Congress candidate Rajan Ekka defeated his nearest rival from BJP Narasingha Minz as BJD was in the third place.

Another INDIA bloc candidate Laxman Munda of CPM won consecutively for the third time from Bonai. He defeated his nearest rival Bhimsen Choudhury, a former MLA of BJD. At the end of 22nd round, Munda was leading by over 25000 votes

In Sundargarh, Yogesh Singh defeated his nearest rival Kusum Tete of BJP in a close fight. Kusum was a surprise winner last time and this time she fought valiantly. However, she was trailing by over 8,000 votes with two more rounds remaining.

The most keenly watched and contested Rourkela Assembly constituency has been retained by former minister and sitting MLA Sarada Nayak. He defeated BJP heavyweight and former central minister Dilip Ray. This was a closely contested fight for both as it became evident during the counting of votes.

At one point, luck was in favour of BJP, but soon it sided with BJD. Sarada got the edge during the last three rounds of counting. Finally, Sarada defeated Ray by a margin of 3,552 votes.

The AI Hype

ccording to tech leaders and many pundits and academics, artificial intelligence is poised to transform the world as we know it through unprecedented productivity gains. While some believe that machines soon will do everything humans can do, ushering in a new age of boundless prosperity, other predictions are at least more grounded. For example, Goldman Sachs predicts that generative AI will boost global GDP by 7% over the next decade, and the McKinsey Global Institute anticipates that the annual GDP growth rate could increase by 3-4 percentage points between now and 2040. For its part, The Economist expects that AI will create a blue-collar bonanza.

Is this realistic? As I note in a recent paper, the outlook is far more uncertain than most forecasts and guesstimates suggest. Still, while it is basically impossible to predict with any confidence what AI will do in 20 or 30 years, one can say something about the next decade, because most of these near-term economic effects must involve existing technologies and improvements to them.

It is reasonable to suppose that AI's biggest impact will come from automating some tasks and making some workers in some occupations more productive. Economic theory provides some guidance

for assessing these aggregate effects. According to Hulten's theorem (named for economist Charles Hulten), aggregate "total factor productivity" (TFP) effects are simply the product of the share of tasks that are automated multiplied by the average cost savings.

While average cost savings are difficult to estimate and will vary by activity, there have already been some careful studies of AI's effects on certain tasks. For example, Shakked Noy and Whitney Zhang have examined the impact of ChatGPT on simple writing tasks (such as summarizing documents or writing routine grant proposals or marketing material), while Erik Brynjolfsson, Danielle Li, and Lindsey Raymond have assessed the use of AI as sistants in customer service. Taken together, this research suggests that currently available generative-AI tools yield average labor-cost savings of 27% and overall cost savings of 14.4%

What about the share of tasks that will be affected by AI and related technologies? Using numbers from recent studies, I estimate this to be around 4.6%, implying that AI will increase TFP by only 0.66% over ten vears, or by 0.06% annually. Of course, since AI will also drive an investment boom, the increase in GDP growth could be a little larger, perhaps in the 1-1.5% range. These figures are much smaller than the

ones from Goldman Sachs and McKinsey. If you want to get those bigger numbers, you either must boost the productivity gains at the micro level or assume that many more tasks in the economy will be affected. But neither scenario seems plausible. Labor-cost savings far above 27% not only fall out of the range offered by existing studies; they also do not align with the observed effects of other, even more promising technologies. For example, industrial robots have transformed some manufacturing sectors, and they appear to have reduced labor costs by about 30%

Similarly, we are unlikely to see far more than 4.6% of tasks being taken over, because AI is nowhere close to being able to perform most manual or social tasks (including seemingly simple functions with some social aspects, like accounting). As of 2019, a survey of essentially all US businesses found that only about 1.5% of them had any AI investments. Even if such investments have picked up over the past year and a half, we have a long, long way to go before AI becomes widespread.

