Angul, Sept 27: Two persons court in Angul district Friday for killing a couple and their minor son during a robbery attempt.

The convicts, Prakash Behera and Nanda Kishore Sethi, entered the house of Biranchi Nayak in Gambharimaliha in Kishore Nagar police station area October 9, 2017, for robbery. The duo killed Nayak, his wife Tarini and four-year-old son Naba, and dumped their bodies in different places, according to the prosecution. The convicts were arrested within three days of the incident and confessed to the crime, the prosecution said.

Additional district sessions judge, Athmallik, sentenced Behera and Sethi to death.

According to the prosecution, Nayak had borrowed ₹1.5 lakh from a self-help group for some purposes before the incident.

of police station: CM Recounting the incident that occurred barely a month before he became CM, Majhi emphasised that police should treat citizens properly Bhubaneswar, Sept 27: Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi Friday recounted an incident from

the past where an inspector asked him to 'get out' of a police station. Majhi made the remark after

inaugurating the two-day col-lectors' conference here at Lok Seva Bhawan.

Reflecting on his experience that took place barely a month before he became the CM, Majhi said residents of Raisuan and Gopinathpur panchayats in Keonihar constituency had staged a protest over drinking water crisis by blocking NH-20 May 2, when the simultaneous polls in Odisha were underway.

Majhi assured them he would raise their concerns with the executive engineer of the department. However, when the then inspector in-charge, Trinath Sethi, invited the protesters to the police station, he questioned Majhi's presence there, disregarding his role as an MLA.

"The inspector questioned my

presence at the police station, stating the Model Code of Conduct was in effect, and told me to 'get out' or he would arrest me," Majhi said. "Can't an MLA, who is also a

candidate, visit the police station with people's problems?" Majhi questioned.

Feeling humiliated, Majhi staged a sit-in outside the police station demanding accountability for the inspector's actions.

Thanks to Lord Jagannath's blessings, I became the CM. I could only imagine the inspector's situation afterward. I forgave him, believing he acted

under pressure," Majhi remarked, emphasising that police stations should treat citizens properly. He said when people come to file complaints, they should be taken seriously and directed senior officials to look into it.

Majhi cited an example involving President Droupadi Murmu, who faced disrespect from a district collector while serving as a minister two decades ago during a meeting in Keonjhar.

He urged officials to change these practices and foster a culture of respect and accountability within government institutions.



Bhadrak tense over social media post

Bhadrak, Sept 27: The district administration here issued prohibitory order under Section of 163 of BNS for an indefinite period in view of the prevailing law and order situation at Santhia following an offensive post on social media, Friday.

Seven platoons of police force have been deployed on the spot.

According to reports, a youth made the derogatory post on Instagram Thursday. In protest against this,

some people from the minority community lodged a complaint at Puruna Bazaar police station and demanded immediate arrest of the youth. Police assured them to arrest the accused within two days. However, when the vouth again posted some offensive message on social media Friday afternoon, hundreds of youths from the minority community marched towards Bhadrak city.

They were stopped near Santhia bridge by Bhadrak Tehsildar Priyadarshi Sangram Keshari Khuntia, Town DSP Ansuman Dwivedi, and Town PS IIC Ajay Sudharsan Bage. Demanding immediate arrest of the youth, they staged a road blockade near the Santhia

bridge by burning tyres on the road. Following an argument with police a scuffle broke out. The agitators pelted stones at the police in which Town PS ASI Rajen Murmu suffered serious

injuries on head. Several other police personnel were injured in the stone pelting. DSP Dwivedi was also attacked and injured. The Tehsildar's vehicle was also damaged in the stone

Trump's new biz: \$100,000 watches

Washington, Sept 27: He's sold Bibles, sneakers, photo books and cryptocurrency during his third campaign for president. Now, Donald Trump is launching a new business venture: diamond-encrusted watches.

The Republican presidential candidate unveiled the 'Official Trump Watch Collection' Thursday. The most expensive, listed as including 122 diamonds on its bezel and available in three 18-karat gold styles, costs USD 100,000. Another "Fight Fight" model is listed at USD 499.

Trump has hawked a series of branded products since he launched his 2024 White House campaign, following his long tradition of melding his political and business interests. Thursday's launch, coming 40 days before Election Day, could open him up to criticism about monetising his campaign, particularly as he makes an argument that Vice President Kamala Harris is out of





While websites for the various products note that proceeds from their sales do not directly benefit Trump or his campaign, they also note that each is subject to a 'paid license agreement.'

That's the same mechanism that allowed Trump, well before he entered politics, to profit for years from sales of everything from water, vodka and steaks.

Earlier this week, he announced the sale of USD 100 silver coins bearing his face. In March, ahead of Easter, Trump released a video on Truth Social urging his supporters

to spend USD 59.99 for a 'God Bless the USA Bible,' inspired by country singer Lee Greenwood's patriotic ballad. Trump takes the stage to the song at each of his rallies and has appeared with Greenwood at

In February, he hawked new Trump-branded sneakers at 'Sneaker Con,' a gathering that bills itself as the 'The Greatest Sneaker Show on

The shoes, shiny gold high tops with an American flag detail on the back, are being sold as 'Never Surrender High-Tops' for USD 399 on a new website that also sells other Trump-branded shoes and 'Victory47' cologne and perfume for USD 99 a bottle.

Trump has also dabbled in NFTs, or nonfungible tokens, and last year reported earning between USD 100,000 and USD one million from a series of digital trading cards that portrayed him in cartoon-like images including as an astronaut, a cowboy and a superhero.




HARRY POTTER ACTRESS MAGGIE SMITH DIES

Bangalore/Bhubaneswar, Sept **27:** The gruesome killing of a 29-year-old woman, whose dismembered body was found in the fridge of her house here, was allegedly due to differences over the issue of marriage between her and the accused, Bangalore police commissioner B Dayananda said Friday.

The accused Mukti Ranjan Ray allegedly ended his life by suicide at his native village in Bhadrak district September 25.

The maggot-infested body of Mahalakshmi, chopped into 59 pieces and stuffed into the fridge, was found by her mother and elder sister at her Vyalikaval home here September 21.

