

In a statement, the government said it will implement the Supreme Court ruling, which states that watching and downloading child pornography can be an offence under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, 2012. The state reaffirms its commitment to upholding stringent legal frameworks aimed at eliminating child sexual exploitation in all forms, it said.

"The state will enhance coordination with law enforcement agencies to effectively combat the dissemination and consumption of child pornography. This includes the establishment of dedicated task forces to investigate and prosecute such

crimes," it said.

"The landmark decision sends a powerful message that the state will not tolerate any form of child sexual exploitation. It reinforces the responsibility of each citizen to protect our children, ensuring their safety and well-being," it added.

In line with the Supreme Court's recommendations, the state will invest in comprehensive support services for victims of child abuse, providing them with the care and resources they need for recovery, the statement said.

The government appealed to the people to report any suspicious activity to protect vulnerable children.

In a path-breaking judgment, the Supreme Court held mere possession of any child pornographic material will constitute offences under the POCSO and the IT laws even if they are not disseminated further.

Bhubaneswar, Sept 23: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi and his four Cabinet colleagues Monday heard grievances of 1,000 people, according to an official statement.

hectare land on Plot No 275/A, Khata No 194 in Kharbhuin Jungle under Harabhanga tehsil in Boudh - has been operating in violation of environmental norms. The quarry has received environmental clearance July 10, 2024, Majhi's counsel Sankar Prasad Pani said.

Highlighting the alleged violations of environmental norms, the petitioner said the lessee has carried out excess mining without environmental clearance and environment compensation has not been realised.

"Reclamation of void pits has not been done, trees and medicinal plants in the lease and adjoining areas have been felled while clearing the land for quarry activity and illegal as well as uncontrolled blasting in the quarry has resulted in damages/cracks to the houses near Kharbhuin jungle village," the petitioner said.

The petitioner also claimed that the overburden dumps were not being dressed, benched and barricaded so as to prevent soil erosion during monsoon. Besides, there is no garland drain around the mining pit.

"Proper site visit has not been done by the district authorities prior to grant of environmental clearance. The District Survey Report (DSR) of Boudh is invalid as it is not approved by the SEIAA and SEAC. The quarry and the plot for which the EC is granted is not a part of the DSR," the petitioner alleged. It was also alleged that the site has no billboard informing

people about the conditions in mining. The environment clearance letter is neither displayed in Kharbhuin jungle village or panchayat office, nor is it available in the website of SEIAA, Odisha. "In the DSR, Kharbhuin-I stone quarry is located in khata no.2, plot no.50. However, the environmental clearance granted to the lessee mentions Kharbhuin I stone quarry on khata no.194, plot no.275/A," the petitioner

pointed out. Judicial member Justice B Amit Sthalekar and expert member Dr Arun Kumar Verma posted the next hearing to -October 10, 2024.

The notices have also been served on Harabhanga tehsildar, deputy director of mining, deputy director of explosives, State Environment Impact-(Assessment Authority (SEIAA), Odisha and the lessee.

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FORESTER'S SUICIDE

Departmental probe against DFO

Bhawanipatna, Sept 23: The Forest department has initiated a departmental investigation into the suicide case of Sanjay Nayak, 33, a forester at the Jaring Hi-Tech Silviculture Nursery under Junagarh block in Kalahandi district following allegations of involvement of the Rayagada DFO (Research Wing) in his death. A Chief Conservator of Forests (CCF)-ranked officer has been assigned to investigate the matter, informed Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (PCCF) Debidatta Biswal, Monday.

Biswal informed mediapersons that a departmental inquiry has been ordered after the police revealed that the suicide note left by the forester mentioned DFO Debendra Behera. He emphasised that swift action is being taken, and a report is expected to be submitted soon. If the investigation



finds anyone guilty, strict action will be taken.

It is noteworthy that forester Sanjay Nayak was found hanging in his government quarters in Bhawanipatna, Wednesday. In a suicide note left by him, there were mentions of several internal issues within the department. The police seized the note during the recovery of the body. In the presence of Sanjay's family members, including his elder brother and complainant Rabi Narayan Nayak,

the note was read by the IIC of the Town police station in front of the Kalahandi SP.

In the note, Sanjay alleged that DFO Behera had repeatedly demanded bribes from him. Sanjay claimed to have paid ₹7 lakh to him last year and another ₹3.5 lakh during Ganesh Puja. He also mentioned installing an air conditioner at the DFO's house and digging a bore well for him. Additionally, he donated ₹40.000 to a temple on the DFO's demand. Sanjay alleged that the DFO used to threaten him of withholding his promotion and transfer to coerce him into paying bribes. The suicide note mentioned these demands and other similar pressure tactics by the DFO on the deceased. The incident has caused a wide-

spread outcry across the state. Meanwhile, Sanjay's wife Privanka also made similar allegations against the DFO, holding him responsible for her husband's death. Sanjay's family hails from Shundhisahi in Rayagada. His elder brother; Rabi Narayan Nayak, alleged that his brother's death was not a suicide but a planned murder. He claimed that DFO Behera had subjected Saniav to severe harassment for over 10 months, which was documented in the suicide note found in Sanjay's pocket. The deceased had not shared the issue with others fearing that it might tarnish his image. In a video posted on social media, Rabi demanded jus-

tice for his brother's death. Last Friday, Minister Ganesh Ram SinghKhuntia during his visit to Ravagada met Sanjav's family and expressed his condolences. He assured them of an impartial investigation into the incident. During the meeting, Sanjay's wife, Priyanka had requested the minister for the payment of her husband's pending dues and other government support.