Of course, AI could have larger effects than my analysis allows if it revolutionizes the process of scientific discovery or creates many new tasks and products. The recent AI-enabled discoveries of new crystal structures and advances in protein folding do suggest such possibilities. But these breakthroughs are unlikely to be a major source of economic growth within ten years. Even if new discoveries could be tested and turned into actual products much faster, the tech industry is currently focused excessively on automation and monetizing data, rather than on introducing new production tasks for workers. Moreover, my own estimates could be too high. Early adoption of generative AI has naturally occurred where it performs reasonably well, meaning tasks for which there are objective measures of success, such as writing simple programming subroutines or verifying information. Here, the model can learn on the basis of outside information and readily available historical data.

The Government of India took prompt notice of the report and made the necessary amendments to the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996, which have vet to be notified in order to become operational. With the amendments to the Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 in 2019 and 2022, the government ushered in a new era in India's arbitration system, which was previously limited to courts and individual choices. Historically, disputes within families and communities have been resolved by elders. In feudal societies, only a few cases were resolved by monarchs or other formal dispute resolution systems. Formal judicial systems, or today's courts, evolved alongside the development of democracies and other widely accepted forms of government. India is not exempt from this rule. As the rights-based approach to justice delivery gains

Despite much talk about institutionalising arbitration through seminars, workshops, and arbitration weeks, as well as comments from none other than India's Vice-President that it was becoming an "old boys club," the speed with which the Act was amended is not evident in its implementation. Four years after the law was passed, the promised Arbitration Council of India. which would authorise and regulate arbitration institutions, has yet to be fully operational. Except for a small number of arbitration institutions founded and funded by well-known law firms, state governments do not provide support for other professionally established arbitration institutions. Thus, there is an urgent need for the Centre and all High Courts in the country to take note of the arbitration institutions operating in each state and designate them in order to alleviate the much-discussed burden on courts and make India a hub for ADR.

But many of the 4.6% of tasks that could feasibly be automated within ten years – evaluating applications, diagnosing health problems, providing financial advice - do not have such clearly defined objective measures of success, and often involve complex context-dependent variables (what is good for one patient will not be right for another). In these cases, learning from outside observation is much harder, and generative AI models must rely instead on the behavior of existing workers.

Under these circumstances, there will be less room for major improvements over human labor. Thus, I estimate that about one-quarter of the 4.6% tasks are of the "harder-to-learn" category and will have lower productivity gains. Once this adjustment is made, the 0.66% TFP growth figure declines to about 0.53%.

What about the effects on workers, wages, and inequality? The good news is that, compared to earlier waves of automation – such as those based on robots or software systems - the effects of AI may be more broadly distributed across demographic groups. If so, it will not have as extensive an impact on inequality as earlier automation technologies did (I estimated these effects in my previous work with Pascual Restrepo). However, I find no evidence that AI will reduce inequality or boost wage growth. Some groups - especially white, native-born women - are significantly more exposed and will be negatively affected, and capital will gain more than labor overall.

Economic theory and the available data justify a more modest, realistic outlook for AI. There is little to support the argument that we should not worry about regulation, because AI will be the proverbial rising tide that lifts all boats. AI is what economists call a general-purpose technology. We can do many things with it, and there are certainly better things to do than automate work and boost the profitability of digital advertising. But if we embrace techno-optimism uncritically or let the tech industry set the agenda, much of the potential could be squandered.

ARBITRATION PRESERVES TIME, **MONEY, AND RELATIONSHIPS**

to justice. The growing burden of over 4.9 crore pending cases in Indian courts has prompted policymakers to consider strengthening alternative dispute resolution (ADR) mechanisms.

The institutionalisation of arbitration was expected to bring about a paradigm shift in Indian arbitration jurisprudence, allowing arbitration centres to professionally manage arbitration cases directly from disputants without interference or reference by courts. The only requirement for these institutions to arbitrate a dispute is the existence of an arbitration clause in the disputants' contracts or their mutual agree ment to arbitrate.

The Justice Srikrishna committee examined the operations of the International Centre for Alternative Dispute Resolution (ICADR). India's only international arbitration centre overseen by the Government of India and the Supreme Court of India. This was India's first International Arbitration Centre, with headquarters in New Delhi and regional centres in Bangalore and Hyderabad.