"Regarding the murder case of a woman registered in Vyalikaval police station September 21, based on a complaint of her mother...we have gone to other states in search of the prime suspect, it came across that he has committed suicide in Dhusuri police station limits in Bhadrak district of Odisha. Our officials and personnel have gone there and we are gathering information," Dayananda said.

Speaking to reporters here, he said the accused has also written a death note in which he has mentioned about the murder and has confessed about his

"We will get all that information from there and further crime and the reasons behind it. before committing suicide.

"He stayed with me for 10 to 12 days in my mess at Berhampur before committing suicide. He had also told me about committing the crime. He said that Mahalaxmi was blackmailing him constantly and also extracted large amounts of money and gold ornaments from him," Muktiranjan's younger brother reportedly said.

He added that the family members were angry with him as he didn't send any money back home.

"My brother also told me that he had squandered a minimum of ₹7 to 8 lakh after being blackmailed by Mahalaxmi. She had taken a gold chain and one of the three rings he bought for his brothers," he said.

Quoting his conversation with Muktiranjan, his brother said that on the day of the crime the former had gone to meet Mahalaxmi after she called him over the phone." She threatened to kill Muktiranjan and his brother. This angered Muktiranjan who, in a fit of rage, strangulated her to death,

According to police sources, Mahalakshmi, who had separated from her estranged husband, had been living separately in Vyalikaval since October 2023.

They said she and Ray were colleagues at a clothing outlet and had known to each other for

IIT-Bhub study reveals impact of ocean water mixing on climate

Bhubaneswar, Sept 27: A new study has revealed the importance of mixing Atlantic and Arctic waters in sustaining the Atlantic Meridional Overturning Circulation (AMOC), a key driver in regulating Earth's climate.

The research, conducted by an international team from IIT Bhubaneswar, University of Southampton (UK), National Oceanography Centre (UK), and Stockholm University (Sweden), explores the mechanisms behind AMOC formation.

The AMOC functions like a vast ocean conveyor belt, transporting warm tropical water northward and cold water southward, distributing heat

It plays a vital role in keeping northern Europe, including the UK, relatively mild for its latitude.

Communications', the study found that the AMOC's lower limb consists of 72 per cent Atlantic and 28 per cent Arctic "As warm water reaches cooler

regions of the North Atlantic, it loses heat, becomes denser, and sinks," explains Dipanjan Dey of IIT Bhubaneswar, lead author of the study.

"We discovered that much of this dense water travels northward, mixing with colder Arctic waters before flowing southward, bolstering the AMOC's strength," he said.

The study estimates that Atlantic-Arctic water mixing accounts for 33 per cent of the transformation of warm water into denser, colder water, with the remaining 67 per cent driven by ocean-atmosphere interactions.

This challenges prior aspatterns. sumptions that focused primarily on heat loss, underestimat-



ing the impact of water mixing.

As the planet warms, models suggest that the AMOC may weaken, potentially causing significant shifts in global climate

These findings offer new insight into how Atlantic-Arctic water mixing affects climate dynamics. "The study also has relevance

September, contributes approximately 80 per cent of the country's annual rainfall. Any variations in the timing or distribution of this rainfall can have far-reaching impacts on agriculture, the economy, and public health, both physically and mentally," he explains.

For over 300 years, the monsoon was believed to result from large-scale land-sea breezes driven by temperature differences.

However, in the 1980s, the introduction of satellite imagery revealed that the cloud patterns over India closely resembled the Inter-tropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ), a low-pressure zone near the equator.

This discovery redefined the monsoon as a seasonal migration of the ITCZ from the ocean toward land, rather than a simple land-sea breeze.

'The ITCZ generally stays just north of the equator, and research indicates that the northward flow of warm water in the Atlantic Meridional Overturning Circulation (AMOC) plays a critical role in maintaining this position." Dev claimed.

However, with a warming climate, the AMOC is predicted to slow, reducing the northward movement of warm water and



Padmapur, Sept 27: Water of Vamshadhara river flowing through Rayagada district has failed to be of any benefit for the residents. Despite the state government making plans at various points of time in the last five decades to use the water, it has failed to proceed further in this regard.

Sources said the then state government had planned to construct a barrage on the river at Panidangar in Gunupur sub-division in 1960 as per an agreement signed with the Andhra Pradesh government. However, the plan failed to make any headway and has been lying in cold storage for the last 50 years.

Similarly, another plan for linking of Vamshadhara river with Rushikulya river in 2005 also failed to make any progress. This only highlights the inefficiency of the previous state governments, it is alleged.

Former chief minister Giridhar Gamang had then said that Panidangar project will benefit thousands of farmers and also help in controlling floods if it is implemented near Gudari

on the upstream of the river. Later, the BJD government ruled the state for 25 years, but the project did not see light of the day.

Reports said the Vamshadhara river flows through Odisha and neighbouring Andhra Pradesh. The then Andhra government had first planned to construct a barrage at Gota near Hiramandal in 1962. However, both the states were at loggerheads after the then Biju Patnaik-led government opposed the project proposed by the neighbouring state.

The then Andhra chief min-

In their presence, the police conducted an inquest and sent the body for autopsy, as informed by Sadar SDPO Shubhranshu Parida.

Preliminary investigation suggests that the girl student may have been under some kind of mental stress, which could have pushed her to take the extreme step.

However, the details written in the suicide note have not yet been made public. The police have launched an investigation and are also tracking the calls that she received on her mobile phone the previous night. The exact reason behind the student's suicide is still unknown.