Man gets 20-yr RI for minor's rape

Phulbani: A POCSO court here Monday convicted a 61year old man for raping a minor girl in 2023 and sentenced him to 20 years of Rigorous Imprisonment (RI). Judge Rajesh Das also slapped a fine of ₹60,000 on the convict Debaraj Digal, a native of Gochhapada PS area under Phiringia block. In case of default, the convict has to undergo an additional 10-month jail term, the judge ordered. According to the case diary, the incident took place February 5 in 2023 when the 17-year old victim was alone at home. Debaraj called the minor girl to come outside her house and forcefully took her to a nearby forest. There he raped her multiple times. When her parents returned home February 9, they came to know about the ordeal of their daughter. The victim's father lodged a written complaint in this regard at Gochhapada PS February 10. Acting on the complaint a case was registered and police after investigation arrested Debaraj. The judge pronounced the judgment after hearing from witnesses and going through the medical and police investigation reports. The judge also ordered the district legal services authority (DLSA) to provide ₹6 lakh compensation to the survivor, said Special Public Prosecutor (SPP) Asim Praharaj.



Electoral Strike

he BJP-led NDA government's decision to accept the recommendations of a high level committee, headed by former President Ram Nah Kovind, to go ahead with the idea of simultaneous elections, dubbed as "One Nation, One Election," is not merely an administrative action. Under the changed circumstances of the BJP's failure to win a simple majority in the Lok Sabha elections held a few months back, it assumes a greater significance. The message that is sought to be given, it seems, is that the BJP is getting over the initial shock of failing to form the government on its own, and increasingly asserting its authority. The Prime Minister had been maintaining a low profile since the election results were announced. He gave the impression that he was chastened and subdued by the poll verdict that dashed his hope and confidence that the BJP alone would cross the 350-mark. The electorate did not repose its trust in the BJP the way the PM had expected. This made the Opposition euphoric and the BJP top brass, especially the PM and Home Minister Amit Shah, withdrew into a shell.

It appears the BJP top leadership feels that by simply re-instating old faces in their old ministries and terming the current government as 3.0 yet remaining in the defensive mode is giving a wrong message to both the nation and party supporters. Hence, the PM could have started to go on the offensive to tell the nation that he is in command of the situation. Such a stance is particularly needed in view of the elections in Haryana and Jammu & Kashmir, in particular.

The PM first chose the emotive Ganesh Puja recently to create the impression that even the judiciary is willing to rub shoulders with him and play second fiddle to the executive. Apparently, he deliberately posted in his X handle the picture of his visit to the Chief Justice of India (CJI)'s house performing 'aarti' on the occasion of Ganesh Chaturthi. This was a calculated step to mix religion with politics and drag the judiciary into it so as to refurbish the image of a demoralised and defeated BJP unable to get the numbers to rule on its own. In the process, the PM breached the convention of the executive staying away from the judiciary. The dictum that justice is seen to be done makes it mandatory that judges do not mix with the executive since it means a conflict of interests, the government often being a litigant. In this case, the CJI came under severe criticism for allowing such an incident, much more than the PM. The Opposition cried itself hoarse, but the PM was not bothered. He questioned the Congress' intent for criticising his visit.

This supposedly has emboldened the BJP so much that the controversial issue of "One Nation, One Election" was brought back in an unabashed manner and the Cabinet cleared the Kovind committee recommendations. However, apart from the mathematical ability in the Parliament, it seems extremely difficult for the government to swing this deal due to internal counter pressures.

The committee envisaged simultaneous Lok Sabha and State Assembly elections as the first step, followed by municipal and panchayat polls within 100 days of the general election. For this, the government would need to get constitutional amendments to be passed, in Parliament and in majority of State Assemblies. Two key reasons have been given for the proposal. The first is that the cost of conducting these elections would be significantly reduced if held together. The second is that if there are no simultaneous elections, political parties would remain busy with prolonged campaigns affecting governance and legislative work. However, there has been little to no data to support the first reason. Already, general elections take an inordinately long time, with some state polls being held in multiple phases

One of the committee's recommendations is that if a State Assembly gets dissolved before five years of its term, after the "appointed date" for synchronising Lok Sabha and Assembly elections, fresh "midterm" elections will be held but the new Assembly will not have a full fiveyear tenure which will end five years from the "appointed date." This provision militates against the original idea of cost-cutting through simultaneous elections. It also goes against the concept of federalism. In a multi-tiered governance system, people choose their represen-

tatives based on their perception of who is best suited. Each tier has its importance of its own.