The ICADR was established

The arbitration institutions maintain complete confidentiality throughout the procedure. Small and mediumsized businesses, the construction industry, civil contractors, families seeking property division among siblings, and others with arbitrable cases can walk into the offices of arbitration institutions and file

Three Kerala political fronts at crossroads

Thiruvananthapuram, June 5: A day after the results of the 2024 Lok Sabha polls were declared, all the three political fronts in Kerala are mulling the way forward.

The biggest highlight of the Kerala Lok Sabha polls was the Lotus blooming in the state, with actor Suresh Gopi winning from Trissur

The Congress-led UDF got 18 seats and the ruling CPI(M)-led Left ended up with one seat.

In the 2019 polls, out of the 20 Lok Sabha seats in the state, the Congress won 19 and the CPI(M) one. The BJP-led NDA did not win any seat and finished second in just one and a distant third on

the remaining seats.

This time the NDA managed to increase its vote share from 15.56 per cent in 2019 to 19.18 per cent, while the UDF saw its share decline from 47.24 per cent to 46.22 per cent and the Left share slipped from 35.11 per cent to 34.63 per cent.

In terms of numbers, though the Left managed to keep status quo with regards to 2019, the Congress candidates increased their victory margins in the traditional strongholds of the CPI(M)

It included constituencies like Kasargod, Kannur, Kozhikode, Vadakara and Palakkad.

The CPI(M) plans to introspect and Chief Minister Vijayan will have to find a replacement for his Cabinet colleague and Minister of ST/SC, K Radhakrishnan who was the party's lone winner.

Since Radhakrishnan belongs to the SC community, it remains to be seen if CM Vijayan will induct an SC MLA of his party into the Cabinet.

He also has to find a party candidate for the Chelakara Assembly constituency which Radhakrishnan represents.

Then comes the need for finding a suitable party candidate for the Palakkad Assembly constituency as the Congress' Shafi Parambil won big from the Vadakara Lok Sabha constituency

The UDF will first have to find a candidate to replace Parambil in his Assembly constituency. Then they have the onerous task of placating K Muraleedharan who lost the sitting Congress seat to Suresh Gopi at Trissur.

K Muraleedharan has already gone public saying that he will no longer be available to contest and will not attend party meetings.

As for the BJP state unit, though they can claim that they played a crucial role in increasing the party's vote share and making the lotus bloom, it remains to be seen if there is going to be a shakeup in the party organisation.

Now, all eyes are on what CM Vijayan has to say as he was peeved when asked if the Lok Sabha polls would be an assessment of his governance.

New Parliament to have many celebrity faces

New Delhi: With voters favouring many celebrity faces -- trusted and new -- this election season, eyes will be on the performance of first-time MPs like Kangana Ranaut and Arun Govil as they take their place in the 18th Lok Sabha along with returning star-politicians Hema Malini and Manoj Tiwari. The actor, who has often found herself at the centre of controversies and always vocal about her opinions, had spoken about devoting her life to public service post her win. There is a lot of curiosity about Ranaut's tenure as an MP. Not just Ranaut, "Ramayan" star Govil was another celebrity face fielded by the BJP.

The breakdown of seat-sharing talks between the TMC and the Congress in January worked to the TMC's advantage, setting the stage for a three-cornered contest.

This fragmentation of Opposition votes allowed the TMC to consolidate nearly 30 per cent of the minority and anti-BJP votes, which proved decisive in many constituencies.

This strategic positioning helped the TMC capture votes that might have otherwise gone to the fragmented opposition.

Local issues like the cancellation of school jobs, and the contentious implementation of the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA), significantly reshaped election dynamics as the BJP's propagation of corruption allegations failed to resonate with voters, while the CAA, intended as a BJP electoral strategy, unexpectedly prompted minorities previously undecided between the TMC and the Left-Congress alliance to consolidate behind the Trinamool Congress.

74 women elected to Lok Sabha, lower than 2019

New Delhi, June 5: A total of 74 women have won the Lok Sabha elections, a slight dip from 78 elected in 2019.