Flood Fallout

n a surprising move. West Bengal's Power Secretary, Santanu Basu, has stepped down from his role on the Damodar Valley Corporation (DVC) Board. His resignation, which he announced via email, seems to be tied to what he referred to as the "uncontrolled release of water" from DVC's dam systems. This water release led to severe flooding in several parts of West Bengal, causing extensive damage and hardship for thousands of people. Basu made it clear that this was the reason for his exit, underscoring the frustration with how the situation was

Interestingly, this isn't an isolated incident. The Chief Engineer of West Bengal's Irrigation and Waterways department also resigned, apparently in protest against decisions made by the Damodar Valley Reservoir Regulation Committee. This raises questions about deeper issues at play. Was this simply a response to the flood management, or is there a larger governance or communication breakdown between the

The fallout of this event could be significant. Basu's resignation signals that there might be serious concerns about how DVC manages water resources, and this could lead to larger discussions about accountability and oversight. It also highlights how natural resource management can have immediate and devastating consequences for local populations. When officials step down in protest, it sends a message that something isn't right. Could this trigger a larger shakeup in DVC's management practices? Watch this space for updates

Ex-babu under fire in ED probe

The recent ED raids on former IAS officer Mohinder Singh's premises highlight the deeprooted corruption within the bureaucracy and its far-reaching impact on society. Singh, once a



powerful figure in the Noida-Greater Noida Authority under the Mayawati-led BSP government, is now at the centre of a ₹426 crore scam linked to the Lotus 300 project. The recovery of ₹1 crore in cash, diamonds worth ₹12 crores, and gold jewellery valued at ₹7 crore during the raids underscores the extent of wealth amassed through ques-

Such allegations of corruption not only erode public trust but also deprive homebuyers and ordinary citizens of their hard-earned money. In this case, investors were promised homes but instead became victims of a massive fraud. The ED's investigation, triggered by Allahabad High Court's directives, has unveiled a network of builders, officials, and entities involved in siphoning off funds, all while bureaucratic figures like Singh allegedly turned a blind eye or actively participated.

This systemic failure is a stark reminder of the consequences when those entrusted with public welfare manipulate their power for personal gain. As Singh faces increasing legal trouble, with a possible ED summons and further probes, the fallout from this scam serves as a harsh lesson on the dangers of unchecked corruption in public office.

IAS officer's surprise extension sparks debate

In a surprising development, Anindita Mitra, who had already wrapped up her role as Chandigarh's Municipal Corporation Commissioner and joined her new post in Punjab, has been granted a three-month extension. But here's where things get complicated: even though the Union Government issued orders for her extension, it's not clear whether she will actually return to her old post.

Mitra, a 2007-batch IAS officer from Punjab, had already started her new role as Secretary of Cooperation in Punjab and MD of the Punjab Cooperative Bank after her three-vear deputation in Chandigarh ended.

The confusion stems from the fact that the UT Administration already relieved her from her duties, and the matter is now tangled between the Centre, the UT Administration, and the Punjab Government. There's talk that the UT Administration might request clarification from the Centre because a panel of potential replacements for the MC Commissioner position had already been sent to the ministry. It's also notable that this is probably the first time such a situation has arisen in Chandigarh.

With the uncertainty surrounding her return, it's anyone's guess how the next few months will play out. But one thing's certain—this extension has certainly shaken up the usual babu routine!



THE WORLD IS MORE COMPLICATED **THAN IT WAS A DECADE AGO, WHEN THE 2030 AGENDA FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT. WHICH SETS OUT THE 17 SDGs AND THEIR** 169 TARGETS, **WAS DRAFTED**

The just concluded **United Nations Summit** of the Future in New York, and next year's Second World Summit for Social Development, aim to "chart a path toward achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and responding to emerging challenges and opportunities." But the question of how to finance the necessary investments - particularly at a time when many countries are weighed down by debt - stalks global discussions.

The world is more complicated than it was a decade ago, when the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, which sets out the 17 SDGs and their 169 targets, was drafted. When the Agenda was approved in January 2016, we had not yet faced the COVID-19 pandemic, war had not engulfed Ukraine or Gaza, and the United States and China were not at loggerheads.

Today, the world economy is more fragmented, geopolitical tensions are higher, and multilateralism is sputtering. Moreover, the number of people living in poverty has increased.

Meanwhile, many countries debt burdens have become less manageable, after governments were forced to increase public spending in response to the pandemic and the subsequent costof-living crisis. Today, only 27 developing countries–18% of the total - are not burdened with excessive debt. The rest are struggling with debt overhang, which undermines economic growth and development, and raises the risk of an eventual default. The International Monetary Fund estimates the debt-burden threshold for low-income

countries is between 35% and 70% of GDP, after which debt can become unmanageable.

When debt-servicing costs are high, countries often end up making big sacrifices to stay solvent. For example, they might tap foreign-exchange reserves, thereby weakening their ability to respond to future crises. or reallocate resources from critical areas - such as education, health, and social protection - to keep up with their payments. In low-income countries, interest payments are now 2.3 times larger than spending on social assistance, and 1.4 times larger than domestic health expenditures, on average. They amount to 60% of spending on education.

A country that is reducing social spending to service its debts – despite the increase in poverty that will inevitably follow – is unlikely to be able to make long-term investments in sustainable development. And yet, as the UN and other multilateral organizations have made clear, a significant increase in financing, at both the national and international levels, is a prerequisite for achieving the SDGs by the 2030 deadline.

Thus, it is urgent to offer relief to countries that face debt distress. Governments should not have to choose between servicing their debts and taking care of their citizens, and today's debts should not act as a drag on the future. Countries' ability to manage their debt should be assessed against a broader range of indicators – human, social, and environmental, not just financial. Where debt relief, debt restructuring, or both is in order, it must be implemented quickly and efficiently as part of a comprehensive debt-management strategy, possibly making use of instruments like debt-for-climate swaps, which commit the debtor government to invest the savings from debt relief in climate adaptation or mitigation.

But debt relief alone is not enough. If developing countries are to achieve the SDGs, they will need new sources of funding. So far, multilateral

development banks have taken the lead on this front. As a recent OECD report shows, in 2012-20, outflows from the World Bank Group increased by 72%, and outflows from other MDBs soared by 155% In 2021-22, total MDB outflows rose by another 22%.

This trend is set to continue. Earlier this year, ten MDBs estimated that they could collectively expand their lending headroom by an additional \$300-400 billion over the next decade. But this would mean an increase of just \$40 billion more per year -far less than the \$260 billion per year that the G20 Independent Expert Group estimates will be needed to meet the SDGs.