The second reason is that representatives are in campaign mode for far too long and as such polls to every tier should all be held during the same period. The fact that national representatives of parties are forever in campaign mode is actually the fallout of the centralising tendencies of parties that are in power. Replacing multi-tier elections with simultaneous mode has the potential to reduce the importance of each tier, especially the Assembly and municipal/panchayat levels, and is anti-federal

It bears repeating that the countries that are most vulnerable to climate change - especially small island developing states (SIDS), like Dominica, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, and Grenada - are often those that have done the least to cause it. As a result, we have little power to mitigate it directly, such as by reducing our own (already low) emissions. But we can still contribute to overcoming the challenge. The key is to work together to compel big polluters to change

Shipping also facilitates the tourism that supports so many livelihoods on our island.

But, while shipping is essential, so is reducing the associated pollution. That is why the be substantial: according to the World Bank, a levy of \$150 per ton would generate \$60-80 billion per year.

For countries like Dominica, such a policy would be a gamechanger. It would reduce the pollution from ships that come to our shores, make our ports and supply chains more resilient to rising sea levels and extreme weather events, advance a just energy transition, and support progress on the Sustainable Development Goals.

An ideal opportunity to accelerate progress toward this goal is about to unfold in London. Between September 23 and October 4, the UN's International Maritime Organization (IMO) and its 175 member states will attempt to agree on a set of policies for reducing shipping emis sions, including some form of emissions pricing, to be adopted in April 2025.

In the negotiations, SIDS must stand together to ensure that the levy is sufficiently high, and that the revenues will be distributed equitably. Already, a growing majority of countries want to see a levy mechanism adopted at the IMO, but oth ers, including Brazil and China continue to resist this oppor-

tunity. Belize and Pacific island states are calling for a price of \$150 per ton, with the revenues going mostly to SIDS and least developed countries to finance investment in zero-emissions energy, ships and maritime infrastructure, and broader climate and resilience goals. More countries, in the Caribbean and beyond, must join them. When speaking in unison, our voices will matter.

While release of water by the dams is inevitable after the storage ca-

pacity is breached, there is also need for dredging to check release of water. But it is strange why before the release of water, the people cannot be transferred to rehabilitation camps

Then river flooding is a common phenomenon. This happens in various parts of the country at different points of time. One may refer to the recent flooding in the prestigious city of Varanasi, which the Prime Minister claimed to convert to a smart city. According to river scientists, construction in the streams of the river. dumping of construction materials in the river and renoGanga in Varanasi in the last three years due to renovations and modern buildings coming up has resulted in floods. Obviously in such a high-profile city there is lack of proper planning and proper estimation of the capacity of the river to hold water. Not just Varanasi, many cities, even metro cities like Chennai are affected almost every year. This has accentuated in recent years due to climate change causing erratic rainfall and other such factors.

In such a situation, it is heartening to note that the government has launched Mission Mausam for which an investment of Rs 2000 crore over the next two years has been made which will involve a major upgrade in India's weather forecasting infrastructure to raise area specific, short and mediumterm forecast accuracy by around 10%. The Mission will also focus on broadening the observation network with the installation of next generation technology, including supercomputers, dopplers, wind profilers. radiometers and GISbased automated

couraging, it is necessary that these are implemented judiciously so that poor people, who are mostly affected by floods, do not have to suffer much because of this natural calamity. At the same time, flooding is

a global phenomenon, and there are countries other than India severely affected by floods and cyclones almost every year. Losses due to floods are immense and for countries like India, where there is significant population pressure, millions of dollars are lost every year. A new study predicted that global flooding incidence could increase by 49% between 2020 and 2100 if the world continues to follow the ominous path of emitting greenhouse gases by following the present strategy of development.

The biggest increase in flooding incidence is projected to be around coastlines in tropical Africa and Asia, and in arid North Africa. The North Atlantic and Indian Ocean coasts, as well as south-eastern Asia and the Pacific Islands are likely to see the most pronounced effects, a paper published in Water

Meanwhile, rainfall-induced flooding hazards appear to intensify and are especially vulnerable to human-caused climate change. They are likely to increase by 6% by 2100 in a low emissions scenario, and 44% in a high emissions model, the study highlighted.

In understanding the recurrence of floods, many studies have highlighted that the world may witness a consistent and large change in coastal flood hazard globally. There are reports that this may almost double, even in a low emissions scenario. This is because the mean ocean temperature will continue to increase even after global surface air temperature has stopped climbing. This causes the water to expand, leading to an increase in sea levels.

The writing is on the wall and not paying heed would be a great folly. While the vagaries of climate are not in the hands of the government, it should go all-out to get its act together when it comes to floods triggered by manmade mistakes.