Of the total women MPs elected to the Lower House from across the country, West Bengal

is leading with 11 female MPs. A total of 797 women candidates had contested the elections with the BJP fielding the maximum at 69 followed by the Congress at 41. This is the first election since the passage of the women's reservation bill in the Parliament to reserve one-third of seats in the Lok Sabha and state assemblies for women. The

law is yet to come into effect. According to an analysis by think-tank PRS, 16 per cent of these women MPs are below the age of 40.

The analysis said 41 per cent of women MPs (30 MPs) have previously been members of the Lok Sabha. Of the others, one MP has been a member of the Rajya Sabha.

"While there has been a slow increase in the number of women in the Lok Sabha over the years, India still lags behind several countries. For example, 46 per cent of MPs in South Africa, 35 per cent in the UK, and 29 per cent



Court rejects Kejriwal's bail plea

New Delhi, June 5: In yet another setback to Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, a city court Wednesday dismissed his application for interim bail on medical grounds in the money laundering case linked to the alleged excise policy scam.

Special Judge Kaveri Baweja directed the Tihar jail authorities to take care of his medical needs in judicial custody. The judge also extended Kejriwal's judicial custody till June 19.

The court is scheduled to take up June 7 his application seeking default bail in the case. During the hearing Saturday, the ED had opposed the application, saying he campaigned throughout the Lok Sabha elections but "now when he has to surrender, he suddenly claims to be ill"

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) national convener surrendered Sunday at the Tihar jail as the tenure of his interim bail granted by the Supreme Court expired June 1.

The case relates to alleged corruption and money laundering in the formulation and execution of the Delhi government's now-scrapped excise policy for 2021-22. The judge had observed that the application was for grant of interim bail on medical grounds and not for the bail. During the hearing of his extension of the interim bail application, Kejriwal's counsel granted by the Supreme Court. told the court that he was ill and The top court had May 10 needed treatment.

"A person who is saying that his condition is serious....look at his conduct. From the day he was released, he is campaigning

everywhere and not like one minute or two minutes, it's for hours. At that time, nothing happens to his health. But when he has to surrender, he is suddenly ill," he said. The ED alleged that Kejriwal wanted to "cheat" the court. "If any tests are required, we'll provide all facilities in jail. If required we will take (Kejriwal) to AIIMS or any hospital," it said.

The ED's counsel said, "A per-son who claims on TV that I may die, kidney failure etc, didn't go for a basic test since May 25. The entire system cannot be taken for a joy ride. It is a game being played by the litigant with the system. The prayers may not be granted."

Seeking the relief, Kejriwal's counsel told the court that despite his ill health, the AAP leader campaigned because that was the purpose for which the interim bail was granted by the Supreme Court.

Stress due to the campaign increased his sugar level. Today, when I (Kejriwal) go back to jail without tests being done, I am subjecting myself to risks. This is only to ensure the fact that the treatment given to me is in conformity to the ailment I have. I am not asking for interim bail for two months or three months. What is the prejudice that it will cause to them?" the counsel said.

The court has, meanwhile, sought ED's response by June 7 on Kejriwal's another application seeking regular bail in the case

Pune, June 5: A forensic laboratory report shows that the blood samples of the mother were swapped with those of her 17-year-old son involved in the Porsche crash that claimed two lives here, police informed a court Wednesday.

In a related development, the Juvenile Justice Board (JJB) extended the teenager's observation home remand until June 12. while the sessions court extended the police custody of his parents until June 10, following a request from the police.

During the hearing before the sessions court here, the prosecution informed that a report of the Forensic Science Laboratory confirmed that blood samples of Shivani Agarwal were used to replace those of her teenager son.

Police had earlier arrested two doctors and a hospital employee from Sassoon General Hospital over allegations of tampering with the minor's blood samples to falsify evidence that he was not under the influence of alcohol at the time of the accident May 19. It is suspected that one of the doctors had been in

communication with the teenager's father. The tragic incident occurred in Kalyani Nagar, resulting in the deaths of two IT professionals after the Porsche. allegedly driven by the minor, collided with their two-wheeler. The police have claimed that the iuvenile was driving under the influence of alcohol.