To address the sustainabledevelopment imperative, the MDBs will have to persuade their member states to increase their own contributions by amounts proportionate to the scale of the challenges ahead. Other multilateral organizations, such as the UN, as well as non-governmental donors and the private sector, must also

ramp up their support. Multilateral efforts should aim both to tackle existing debt and to expand access to affordable finance in the future, using a variety of instruments, including concessional loans, green and blue bonds, and grants. And policy measures must be coordinated at the international level. Otherwise, we stand little chance of achieving the SDGs by the 2030 deadline, with devastating consequences for people and the planet.

Culture of prioritising profits over people

THE RATE OF **STUDENT SUICIDES IN INDIA HAS SURPASSED THE POPULATION GROWTH RATE AND OVERALL SUICIDE TRENDS**

The heartbreaking suicide of Anna Sebastian—a bright young 26-year-old Chartered Accountant of Ernst & Young in Pune —serves as a sordid reminder of the human costs behind the exaltation of

Anna's promising life came to an abrupt end four months into her first job.

Her story reflects a dark and insensitive corporate world where India's young professionals have to sacrifice their leisure. pleasure, and even life to earn more and cope with the increasingly noxious and hostile work environments.

This incident has ignited a nationwide debate about the impact of lengthy work hours and high-pressure environments on employee well-being, prompting a government investigation into workplace culture and health impacts.

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman faced backlash for emphasising stress management, elevating inner strength (Atmashakti), and spirituality to cope with stress due to overwork. What Sitharaman said is correct, as present youths are unable to cope with the grim reality of life. But she did not talk about the noxious work culture spurred by corporate greed with a concomitant unethical, immoral, and exploitative approach to earn profit.

This tragedy also underscores the intense, rapacious corporate culture faced by employees, characterised by stringent deadlines,

high performance expectations, and a perpetual push for productivity. It also portrays the corporate culture of prioritising profits over people, exhaustion over duty work; cruelty over humanity; greed over necessaries; insensitivity over sensitivity, and egotism over dignity.

The real question today is why, in a land of spiritualism like India, suicides have been escalating

Incidents of student suicides in India have grown at an alarming annual rate, surpassing the population growth rate and overall suicide trends. In addition to mental illnesses

like anxiety, depression, economic stress, unemployment, financial instability, debt burden, family conflicts, and nuptial discord all leading to hopelessness and desolation and causing suicide. People are also committing suicide due to loneliness, especially the inability to share their own emotions.

However, India's relentlessly noxious work culture, where fatigue is worn like a badge of honour, is responsible for mental illness and suicide among young professionals.

The ILO limits working hours to eight hours a day and 48 hours a week to protect the mental and physical health of workers, promote gender equality in the workplace, and increase productivity. Indian labour laws prescribe a 48-hour workweek for emplovees.

What is disgusting is that salaried corporate employees work longer hours than their casual peers. For a typical corporate worker, the lengthy hours translate to about nine hours of work per day over a five-day work week, or roughly eight hours if their work week extends to six days. A Deloitte study conducted

during the second wave of the pandemic revealed that India ranked highest among 18 countries in terms of workplace anxiety. The study also found that 80 percent of the Indian workforce reported mental health issues in the previous year, while 47 percent of the professionals surveved said that workplace-related stress was the biggest fac-

The human cost of this inaction is far too high, and the burden is falling disproportionately on the country's younger workforce. These findings raise serious concerns regarding work life balance, mental health, and conducive labour policies in India. The need for creating sustainable work environments that foster both health and productivity is becoming increasingly critical.

tor affecting their mental health

Actually, rhetoric glorifying long hours of work is actually counterproductive. It ignores ILO findings too. In 2012, the ILO's review pointed out that extended hours often decreased performance

Instead, work-life balance is increasingly recognised as a key driver of employee engagement and productivity.

The academic research shows

that a healthy work-life balance is far more effective for longterm efficiency. According to Jennifer Moss, author of The Burnout Epidemic, there is ample evidence to show that when employees have greater control over their schedules and adequate rest, they are more engaged in their work and also more efficient. Balancing work and life reduces burnout.

American Reformed theologian, pastor, and author Dale Partridge, in his book titled People Over Profit, emphasises empowering employees to take ownership of their work. When employees feel trusted and valued, they are more likely to be motivated, innovative, and committed to the organisation's success. He advocates for businesses to adopt sustainable and ethical practices that benefit society and the environment.

By investing in people and building strong relationships, businesses can achieve lasting success that goes beyond immediate financial gains.

"People Over Profit" serves as a powerful reminder that prioritising people—not just profits-can lead to more meaningful and sustainable success in business. Dale Partridge's insights encourage leaders to rethink their strategies and focus on creating value for all stakeholders, ultimately fostering a culture of purpose and connection.

Lucknow, Sept 27: The controversy over the alleged adulteration of Tirupati Temple laddus has sparked reactions from Ayodhya, Prayagraj, and Mathura in Uttar Pradesh, with calls for reform in the preparation and distribution of 'prasad'. In Ayodhya, the chief priest of

the Ram Janmabhoomi Temple, Satyendra Das, demanded a "complete ban" on prasad prepared by external agencies. He expressed concerns over the

purity of ghee used in temple offerings, urging that "all prasad should be prepared under the supervision of temple priests"

"The controversy over the alleged use of fat and meat in Tirupati Balaji's prasad is escalating across the country," Das noted, emphasising the need for stringent inspections of the quality of oil and ghee sold nationwide. He alleged that there was an international conspiracy to desecrate temples by mixing inappropriate substances in offerings.

In Mathura, the Dharma Raksha Sangh announced its decision to revert to the "ancient style" of 'prasadam' recipes, replacing commercially produced sweets with offerings made from fruits, flowers and other natural ingredients

Saurabh Gaur, the national president of the Sangh, stressed the need for significant reforms in the prasadam system, saying, "A consensus had been reached among religious leaders and organisations to return to traditional practices of offering

Villagers in UP's Budaun panic over suspected footprints of leopard

Budaun, (UP), Sept 27: The Forest department in Uttar Pradesh's Budaun district has stepped up vigil after animal footprints, suspectedly of leopard or wolf, were reported in a few villages.