Given Wickremesinghe's high unpopularity, the traditional forces backed Opposition leader SJB's Sajitha Premadasa in the presidential election. Premadasa positioned himself as a savior without proposing any alternative policies. Meanwhile, more than 20 organizations banded together to form the National People's Power (NPP), which was led by the Marxist party Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna (JVP). Breaking from the norm, the NPP presented voters with an alternative strategy that included ordinary people-centric economic ideas. Anura Kumara Dissanayake, 56, the charismatic head of the JVP and an NPP candidate, has been elected President of the country. Abhijit Roy, JAMSHEDPUR

High-octane campaigning ends

SECOND PHASE OF POLLING WEDNESDAY WILL DECIDE THE **POLITICAL FATE OF** 239 CANDIDATES, **INCLUDING FORMER CM OMAR ABDULLAH**

Jammu/Srinagar, Sept 23: Ruling and Opposition bigwigs led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Congress leader Rahul Gandhi locked horns on the political stage as campaigning for the second phase of the Jammu and Kashmir polls ended Monday evening

The blazing campaign saw emotional appeals to people and uncouth remarks about rivals, as the leaders tried to woo voters of 26 Assembly constituencies spread across six districts of the Union Territory, including the summer capital Srinagar.

There are 25.78 lakh eligible voters in the penultimate phase of the three-phase Assembly elections. An estimated 61.38 per cent of the electorate cast their ballots in the first phase of polling September 18, while the third phase of elections covering the remaining 40 Assembly segments will go to polls in the final phase October 1. The votes will be counted October 8.

This is the first Assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir post the abrogation of Article 370 which granted special status to the region and its bifurcation into two Union Territories in August 2019. The last Assembly elections were held in 2014.

Modi addressed two rallies, one each in Srinagar and Katra in Reasi district, September 19, while Union Home Minister Amit Shah addressed rallies in

Mendhar. Surankote, Thanamandi, Rajouri and Nowshera in the twin border districts of Poonch and Rajouri. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh also dashed to the two districts in the Jammu region to canvas for the BJP candidates and addressed rallies in Poonch, Budhal and Sunderbani during his daylong tour Sunday. Both Shah and Singh addressed rallies in Akhnoor and Sainik colony in Jammu, while BJP president JP Nadda also visited Jammu to attend election-related events.

The star campaigners of the Congress included its president Mallikariun Kharge and the leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi.

Gandhi addressed two rallies one in the Surankote constituency in Poonch and another in the Central-Shalteng segment in Srinagar -- to pull the cur-tains on the high-pitched campaign of the Congress. The BJP also deployed several of its Union ministers and senior party functionaries, including Jitendra Singh and G Kishan Reddy for campaigning, while the Congress campaign featured AICC national secretary Sachin Pilot, Alka Lamba and other leaders. National Conference president Farooq Abdullah extensively campaigned for his party candidates on either side of the Pir Panjal Mountain Range while his son and vice president Omar Abdullah largely focused

on the valley seats as he is contesting from Ganderbal and Budgam segments. Iltija Mufti seems to have taken over the mantle of lead campaigner for the PDP as party president Mehbooba Mufti was not as active as she used to be in earlier elections.

The campaigning had its share of emotional moments particularly the cap-removing gesture by Omar Abdullah while seeking support from the people of Ganderbal. The former chief minister impressed upon people that it was not only his dignity that was at stake but of all people.

There were also incidents of the discourse going downhill with some candidates using foul language against their rivals.

Sugra, the daughter of jailed separatist leader Sarjan Ahmad Barkati, was at the receiving end of verbal abuse as she campaigned for her father, contesting from Ganderbal and Beerwah segments.

The second phase of polling September 25 will decide the political fate of 239 candidates, including former chief minister Omar Abdullah.

Other prominent candidates in the fray include Jammu and Kashmir BJP chief Ravinder Raina (Nowshera constituency), Pradesh Congress Committee president Tariq Hamid Karra (Central-Shalteng), Apni party president Altaf Bukhari (Channapora), former ministers Ali Sagar (Khanyar), Rahim Rather (Chrar-i-Sharief), and Choudhary Zulfikar (Budhal) and Syed Mushtaq Bukhari (Surankote), both of whom are fighting on a BJP ticket.

Officials said the political blitzkrieg witnessed over the past few weeks ended peacefully at 6pm Monday for the mandatory 48-hour 'silence period' before the conclusion of the daylong polling Wednesday which is scheduled to start at 7am.

According to officials, the highest 93 candidates are trying their luck from eight seats of Srinagar district, followed by 46 in five seats of Budgam district, 34 in five seats of Rajouri district, 25 in three seats of Poonch district. 21 in two seats of Ganderbal district and 20 in three seats of Reasi district.

Over 15.5K Kashmiri Pandits eligible to vote in 2nd phase

Jammu, Sept 23: More than 15,500 displaced Kashmiri Pandit voters from across the country are eligible to vote at 24 polling stations in the second phase of the Jammu and Kashmir Assembly election Wednesday

The polling, scheduled to be held in 26 Assembly segments of six districts in the Union Territory September 25, will decide the fate of 239 candidates.