The teen's mother was arreste June 1 on conspiracy charges related to the case.

During the proceedings on Wednesday, the parents of the minor, along with the two doctors and the hospital employee, were presented before the court after the completion of their initial police custody.

The court extended the custody of the doctors and the hospital employee until June 7.

Initially, the teenager, identified as the son of real estate developer Vishal Agarwal, was granted bail by the JJB shortly after the incident and was given a directive to write a 300-word essay on road safety.


However, following public outcry, the police revisited the case, leading to a modification of the initial order and the juvenile being placed in the observation home until June 5.

Boeing launches NASA astronauts for first time after yrs of delays

Cape Canaveral, June 5: Boeing launched astronauts for the first time Wednesday, belatedly joining SpaceX as a second taxi service for NASA.

A pair of NASA test pilots blasted off aboard Boeing's Starliner capsule for the International Space Station, the first to fly the new spacecraft. The trip by Butch Wilmore and Indian-origin Sunita Williams was expected to take 25 hours, with an arrival Thursday.

Crippled by bad software, Starliner's initial test flight in 2019 without a crew had to be repeated before NASA would let its astronauts strap in. The 2022 doover went much better, but parachute problems later cropped up and flammable tape had to be removed from the capsule.

Wednesday's launch was the third attempt with astronauts since early May, coming after a pair of rocket-related problems, most recently last weekend. A small helium leak in the spacecraft's propulsion system also caused delays, but managers decided the leak was manageable and not a safety issue. "I know it's been a long road to get here,' NASA's commercial crew program manager Steve Stich said before the weekend delay. Boeing was hired alongside Elon Musk's SpaceX a decade ago to ferry NASA's astronauts to and from the space station.



NORTH KOREA US B-1 flies precision bomb drill

Seoul, June 5: The United States flew a long-range B-1B bomber over the Korean Peninsula Wednesday for its first precision-guided bombing drill with South Korea in seven years, the South said Wednesday.

The drill — seen as a show of force against North Korea — comes as tensions are rising over the North's recent launches of rubbishcarrying balloons toward South Korea and other provocations.

Wednesday's training involved other advanced US and South Korean fighter jets as well as the B-1B aircraft, the second US bomber temporarily deployed over the Korean Peninsula this year. The exercise was meant to demonstrate the US security commitment to South Korea and strengthen the allies' joint defense posture, according to the South Korean Defense Ministry.

During the training, the B-1B dropped Joint Direct Attack Munitions while being escorted by South Korean jets, the first such bombing drill for a US bomber since 2017, a ministry statement said.

It said South Korean fighter jets also conducted live-firing exercises to demonstrate the country's readiness to punish North Korea if provoked, it said.

The JDAM bombs include 'bunker-busters." JDAM is a guidance system that converts unguided, conventional bombs into more precise, GPS-guided weapons. All US fighter jets, bombers and drones can use JDAMs, and the munitions are among the weapons systems the

United States has been providing to Ukraine to help it fight Russia's invasion.

North Korea is extremely sensitive to drills using bunkerbuster bombs, which could threaten its leadership and complex web of underground military tunnels and structures. North Korea has previously responded to the flights of powerful US aircraft in South Korea with its own missile tests.

A B-1B is capable of carrying a large conventional weapons payload. North Korean has previously called the bomber's deployment proof of US hostility.

In the past week, North Korea floated hundreds of huge balloons to drop manure, cigarette butts, scraps of cloth and waste batteries across South Korea. In response, South Korea vowed "unbearable" retaliatory steps and suspended a fragile tensionreducing military deal with North Korea, restoring its frontline military activities.

The suspension of the 2018 inter-Korean deal allows South Korea to resume military activities like live-fire drills or anti-North Korean propaganda broadcasts via loudspeakers in border areas. Such steps will likely prompt North Korea to take provocative steps in response

Recently, North Korea launched a rocket in an attempt to place a second spy satellite into orbit in violation of UN resolutions, but it blew up shortly after liftoff. It also test-fired nuclear-capable weapons for a drill simulating a preemptive strike on South Korea, and allegedly jammed GPS navigation signals in South Korea.