However, forest officials said the footprints belong to a canine species. "The tracks found could be of a dog, jackal or another canine species. There is no evidence of a tiger (leopard) in the area, as the prints belong to the dog family," Forest Ranger Akanksha Gupta said.

Locals in Budaun claimed that the prints indicate the presence of a leopard or wolf, amid reports of leopard and wolf sightings in neighbouring Bahraich district The Forest department received calls from Yaad Ram and Mahipal Singh of Nurpur village regarding the sighting of footprints. Gupta said. Villagers of Nurpur, in the Kadarchaak region of Budaun, claimed that they saw the "paw prints" in their fields, causing widespread panic about a possible leopard sighting.

A team from the Forest department went to inspect the area after they received information. Ranger Gupta, along with her team, examined the footprints and collected samples for further analysis. She urged the villagers to remain vigilant but emphasised that there is no need for alarm regarding leopards or wolves, as the prints indicate a dog or jackal instead.

Divisional Forest Officer Pradeep Verma also visited the area following the reports.

He said the footprints belong to the dog family and are likely of jackals, noting that the district does not have a wolf population. Meanwhile, four people, including three children, were injured in two leopard and two suspected jackle or dog attacks across different areas of the Katarniaghat Wildlife Sanctuary and Bahraich forest division, between Thursday evening and late night, officials said.

New Delhi, Sept 27: The government has approved an initiative aimed at conserving freshwater turtles and gharials in Ganga, officials said Friday.

According to officials, the approval was granted for the freshwater turtle and gharial conservation breeding programme at the Kukrail Gharial Rehabilitation Center in Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh.

Operated under the Namami Gange Mission-II, the programme will receive ₹2 crore to help restore the endangered species in the Ganga river and



its tributaries

The development came during the 57th Executive Committee meeting of the National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG) Friday, chaired by DG Rajeev Kumar Mittal, where projects totalling ₹1,062 crore were approved, the officials said.

The projects are focused on conserving the Ganga river and preparations for Mahakumbh 2025, they said.

Key among the approvals is a 350-crore project in Katihar, Bihar, aimed at improving the city's

drainage and sewage systems.

This includes the construc plants (STPs) with a combined capacity of 55.5 million litres per day (MLD) and the interception of nine drains, the offi cial said.

In Aligarh, Uttar Pradesh, a ₹488-crore project was approved to build two STPs with a total capacity of 113 MLD, alongside a septage co-treatment facility.

The project, which will intercept and divert sewage, is expected to be completed within two

vears of operation and maintenance, the officials said.

In Supaul, Bihar, a project costing ₹76.69-crore has been approved to construct three STPs and manage six major, while in Uttarakhand, a ₹2.5-crore initiative will boost septage treatment at several STPs in Haridwar, Rishikesh, Srinagar, and Devprayag, they said.

The committee also approved ₹30 crore for IEC (information, education, and communication) activities during Mahakumbh 2025, which will involve decorating the mela area with mural art and organising a 45-day exhibition to showcase achievements under the Namami Gange programme

Additionally, a project for online continuous monitoring of STPs in Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal was approved for ₹33 crore, and a ₹13-crore 'Smart Laboratory for Clean River' project, in collaboration with IIT-BHU and Denmark, will support small river conservation efforts.

Cruiser boat reaches -Himachal's Bilaspur

The Tourism department plans to start operating Shikara rides, cruise floating restaurants, houseboats, and soft watersports activities by June next year.

Sukhu said the commencement of adventure sports activities in Pong Dam aims to attract more tourists to the Kangra district.

Meanwhile, Commissioner of Bilaspur Abid Hussain Sadiq said motorboats, jet skis and rescue boats have already arrived in Bilaspur and the cruiser boat would also be ready soon.

THRISSUR ATM HEIST

1suspect killed, six detained

Thrissur/Namakkal, Sept 27: Hours after a brazen heist in Kerala's Thrissur district, where a gang made off with approximately ₹70 lakh from three SBI ATMs, Tamil Nadu police engaged in a dramatic chase that ended with the gunning down of one suspect and the detention of six others.

The incident unfolded Friday as the gang of men from Haryana attempted to escape in their container truck, ramming into several cars and two-wheelers at Kumarapalayam in Namakkal district of Tamil Nadu.

Adding more intrigue to the brazen act, the gang had loaded the car used in the Kerala heist into a container after the robbery, in a bid to mislead the police investigating the case. The car used in the robbery was confiscated along with the container truck, according to Salem Range DIGES Uma. One of the suspects was killed and another injured when police opened fire in self-defence. Two police officials were also injured when the container driver and his associate attacked them in a bid to flee, and they have been admitted to a government hospital for treatment, she said.

"They targeted the ATM of a nationalised bank (in Thrissur). As per their modus operandi, the members split into two groups and travelled separately in a container and a car from Haryana to stage the heist," the DIG told reporters at Namakkal. All the members hailed from Haryana, she said, and added the Namakkal district police arrested two persons from Haryana in a similar heist in the district recently.

Following information from the Thrissur police, the Namakkal Superintendent of Police, S Raiesh Kannan, and other officials organised a vehicle check to identify the car used in the heist.

While Siddaramaiah is accused number one (A1) in the case, his wife B M Parvathi (A2), brother-in-law Mallikarjuna Swamy (A3), Devaraju (Å4) -from whom Mallikarjuna Swamy purchased land and gifted it to Parvathi -- and others are named in the FIR registered by Lokayukta police in Mysuru.

The order of the Special Court Judge, Santhosh Gajanan Bhat, came a day after the High Court upheld the sanction granted by the Governor Thaawarchand Gehlot to conduct an investigation against Siddaramaiah on the allegations of illegalities in the allotment of 14 sites to his wife by the MUDA.



Professional thief's response, says BJP



Kolkata, Sept 27: A designated CBI court, denying bail to former RG Kar Medical College and Hospital principal Sandip Ghosh, has observed that the nature and gravity of the accusation against him is grave and it can attract capital punishment if proved.