The displaced Kashmiri Pandits will be exercising their right to franchise in the 15 segments of central Kashmir's Srinagar, Budgam and Ganderbal districts.

Over 15,500 Kashmiri migrant voters are eligible to cast their votes at 24 special polling stations set up in Jammu, Udhampur and Delhi tomorrow for the second phase of elections, Relief and Rehabilitation Commissioner Arvind Karwani told PTI.



Karwani, who is supervising the election process, said over 14,700 such voters are registered in Jammu to exercise their right to franchise at 19 polling stations here.

Similarly, over 600 Kashmiri migrant voters are registered in Delhi to cast their votes at four polling stations in Delhi and over 350 at one such polling station in Udhampur, he said.

Although the majority of Kashmiri Pandit population lives in Delhi and NCR areas, a miniscule number of over 600 have registered for the polling in cur rent Assembly elections.



Bangalore, Sept 23: The series of violent incidents during the Ganesh Visarjan procession, ahead of by-elections in Karnataka, is proving to be a setback for the Congress party and its government

Congress leaders have confided that they are concerned about the incidents connected to stone-pelting and rioting in Nagamangala town in Mandya district, known as a Vokkaliga heartland, where more than 20 shops were burnt. Additionally, stone-pelting and communal unrest in Davanagere City, located in central Karnataka, have also become a problem for the party.

The images of Lord Ganesh's idol being casually carried away by police personnel during the protests in Bangalore, and the sacred idol being placed inside a police vehicle used to transport detainees have hurt the religious sentiments of Hindus.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi referenced the images during an election rally in Haryana, stating, "In Congress-ruled Karnataka, even Ganpati is being put in jail." The BJP and Hindu organisations have since criticised the Congress government for its handling of the situation.

Minister Home G Parameshwara's statement downplaying the event as a "small incident" only fuelled further criticism of the party. The BJP also objected to the police initially

naming the event organisers as the first 23 accused and later adding names from the Muslim community in the FIR related to

the Nagamangala case. The death of a 23-year-old Hindu youth, Kiran, from the Badrikoppalu area of

Nagamangala, who disappeared after fearing arrest in connection with the violence, is likely to further complicate matters for the Congress party. Kiran had left his village after the incident September 11, fearing arrest. He was admitted to the hospital Friday and died of a brain stroke Saturday (September 21). Kiran's father is also under arrest. Kiran is named as the 17th accused in the case.

The BJP has also criticised the Congress government after Tumakuru University issued a circular restricting students from participating in Ganesh Utsav

The Congress, which is already facing the consolidation of the influential Vokkaliga and Lingayat vote banks and suffered a setback in the Parliamentary elections, now faces the challenge of retaining its SC, ST, and OBC vote banks, which have been core strengths for the party.

This is happening at a critical time when by-elections for three Assembly seats are due.

Above all, Ganesh Visarjan processions will continue until October in the state, and the Congress is worried about the unfolding events.

Bangalore, Sept 23: The Karnataka High Court has introduced strict guidelines for live-streaming of judicial proceedings to prevent unauthorised sharing of clips on social media platforms.

The incident stems from remarks made by a single judge recently. These comments, made during a live-streamed hearing, sparked widespread criticism after video clips went viral.

To address this, the High Court has issued a note titled, "Prohibitions and Restrictions on Usage of the Recording or

Live Stream," which is now displayed at the beginning of livestreamed sessions The note prohibits any unau-

thorised recording, sharing, or dissemination of live-streamed proceedings and archival data, including on social media and

messaging platforms. Only authorised individuals or entities are permitted to handle such recordings. The court also warned that anyone found violating these rules would face legal consequences under the Indian Copyright Act, 1957, the Information Technology Act, 2000, and contempt of court laws.

Further, the note underscores the court's exclusive copyright over its recordings and mandates that the use of authorised recordings-allowed for news, educational, and training purposes-must not be edited or repurposed for commercial use.

Rules on Live Streaming and Recording of Court Proceedings. 2021, reinforces these restrictions by barring the use of recording devices by unauthorised individuals during hearings. The changes come after Justice V Srishananda's remarks, which led to public backlash, prompting the judge to express regret.

Following media reports, the Supreme Court has taken note of the issue and asked the High Court Registrar General to file a detailed report on the matter.

The Advocates' Association of Bengaluru has also called for a temporary halt on live-streaming and urged judges to exercise greater sensitivity during proceedings.

They raised concerns that certain YouTube channels had exaggerated the judge's comments, attaching misleading titles to the content.

active role in supporting the Purushyar temple in the Habba Kadal area, fostering an atmosphere of respect for each other's beliefs.


Babloo Jee Bhat, the temple's caretaker for the past 18 years, expressed gratitude for the Muslim community's support.