One shooter was killed, one escaped, and the third was wounded and detained by the Lebanese military. The attack took place as tensions continued to simmer in the tinv Mediterranean country, where months of fighting between Hezbollah militants and Israeli troops has displaced thousands along the border. Local media reported that there was a gunfight involving at least one attacker and lasting almost half an hour at the US diplomatic mission.

Slovakia's PM posts speech online

Bratislava: Slovakia's populist Prime Minister Robert Fico posted a speech online Wednesday in his first appearance since he was seriously wounded in an assassination attempt three weeks ago. In a pre-recording speech posted on his Facebook ahead of the European Parliament election. Fico said the attack caused serious damage to his health and that "it will be a small miracle if I return to work in several weeks".

Italian PM visits Albania

Rome: Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni visited Albania Wednesday, where her government plans to build reception camps to house thousands of migrants picked up at sea. Looking to curb migration to Italy, Meloni signed a deal with Albania last year to send some asylum-seekers to the Balkan country and process the asylum requests there. The accord, agreed for an initial five years, foresees disembarking 36,000 migrants a year at the Albanian port of Shengjin, about 75 km south of the country's capital, Tirana. Their cases will be processed at a centre being built at a nearby air base in Gjader, which can hold 3,000 people. Both facilities will be staffed by Italian personnel and will operate under Italian jurisdiction. However, outside security will be provided by Albanian guards.

Biden prepares order for asylum

Washington: The White House is telling lawmakers that President Joe Biden is preparing to sign off on an executive order that would shut down asvlum requests at the US-Mexico border once the average number of daily encounters hits 2,500 at ports of entry, with the border reopening only once that number declines to 1,500, according to several people familiar with the discussions. The impact of the 2.500 figure means that the executive order could go into immediate effect, because daily figures are higher than that now. The Democratic president is expected to unveil the actions, his most aggressive unilateral move yet to control the numbers at the border, at the White House Tuesday at an event to which border mayors have been invited.

Johannesburg, June 5: The African National Congress is leaning towards trying to form a government of national unity for South Africa, it said Wednesday, but the second-largest party said it would not join a government that included some of its smaller rivals.

The ANC, which has run the country since Nelson Mandela led it to victory in the 1994 elections that marked the end of apartheid, lost its parliamentary majority in last week's election for the first time in the democratic era. Punished by voters over persistent poverty and joblessness, rampant crime, rolling power blackouts and corruption, the ANC is still the largest party but can no longer govern alone after the May 29 vote.

It has been talking to five parties, ranging from the free-marketeer Democratic Alliance (DA) to the Marxist **Economic Freedom Fighters** (EFF), its spokesperson Mahlengi Bhengu-Motsiri told a press conference in Johannesburg.

"At this point in time the conversation is looking at the government of national unity because this is what the people of South Africa said to us," she said, adding that the party's National Executive Committee would discuss options Thursday.

The ANC will have 159 seats out of 400 in the new National Assembly, while the DA will have 87. The populist uMkhonto we Sizwe (MK), led by former pres-

ident Jacob Zuma, will have 58 seats, the EFF 39, the socially conservative Inkatha Freedom Party 17 and the far-right Patriotic Alliance (PA) nine. "If the (ANC's) idea is also to ex-

tend an invitation to all parties above a certain threshold to serve in the executive, which would include MK, the EFF and the PA, our negotiating team will not be empowered to conclude such an arrangement," said DA spokesperson Werner Horn.

"The current decision is that we will not join these parties in a government," he said, adding that any change of position would have to be agreed by the party's federal governing bodies.

An EFF spokesperson declined to comment on whether it was prepared to take part in a

government of national unity. South Africa's rand currency weakened in volatile trade after the ANC's comments, and weakened further after the DA's reaction, reflecting market anxiety over the political uncertainty.

An internal ANC discussion paper, verified by Reuters Wednesday, said a unity government was the most inclusive option and would allow the ANC to avoid choosing a coalition partner that may be unpopular with its base.