The CBI had arrested Ghosh and former officer in-charge of Tala police station, Abhijit Mondal, for alleged tampering of evidence and delay in filing of FIR in the rape and murder of a doctor at the state-run hospital August 9.

The court in its order, dictated September 25, said it appears from the case diary that the process of investigation by the central probe agency is in full swing.

Denying the bail prayer of Ghosh, Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate S Dey observed that the nature and gravity of the accusation is grave and if proved, it may attract capital punishment, which is handed in the rarest of rare cases. The judge said the court is of the opinion that "it would be injustice flouting the principle of equity to release the

A specialised team of the agency conducted the 3D mapping August 18 using advanced laser scanning technology to capture a comprehensive view of the crime scene.

UP SHOCKER Student 'sacrificed' for school's success

Agra, Sept 27: An 11-year-old child was killed as part of an alleged sacrificial ritual performed by the owners of his school in Uttar Pradesh's Hathras to make it more prosperous, police said Friday.

Besides the owner and director of the school, the principal and two ARRESTED FOR THEIR teachers were also LLEGED INVOLVEMENT II arrested for their alleged involvement in the incident, they said. Police said the postmortem report of the class two student revealed that he was strangled.

DL Public School owner Jasodhan Singh, who is said to believe in 'tantrik rituals', asked his son Dinesh Baghel, the director of the school, to sacrifice a child for the prosperity of the school and his family. Principal Laxman Singh and two teachers -- Ramprakash Solanki and Veerpal Singh -- have also been held by police.

Police has lodged an FIR against them under the section 103 (1) of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita 2023, against five of them and they have been sent to jail. "The student has been identified as Kritarth (11) studying in class second of the DL Public school," Ashok Kumar Singh,

Police (ASP), Hathras told PTI. The student was abducted from the school's hostel September 23 by teacher Ramprakash Solanki, Dinesh Baghel and school owner

They took the student to a secluded place for the sacrifice but the student woke up and began crying, the officer said. "After that he was strangulated. Another

teacher Veerpal Singh and school principal Laxman Singh were also present at the spot and were guarding the place," he said.

Police further said that the accused told the child's parents that Kritarth was not well as was being taken to a hospital in Baghel's car. Family members of the child, however, stopped the car and informed police about Kritarth's death, police said.

"Later, postmortem report showed that he died due to strangulation. In the police investigation, the accused informed police that the student was killed for 'sacrifice' for the prosperity of school and the owner's family," the ASP said.

CPI (M) severs ties with MLA PV Anvar

New Delhi, Sept 27: A day after he launched a direct attack on Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan, the ruling CPI(M) in Kerala Friday severed ties with MLAPV Anvar, who had twice won the Congress stronghold of Nilambur in Malappuram district with Left support, accusing him of wielding a "political axe of the right-wing."

CPI (M) state secretary M V Govindan, at a press conference in Delhi, announced that the party was cutting all ties with Anvar, stating that the MLA had himself decided to distance from the ruling Left coalition in the state.

The party's move came just hours after Vijayan denied Anvar's accusations against the CPI(M), LDF, and himself, terming them an "attempt to malign and defame" the ruling dispensation in the state. It also came after Anvar clarified in the morning that he had never intentionally said he was leaving the LDF or the CPI(M) parliamentary party, and that any such statements by him were a "slip of the tongue." The CPI(M) veteran, however, clarified that Anvar's remarks would not affect the ongoing probes and inquiries into the various complaints and allegations he had made. He was responding to the scathing allegations by Anvar against the CPI(M) and the CM, accusing them of inaction regarding his complaints about ADGP (Law and Order) M R Ajithkumar and the CM's political secretary, P Sasi.

Stalin meets PM, seeks funds for Chennai Metro

New Delhi, Sept 27: Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin met Prime Minister Narendra Modi Friday and sought early release of pending funds for Chennai metro and integrated education initiatives, besides an intervention to protect Tamil fishermen.

The DMK president, who described the meeting as "purposeful", presented a detailed report on three main issues. "The Prime Minister listened patiently," Stalin told reporters after the meeting. The Chief Minister sought the speedy release of funds for the Chennai

metro project as ₹ 18.544 crore has already been spent so far. The state government wants to start work on the second phase of the Chennai metro and the non-disbursement of the pending dues has "caused a delay in the works, he emphasised."

About the integrated education initiative. Stalin highlighted the hold-up in the first instalment of the 60:40 Centre-State funded programme. He clarified that while Tamil Nadu has incorporated positive elements of the National Education Policy, it has not accepted the trilingual policy. "We have asked for a correction in the MoU to explicitly state that there will be no lan-



guage imposition," the Chief Minister added. While discussing the plight of Tamil fishermen facing arrest by the Sri Lankan Navy, Stalin requested Modi's

ing that 191 fishing boats and 145 fishermen have been captured. He sought a resolution of the matter at the upcoming India-Sri Lanka joint committee meeting in Colombo next month. After his meeting with Modi. Stalin said the Prime Minister has assured him of considering all three demands. Non-alcoholic fatty liver disease major concern

New Delhi, Sept 27: One to three of 10 people are being diagnosed with non-alcoholic fatty liver disease, which is rapidly emerging as a major public health concern closely linked with metabolic disorders such as obesity and diabetes, Union Health Secretary Apurva Chandra said Friday.

Chandra, who released the revised Operational Guidelines and Training Module of Non-Alcoholic Fatty Liver Disease (NAFLD), here said India has taken the lead in recognising it as a major non-communicable disease (NCD).

"NAFLD is rapidly emerging as a major public health concern, closely linked with metabolic disorders such as obesity, diabetes and cardiovascular diseases. Out of 10, one to three people can have NAFLD which highlights the impact of the disease," Chandra stated.

He highlighted that the release of revised operational guidelines and training modules reflects the importance being given by the Union Health Ministry to curb the disease.

Chandra said these documents will provide a framework for health workers at all levels, from community health workers to medical officers. He also emphasised the importance of continuum of care for people who have been diagnosed with NCDs and underlined the need for lifestyle modification for reducing the prevalence of NAFLD.