India reports first case of Mpox Clade 1b strain

A bench of Chief Justice DY Chandrachud and Justice JB Pardiwala said the pleas were already "listed tomorrow" and they would be taken up after some part-heard cases. Psilocybin offers more long-term benefits than anti-depressants

A direct comparison between the experimental psychedelic drug psilocybin and a standard SSRI antidepressant shows similar improvement of depressive symptoms, but that psilocybin offers additional longer-term benefits

New Delhi, Sept 23: Psilocybin, the psychedelic drug commonly known as 'magic mushrooms', offers longer-term benefits, compared to standard antidepressants, including overall better well-being, meaning in life and social functioning, a study has found

Comparing two separate antidepression treatments -- one involving the psychedelic drug and the other involving a standard SSRI antidepressant escitalopram -- researchers had previously found that after six weeks, depressive symptoms such as sadness and negative emotions had improved to similar levels.

SSRI refers to selective serotonin reuptake inhibitors, a class of drugs commonly used to treat depression and other psychiatric illnesses. These drugs work by increasing serotonin levels in the brain, a chemical that is known to play a positive role in

mood, emotion and sleep. "However, this work shows that psilocybin outperformed escitalopram (SSRI antidepressant) in several measures of well-being, meaning in life, work and social functioning. These results appeared to be maintained over a 6-month follow-up period," lead researcher Tommaso Barba, a PhD candidate from Imperial College London, UK, said.

For the study, the researchers included 59 patients -- 30 were treated with a single dose of psilocybin, while 29 were given a six-week course of escitalopram. The participants were followed for a period of six months and received similar psychological support of around 20 hours in total.

After six months, the authors \rightarrow found that both groups showed significant improvement in depressive symptoms.

However, those given psilocybin were found to report greater improvements in socialfunctioning and psychological connectedness.

Malik named new DG of Pak's ISI

Islamabad: Lt Gen Muhammad Asim Malik has been appointed as the new Director General of Pakistan's spy agency - Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI), state-run TV announced on Monday. Lt Gen Malik, currently serving as an adjutant general at the General Headquarters in Rawalpindi, will assume his new role on September 30, replacing the current DG Lt Gen Nadeem Anjum. Colombo, Sept 23: Marxist Anura Kumara leader Dissanayake Monday took oath as Sri Lanka's new President and said he will usher in a "Renaissance" for his country. Dissanayake, 56, was sworn in as Sri Lanka's ninth President by Chief Justice Jayantha Jayasuriya at the Presidential

Secretariat. In his inaugural address to the nation, Dissanayake thanked predecessor Ranil his Wickremesinghe for respecting the people's mandate and facilitating a peaceful transfer of power. 'I assure you that I will do my best to preserve democracy

and work towards restoring the honour of politicians as people have misgivings about their conduct," Dissanayake said in an address after taking the oath.

Dissanavake stressed Sri Lanka cannot remain in isolation and needed international cooperation. He said he is not a magician, but his objective is to be part of a collective responsibility to elevate the economic crisis-stricken country.

"I'm not a magician. I'm an ordinary citizen born in this country. I have abilities and shortcomings. I have things I know and don't know. My first task is to make use of people's talents and know-how and make better decisions to lead this country," he said.

"I want to be a contributor to that collective responsibility," he added. Later in a post on X after the swearing-in ceremony, Dissanayake said, "I promise to

South China Sea and East China Sea is stable. "I want to stress that any inference of any forces will not shake China's firm determination to uphold its territorial sovereignty, maritime rights interests, regional peace and stability," he said, adding that China will lodge diplomatic protests to countries if they take any action to undermine Beijing's sovereignty.

PIO charged for killing compatriot in Singapore

Singapore, Sept 23: A 22-yearold Indian-origin man has been charged with the murder of a compatriot in a fight that broke out in the wee hours of Sunday in Singapore's Little India precinct.

Muhammad Sajid Saleem was given the capital charge, read in Tamil, while five other people were handed charges of rioting over the same incident that claimed the life of a 25-year-old man, Channel News Asia reported.

Saleem is accused of causing the death of Dhinessh Vasie between 4 am and 4:08 am near Verdun Road in the Farrer Park area.

The five charged with rioting are Satish Jason Prabahas, 23, Kirrthik Roshan Prem Ananth, 22, Pradave Shashi Kumar, 20, and two women, Nur Diyana Harun Al Rasheed, 24, and Kasthuri Kallidas Marimuthu, 24.

At least one of them was allegedly armed with a deadly weapon during the riot, and three people — Dhinessh, Naviinjaay C Nathan and K Vicknesh were injured as a result, the charge sheets stated.

The police prosecutor asked for all six to be remanded for further investigations, to conduct raids, seize exhibits and visit the scene.

The judge has adjourned it to September 30.

Murder carries the death penalty, while rioting with a deadly weapon carries a jail term of up to 10 years and caning. Women cannot be caned.

The six were remanded for further investigations and willreturn to court next week, according to the report.