New York, June 5: The rate Earth is warming hit an all-time high in 2023 with 92 per cent of last year's surprising recordshattering heat caused by humans, top scientists calculated. The group of 57 scientists from around the world used United Nations-approved methods to examine what was behind last year's deadly burst of heat. They said even with a faster warming rate they don't see evidence of significant acceleration in humancaused climate change beyond in-

creased fossil fuel burning.

Piers Forster, a Leeds University climate scientist, said. "Things are increasing in temperature and getting worse in sort of exactly the way we predicted.'

It's pretty much explained by the buildup of carbon dioxide from rising fossil fuel use, he and a co-author said.

Last year, the rate of warming hit 0.26 degrees Celsius per decade -up from 0.25 degrees Celsius the year before. That's not a significant difference, though it does make this year's rate the highest ever, Forster said.

Still, outside scientists said this report highlights an ever more alarming situation.

"Choosing to act on climate has become a political talking point but this report should be a reminder to people that in fact it is fundamentally a choice to save human lives," said University of Wisconsin climate scientist Andrea Dutton, who wasn't part of the international study team.

"To me, that is something worth fighting for."

On a larger 10-year time frame,

which scientists prefer to single years, the world has warmed about 1.19 degrees Celsius since pre-industrial times, the report in the journal Earth System Science Data found.

The report also said that as the world keeps using coal, oil and natural gas, Earth is likely to reach the point in 4.5 years that it can no longer avoid crossing the internationally accepted threshold for warming: 1.5 degrees Celsius.

That fits with earlier studies projecting Earth being committed or stuck to at least 1.5 degrees by early 2029 if emission trajectories don't change. The actual hitting of 1.5 degrees could be years later but it would be inevitable if all that carbon is used, Forster said.

It's not the end of the world or humanity if temperatures blow past the 1.5 limit but it will be quite bad, scientists said.

Past UN studies show massive

changes to Earth's ecosystem are more likely to kick in between 1.5 and 2 degrees Celsius of warming, including eventual loss of the planet's coral reefs, Arctic sea ice, species of plants and animals along with nastier extreme weather events that kill people.

Last year's temperature rise was more than just a little jump. It was especially unusual in September, said study co-author Sonia Seneviratne, head of landclimate dynamics at ETH Zurich, a Swiss university.

The year was within the range of what was predicted, albeit it was at the upper edge of the range, Seneviratne said.

"Acceleration if it were to happen would be even worse, like hitting a global tipping point, it would be probably the worst scenario," Seneviratne said. "But what is happening is already extremely bad and it is havingmajor impacts already now. We are in the middle of a crisis."

Wheat output raised to record in FY24

New Delhi: The government has revised upwards wheat production at record 112.92 million tonne for the 2023-24 crop year (July-June) in its third estimate. The output, which has been revised upwards by 0.91 million tonne from the second estimate, is also higher than the previous record high of 110.55 million tonne achieved in the 2022-23 crop year, the agriculture ministry said Tuesday. Wheat, the main rabi (winter) crop, has been harvested and over 26 million tonne has already been procured by the central government at minimum support price. In its third estimate, the agriculture ministry has projected increase in rice output to 136.7 million tonne for 2023 24 from 135.75 million tonne in the previous crop year. However, the total foodgrain output is estimated slightly lower at 328.85 million tonne as compared to the level achieved in 2022-23 but higher by 21.1 million tonne from the last five years' average of 307.75 million tonne. 

Reversing its Monday's sharp gains of over 3 per cent, the 30share BSE Sensex nosedived 4,389.73 points or 5.74 per cent to close at a more than two-month low of 72,079.05. In the day trade, the harometer tanked 6 234 35 points or 8.15 per cent to hit a nearly five-month low level of 70,234.43

The NSE Nifty tumbled 1,982.45 points or 8.52 per cent to 21,281.45 during the day. Later, it ended at 21,884.50, a sharp decline of 1,379.40 points or 5.93 per cent. Sensex and Nifty had previously declined by around 13 per cent March 23, 2020 when lockdown was imposed due to the Covid-19

pandemic. Heavy profit booking in PSUs, public banks, power, utilities, energy, oil and gas, and capital goods shares dragged the markets into the deep negative.