Speaking on the occasion, Punya Salila Srivastava, Officer on Special Duty, Union Health Ministry said these guidelines need to reach the grassroots level workers so that the disease is detected early and the burden of NAFLD is reduced.

She said the release of training module is a significant addition to India's efforts to build capacities amongst healthcare professionals to tackle the rising burden of NCDs in India.

Dr S K Sarin, Director, Institute of Liver and Biliary



Sciences (ILBS), said the release of the two documents is a momentous step whose results will be reflected in the next few years. He noted that many NCDs such as diabetes, heart disease and cancer are linked to liver health, underscoring the importance of maintaining a healthy liver.

NCDs are accounting for more than 66 per cent of death in the country. They are strongly associated and causally linked with major behaviour risk factors such as tobacco use (smoking and smokeless), alcohol use, poor dietary habits, insufficient physical activity and air pollution, the ministry said in a statement. NAFLD is emerging as an important cause of liver disease in India. It could be assuming a silent epidemic with community prevalence ranging from 9 per cent to 32 per cent, depending on age, gender, area of residence and socioeconomic status. the statement stated.

India contributes high numbers for NCDs globally and one of the core causes of metabolic diseases is in liver. Realising the growing burden and urgent need to address it. India became the first country to integrate the NAFLD in the National Programme for Prevention and Control of NCDs in 2021, the statement said.

Considering the recent evidence-based interventions in the field of NAFLD, there was a dire need to revise the guidelines with updated information for prevention, control and management to equip the medical care providers and help in pre-

vention and control of NAFLD. The guidelines focus on health promotion and early detection which are important for ensuring that patients with NAFLD receive timely and appropriate care. It also advocates for a multidisciplinary approach, integrating the efforts of healthcare providers from various discipline to offer a holistic care to individual affected by NAFLD, the statement said.



Azerbaijan buys **Pak fighter jets**

Islamabad: Azerbaijan has purchased multi-role JF-17 Block III fighter jets from Pakistan reportedly under a \$1.6 billion deal, a media report said Friday. "A contract for the sale of JF-17 Block-III fighter aircraft" to Azerbaijan was signed recently," the Pakistan Army said in a statement. Several delegations walked out as Netanyahu approached the lectern while supporters in the gallery cheered.

Netanyahu's office said he would cut short his trip to New York following the strike and would return to Israel Friday.



Brussels, Sept 27: Pope Francis was pressed firmly by Belgium's king and premier Friday for more concrete action to address sexual abuse by Catholic clergy, an issue once more in the spotlight as he visits.

Both King Philippe and Prime Minister Alexander De Croo raised the issue in public in unusually forceful language for a papal foreign trip, always a carefully choreographed event.

Philippe told Francis in a speech welcoming him to Belgium that it had taken the Church "far too long" to address the scandals. De Croo said it had "a long way to go" and that "words alone are not enough".

"Concrete steps must also be taken," the premier said. More than 700 complaints and

reports of abuse have been made in Belgium since 2012, according to a Church report.

The 87-year-old pontiff did not name specific cases of abuse in Belgium but said the behaviour of Catholic clergy had provided

to the church's teachings.

"I refer to the tragic instances of child abuse, which is a scourge that the church is addressing firmly and decisively by implementing a prevention programme throughout the world," the pope said.

In March, Francis expelled former bishop of Bruges Roger Vangheluwe from the priesthood. Vangheluwe had resigned in 2010 after admitting abusing a nephew, and in 2011 admitted abusing another. The statute of limitations has prevented criminal prosecution.

Francis has made addressing abuse by clergy a priority of his papacy, and created the first papal commission on the issue. He also installed a global system for Catholics to report suspicions of abuse or cover-ups by bishops. But survivors groups have questioned the effectiveness of the commission and also urged the pontiff to require all Catholic clergy to report suspicions of abuse to

Ishiba beat out Economic Security Minister Sanae Takaichi, a staunch conservative who was running to become the country's first female Prime Minister. A record nine lawmakers, including two women, ran in a vote decided by LDP members of Parliament and about 1 million dues-paying party members. 

United Nations, Sept 27: Pakistan Friday raised the issue of Jammu and Kashmir in the UN General Assembly, saying India should reverse the abrogation of Article 370 and enter into a dialogue with it for a 'peaceful" resolution of the

Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, in his address at the General Debate of the 79th session of the UN General Assembly, raked the issue of Jammu and Kashmir, as expected, making references to Article 370.

Sharif spoke at length about Kashmir saying that "similarly, like the people of Palestine, the people of Jammu and Kashmir too, have struggled for a century for their freedom and right to selfdetermination".

Referring to India's decision



to abrogate Article 370, Sharif said, "to secure durable peace, India must reverse the unilateral and illegal measures" of August 2019 and enter into a dialogue for a peaceful resolution of the Jammu and Kashmir issue in accordance with the UN Security resolutions and "wishes of the Kashmiri people"

Sharif alleged that instead of moving towards peace, India has moved away from its commitments to implement the Security Council resolutions on Jammu and Kashmir. "These resolutions mandate a plebiscite to enable the people of Jammu and Kashmir to exercise their fundamental right to self-deter-

mination," he said. India has also asked Pakistan to concentrate on addressing its internal matters rather than raising the Kashmir issue and indulging in frivolous allegations against New Delhi

ERDOGAN SKIPS KASHMIR Turkish President Recap

Tayyip Erdogan did not mention Kashmir in his address at the United Nations General Assembly this year, the first time he has skipped the issues since the abrogation of Article 370 in 2019.

The focus of his 35-minute speech this year was the humanitarian situation in Gaza, where over 40,000 people have died in Israeli attacks against Hamas

After India scrapped the special status Jammu and Kashmir enjoyed under the Constitution in 2019, Erdogan has referred to Kashmir every year in his address to world leaders at the UNGA session here, while advocating talks between New Delhi and Islamabad.

This time, September 24, Erdogan drew the international community's attention to the plight of the Palestinians in Gaza, accusing the UN of failing to stop the deaths of civilians.