Russia violates Japan's airspace

Tokyo: Japanese Defense Minister Minoru Kihara told reporters that the Russian II-38 plane breached Japan's airspace above Rebun Island, just off the coast of the country's northernmost main island of Hokkaido, for up to a minute in three instances, during its five-hour flight in the area. It came a day after a joint fleet of Chinese and Russian warships sailed around Japanese northern coasts. Kihara said the airspace violation could be related to a joint military exercise that Russia and China announced earlier this month. Japan scrambled an undisclosed number of F-15 and F-35 fighter jets, which used flares for the first time after the Russian aircraft apparently ignored their warnings, Kihara said.

Johannesburg, Sept 23: The head of South Africa's flagship Black economic empowerment programme plans to introduce additional incentives and potential fines to improve corporate participation and curb exploitation of the system meant to tackle the country's gross inequality, he said.

The African National Congress, which had ruled unchallenged for 30 years until it lost its parliamentary majority in May elections, is under intense pressure to improve the lives of Black people left disadvantaged by decades of white minority rule.

The empowerment law enacted in 2003 created a scorecard system that encourages companies to hire and promote Black people by offering them tax breaks and access to government contracts.

Two decades later, unemployment is five times higher for Black people than for white people and income inequality is the worst in the world, according to the World Bank, and critics say the empowerment policy has not worked.

"There's no society that can be viable with (this) level of inequality," Tshediso Matona, head of the Broad-based Black



Economic Empowerment Commission told Reuters.

Under the voluntary programme, companies earn points in categories such as Black ownership, management control and skills development.

However, Matona says some companies inflate their scores by falsely listing Black people as managers, a practice commonly known in South Africa as "fronting", a crime under the law. The commission, which refers cases of infringement to state prosecutors, has received 1,348 complaints of fronting since 2017, said Matona. He

added, without saying how many cases had been sent to trial, that no one had yet been convicted of fronting largely because the criminal justice system was "still figuring out how to work with the **B-BBEE** regulation".

Listed companies are required to disclose their Black empowerment status in annual reports, but fewer and fewer are doing so. In 2022, only 141 of about 400 listed companies submitted a report.

Matona said he hoped to enhance company incentives for compliance while "naming and shaming" and possibly fining those which fail to submit the reports. President Cyril Ramaphosa has said he wants to focus on showing companies the advantages of Black empowerment, but that if they refuse to comply then penalties would be needed.

Rallying for the third day running, the 30-share BSE Sensex jumped 384.30 points, or 0.45 per cent, to settle at an all-time high of 84,928.61. During the day, it soared 436.22 points, or 0.51 per cent, to hit a fresh lifetime intraday peak of 84,980.53.

The NSE Nifty rose 148.10 points, or 0.57 per cent, to close at a record peak of 25,939.05. During the day, it zoomed 165.05 points, or 0.63 per cent, to reach a new intra-day all-time high of 25,956.

Unemployment rate stays unchanged in July '23 to June '24

New Delhi, Sept 23: Unemployment rate for persons aged 15 years and above has remained unchanged at 3.2 per cent in July 2023 to June 2024, according to the labour force survey annual report released Monday.

The unemployment rate (UR) is defined as the percentage of persons unemployed among the persons in the labour force.

The report stated that while the UR for male has shown a marginal decline from 3.3 per cent during July 2022 - June 2023 to 3.2 per per cent during July 2023 – June 2024, among female it has increased from 2.9 per cent to 3.2 per cent during the same time span



Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR) in usual status for persons of age 15 years and above was 60.1 per cent during July 2023 - June 2024 higher than 57.9 per cent in the previous year.

The same for male and female was 78.8 per cent and 41.7 per cent, respectively.

LFPR is defined as the percentage of persons in labour force (i.e. working or seeking or available for work) in the population

LFPR for female of age 15 years above in usual status has increased from 37.0 per cent during July 2022 - June 2023 to 41.7 per cent during July 2023 -June 2024.

For male of the same age group LFPR in usual status increased from 78.5 per cent to 78.8 per cent during the same time span. Worker Population Ratio (WPR) in usual status was 58.2 per cent during July 2023 – June 2024 up from 56.0 per cent in the year ago. The same for male and female was 76.3 per cent and 40.3 per cent respectively.

The WPR in usual status among female of age 15 years and above has shown an increase from 35.9 per cent during July 2022 - June 2023 to 40.3 per cent during July 2023 – June 2024.

Mumbai: The rupee pared its early gains to close lower by 2 paise at 83.54 against the US currency Monday, snapping its six-day gaining streak due to a strengthening dollar in overseas markets and an uptick in crude oil prices. A decline in India's Services PMI also affected the investor sentiment while gains in domestic equity markets capped losses in the local unit, forex traders said. Earlier in the day, the rupee opened at 83.44 against the greenback, 8 paise higher than its previous close. However, it gave up gains during the day to finally settle at 83.54 against the US dollar, 2 paisa lower than its previous close. The rupee had closed at 83.52 Friday. "We expect the rupee to trade with a slight positive bias on positive global equities and fresh FII inflows. However, a recovery in the greenback and elevated crude oil prices may cap sharp upside," Anuj Choudhary, Research Analyst at Sharekhan by BNP Paribas, said. The dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was up 0.34 per cent at 101.06.