35th anniv of Tiananmen crackdown

Beijing, June 4: Checkpoints and rows of police vehicles lined a major road leading to Beijing's Tiananmen Square Tuesday as China heightened security on the 35th anniversary of a bloody crackdown on pro-democracy protests.

China has long quashed any memory of the killings, when the Chinese government ordered in the army to end the months-long protests and uphold Communist rule. An estimated 180,000 troops and armed police rolled in with tanks and armoured vehicles, and fired into crowds as they pushed toward Tiananmen Square.

The death toll remains unknown to this day. Hundreds, if not thousands are believed to have been killed in an operation that started the night before and ended on the morning of June 4, 1989.



The crackdown became a turning point in modern Chinese history, end ing a crisis in favour of Communist Party hardliners who advocated for control instead of political reforms.

The economy boomed in the ensuing decades, turning a once impoverished country into the world's second largest economy, but societal controls have been tightened since party leader Xi Jinping came to power in 2012.

Across China, the event remains a sensitive and taboo subject that is heavily censored, and any mention or reference on social media is erased. 4 1

Kolkata, June 5: Talismanic Indian footballer Sunil Chhetri does not want to talk about his last match in an Indian jersey Thursday. Instead he wants to focus on his last game against Kuwait here Thursday and win. The Indian captain does not want to carry the burden of retirement on his shoulders as he steps on to the field against Kuwait.

"I think most of us have met already 20 days back and we have spoken about my last game. That's done," Chhetri said on the eve of the second round match. "We are here only and only to speak about Kuwait and India and I'm trying really hard to not think about it as my last game. I want to play with a free mind. It's not about me and my last name, it's about India and Kuwait. And inside me I'm fighting a small battle. Please don't make it worse asking 'how are you feeling', again and again. I do not want to talk about retirement," added Chhetri.

Chhetri once more harped on the importance about the game against Kuwait. "We really need to win this game. Once we win, it gives us a great chance to go to the third round, which we have never done. We are happy, we are playing in Kolkata, because we know we will have huge support," Chhetri pointed out.

Chhetri was asked whether he would consider his decision to retire if India enter the third round of the World Cup Qualifiers. Tongue in cheek he said that he will 'make a suit' to watch the games from the stands.

'No sir, the suits are made, I'm going to go and watch the boys play as a fan. I'm not somebody who just says something that comes on his mind, I've given it my thought. It's been 19 years I had a great ride, and this is it," Chhetri asserted.

"I've played worse sometimes, I played good but I just had a great ride. All I want is the team to win Thursday as it can bring a huge change to Indian football," Chhetri added.

Chhetri was asked whether he contemplates taking up coaching role in future. He came up with a big 'no'. He pointed to coach Igor Stimac sitting beside him and said 'he doesn't want to age like him'. "Five years back I saw this man come, he was very good looking, young and now look at him after five years. He has aged 15 years in five years. I don't think I can be a coach because I'm too selfish and I want to think about myself only," Chhetri asserted.

Chhetri also asserted that he won't be missed as the game is more important than the individual. "There are players like Manvir (Singh), Siva (Sivasakthi Narayanan), Parthib (Gogoi) and Rahim (Ali). They are all ready to step in. They are all quite good,' Chhetri stated.



Stimac targets biggest win of football career

Kolkata, June 5: A win in Thursday's crucial match against Kuwait will virtually take India to their maiden appearance in the third round of the World Cup Qualifiers and head coach Igor Stimac said Wednesday that the feat can change the future of the country's football

Stimac himself is a member of the 1998 World Cup bronzemedal winning Croatian side. He said if India qualify for the third round, it will be the 'biggest moment' of his playing and coaching career, bigger than his feat with the Croatian team.

"This can change the future of Indian football. Although I'm a foreigner in this country but I feel more like an Indian," Stimac said at the pre-match press conference here. "Honestly this is the biggest game altogether in my playing and coaching career and the simple reason is that we have chance to make 1.5 billion Indians happy tomorrow (Thursday). We need to do everything to make it happen," the 56-year-old said. Currently at second spot in