"The world is bigger than five," he repeated his well-known remark, about the five permanent members of the UN Security Council. Erdogan's skipping of the Kashmir reference is being seen as an apparent shift in Turkiye's stance and comes at a time when the country is trying to become a member of the BRICS grouping to forge alliances beyond the West.

The indictment says the three men used fake email accounts to trick several campaign officials into believing they were dealing with a trusted source, and then got them to click on links that allowed the hackers to steal emails and other internal documents, such as debate preparation material and profiles of potential vice presidential candidates.

They then leaked that information to media outlets and the campaign of President Joe Biden while he was still a candidate, the indictment said.

Charges include wire fraud, identity theft and computer fraud. The US Treasury Department also said it was imposing sanctions on the three men along with several other Revolutionary Guard Corps members.

Trump's campaign said in August it had been hacked by Iran but said the perpetrators were not able to get private information. However, several news outlets have said they declined to publish internal campaign documents that were offered to them.

How Big Tech is seizing power from states

he Brazilian Supreme Court August 30 banned X, formerly known as Twitter, in the country. The ban was the culmination of a monthslong fight between Elon Musk, the platform's owner and the earth's richest man, and Alexandre de Moraes, one of the court's justices. Moraes was tasked with investigating the role of online disinformation in attempts to keep former Brazilian President Jair Bolsonaro in power, despite losing the election. As part of these duties. Moraes had ordered X to take down hundreds of accounts spreading disinformation. In response, the platform accused the justice of censorship. Musk withdrew the representatives X legally needed to operate in Brazil, which eventually led the justice to prevent Brazilians from accessing the platform

According to reporting by The New York Times, Musk actively worked around the order. First, he encouraged Brazilians to use virtual private networks (VPNs) to evade the blockage. Then, his Starlink satellite network, which provides internet service to subscribers directly from space, continued providing access to the site. Finally, X rerouted its internet traffic through new servers, allowing it to circumvent Brazil's telecommunication controls altogether Under mounting pressure from

authorities in a country with a significant number of X users (and asset seizures), the company eventually agreed to block the disinformation accounts and pay off its fines. But the brazenness with which a tech mogul was able to defy a state's decision makes a stark and scary fact very tangible: democratic governments have lost their primacy in the digital world. Instead, companies and their executives are increasingly in charge. This power shift is the sum of society's systemic dependence on technology firms, the legal gray zones



in which they operate, and the unique characteristics of emerging technologies such as artificial intelligence. It is a product of how public institutions have been stripped of their technological knowledge, agency, and accountability. It is a reality that generations of politicians of various parties have allowed to set in.

If democracy is to survive, leaders must fight this coup head on. They need to shrink their overdependence on powerful

tech companies. They must empower public interest technology as a counterweight. They need to rebuild their own tech expertise. Most of all, they must build effective and innovative regulatory regimes that can meaningfully hold tech companies to account. The Brazilian case is a reminder that it is not too late. Democratic authorities can reclaim their sovereignty and assert themselves effectively in tech—if they choose to use their muscles.



RBI sells bonds for 11th week in a row

Mumbai, Sept 27: The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) continued selling government bonds from its portfolio for an eleventh consecutive week, posting its longest such streak since January 2022, data released Friday showed.

The RBI sold bonds worth ₹11.95 billion (\$142.85 million) in the week ending September 20, bringing the total sale for the 11-week period to ₹240.6 billion, data released Friday showed.

Small quantities of bond sales could be to address demand and supply dynamics for bonds, said Gaura Sen Gupta, chief economist at IDFC First Bank, pointing out that demand has been supported by bond index inclusion flows and long-term investor interest

The small quantum indicates the RBI wants to do this in a non-disruptive manner, she said, adding that such sales could continue as the banking system liquidity conditions are expected to remain comfortable with the rise in core liquidity.

The central bank typically sells or buys bonds to adjust banking system liquidity and rates to align them with its monetary policy. However, these operations also impact yields.

India's banking system liquidity has averaged a surplus of more than one trillion rupees during the July-September quarter.

Mumbai, Sept 27: India's foreign exchange reserves continued to rise for a sixth straight week to a record high of \$692.3 billion as of September 20, data from the central bank showed Friday.

The reserves rose by \$2.84 billion in the reporting week, after having risen by a total of \$19.3 billion in the prior five weeks.

Changes in foreign currency ssets are caused by the Reserve Bank of India's intervention in the foreign exchange market as well as the appreciation or depreciation of foreign assets held in the reserves.

The RBI intervenes on both sides of the forex market to prevent undue volatility in the rupee.

In the period for which the forex reserves data pertains, the rupee had logged its best week of 2024, aided by a larger-than-usual 50-basis-point rate cut by the US Federal Reserve as well as inflows into local stocks and bonds.

The rupee had jumped to a more-than-two-month-high of 83.4850 last week and gained nearly 0.4% week-on-week.

close to them, especially in difficult situations. I trust in my players; I believe in them 200 per cent We are going to improve," Lobera said.



Kanpur, Sept 27: In an unprecedented move, eight state tennis associations, affiliated with AITA, have proposed to move a no confidence motion against president Anil Jain and an extra-ordinary general meeting (EGM) has been called September 28 in New Delhi for the purpose.

Jain, who is a BJP Rajya Sabha MP, is facing the charges of 'loading the association with his personal 'entitled' expenses by travelling with his family abroad several times'

The state units that proposed the no-confidence motion are Assam, Gujarat, Jammu and Kashmir, Harvana, Maharashtra, Punjab, Tamil Nadu and Tripura. If the no confidence motion is passed, Jain will cease to be AITA president. Never in the history of Indian tennis has the head of the federation been removed in this fashion.

Jain was elected the AITA president unopposed in September 2020, replacing Praveen Mahajan. He served as AITA vice-president before that from 2016-2020.

When contacted, Jain termed the EGM as illegal. "This EGM is illegal. A three-week notice is required to call any meeting. This meeting is null and void. I will take legal action. Clause 15 of AITA constitution explains the process to call meetings. You can't send a notice on 23rd of a month and call a meeting on the 28th," he said.