New Delhi, Sept 23: More than 91 per cent, or 73 lakh, individual traders lost money in the Futures & Option (F&O) segment in FY24 with an average net loss of ₹1.2 lakh per person, a study conducted by markets regulator Sebi revealed Monday.

Further, 93 per cent of over 1 crore individual F&O traders incurred average losses of about ₹2 lakh per trader (inclusive of transaction costs) during the three years from FY22 to FY24. The aggregate losses of such traders exceeded ₹1.8 lakh crore during the period.

In FY24 alone, individuals incurred about ₹75,000 crore in net losses, it added

The Sebi study found the top 3.5 per cent of loss makers about 4 lakh traders -- faced an average loss of ₹28 lakh per person over the same period, inclusive of transaction costs.

On the other hand, only 7.2 per cent of individual F&O traders made a profit over the period of three years and only 1 per cent of individual traders managed to earn profits exceeding ₹1



lakh, after adjusting for transaction costs

Moreover, the number of retail traders. or individual traders. has almost doubled in two years to about 96 lakh in FY24 from about 51 lakh in FY22.

Although such investors contributed about 30 per cent in the total turnover in FY24, they are a clear majority in number terms, as 99.8 per cent of total traders in the equity F&O segment are individuals

While individuals made losses in F&O, the FPIs and proprietary traders earned profits. The proprietary traders earned about ₹33,000 crore of gross profits in F&O segment in FY24, followed by FPIs who earned about ₹ 28,000 crore in gross profits. Against this, individuals and others incurred losses of over ₹61,000 crore in FY24 (before accounting for transaction costs)

In terms of demography, the proportion of young traders - less than 30 years of age -- has significantly increased trading in the segment to 43 per cent in FY24 from 31 per cent in FY23. Nearly 93 per cent of these young traders incurred losses in F&O in FY24, higher than the average lossmakers of 91.1 per cent in FY24.

Over 75 per cent of individual F&O traders (65.4 lakh traders) in FY24 had declared annual income of less than ₹5 lakh. The proportion of low-income traders (annual income less ₹5 lakh) has increased from 71 per cent in FY22 to 76 per cent in FY24.

The proportion of female traders participating in F&O has decreased from 14.9 per cent in FY22 to 13.7 per cent in FY24. Compared to male traders, less proportion of female traders incurred losses.

While 91.9 per cent of male traders incurred losses in FY24, 86.3 per cent percentage of female traders made losses in F&O.

In terms of geography, individuals from Beyond Top 30 (B30) cities made up over 72 per cent of the total F&O trader base in FY24, a higher proportion compared to mutual fund investors, 62 per cent of whom are from B30 cities.

On an average, individual traders spent ₹26,000 per person on F&O transaction costs in FY24 and over the three-year period from FY22 to FY24, individuals collectively spent about ₹50,000 crore on transaction costs, with 51 per cent of these costs being brokerage fees and 20 per cent being exchange fees.

New Delhi, Sept 23: India's finished steel imports from China hit a seven-year high during the first five months of the 2024/25 financial year, provisional government data reviewed by Reuters showed.

India's overall finished steel imports also reached a six-vear high at 3.7 million metric tonne in the April-August period of this year, and the country was a net importer.

The world's second-biggest crude steel producer has been consuming the alloy at a faster pace with robust demand from the infrastructure and automotive sectors.

India shipped 1.1 million tonne of the alloy from China in the April-August period, up 31.7% year-on-year, the data showed.

China was the largest exporter of finished steel to India during this period, followed by South Korea and Japan, primarily shipping stainless steel, hot-rolled coil steel, galvanised sheets, and plates

India's federal steel ministry is discussing various trade measures against imports in response to calls from Indian mills.



India's imports of finished steel from Russia during the April-August period also hit a sixyear high, the data showed.

Russia, whose exports of finished steel at around 54,000 tonne, more than doubled from a year ago, was also the fifth-largest exporter of finished steel to India during the period.

Domestic steel prices fell in August, India's steel ministry noted in its report.

"Indian domestic rebar prices fell during the month under review reflecting the ongoing challenges in the market which in- \rightarrow cluded supply-demand mismatch and falling offers," it said.

However, for April-August, domestic demand was robust, as finished steel consumption touched a seven-year high at 60.3 million -(metric tonne, up 13.8% from a year ago.

This phenomenal performance helped the team clinch gold as India scored a dominating 21 points out of a possible 22, winning 10 and drawing just one match against last Olympiad winners Uzbekistan.

"It was a very nice experience for me personally and for the team...this was basically a dream (come true)," Gukesh said in the final press conference of the Olympiad. The women too won gold and both the teams were seen jumping in joy at the podium.

Another key contributor to the men's success was Arjun Erigaisi, who scored 10 points playing all the 11 games in the event. He has now elevated himself to number three in live world
