ICC arrest warrant against Netanyahu

The Hague, Nov 21: The International Criminal Court (ICC) issued arrest warrants Thursday for Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and his former defence chief, as well as a Hamas leader, Ibrahim Al-Masri, for alleged war crimes and crimes against humanity in the Gaza conflict.

In their decision, the ICC judges said there were reasonable grounds to believe Netanyahu and Yoav Gallant were criminally responsible for acts including murder, persecution and starvation as a weapon of war as part of a "widespread and systematic attack against the civilian population of Gaza".

Judges said there were also reasonable grounds to believe the blockade on Gaza and lack of food, water, electricity, fuel and medical supplies "created conditions of life calculated to bring about the destruction of part of the civilian population in Gaza, which resulted in the death of civilians, including children, due to malnutrition and dehydration".

MAOIST KILLED

Malkangiri, Nov 21: A Maoist was killed and a policeman was injured during a gunfight between security forces and red rebels in Jineliguda forest near the Odisha-Chhattisgarh border, police said Thursday.

The exchange of fire took place late Wednesday night as the police personnel launched an operation to stop the inflow of Maoists to Odisha through the forest in Malkangiri district, a senior officer said.

Two Maoists were also arrested during the operation,

The injured policeman, identified as Damaru Badanaik, has been admitted to Malkangiri District Headquarters Hospital, he said. The deceased Maoist is yet to be identified, the officer

New York/New Delhi, Nov 21: Billionaire Gautam Adani has been charged by US prose cutors for allegedly being part of an elaborate scheme to pay USD 265 million (about ₹2,200 crore) bribe to Indian officials in exchange for favourable terms for solar power contracts.

The bombshell allegations, which Adani Group denied saying it is innocent until proven guilty, may have a widespread fallout ranging from reputational risk to the conglomerate, inability to raise funds from the US market and the billionaire being forced to restrict his overseas travels to opening a political Pandora's box that will give the Opposition another tool to target the government just as Parliament meets for the Winter Session, starting Monday.

Adani and seven others, including his nephew Sagar. have been charged by the US Department of Justice (DoJ) with paying bribes to unidentified officials of state governments in

Andhra Pradesh and Odisha to buy expensive solar power, potentially earning more than USD 2 billion in profit over 20 years.

Prosecutors said the US started an investigation in 2022. They alleged that the group raised USD 2 billion in loans and bonds, including from US firms, on the backs of false and misleading statements related to the firm's anti-bribery practices and policies as well as reports of the bribery probe. According to the indictment, Adani Green Energy in 2021 won a tender to supply 8 gigawatt (GW) of solar power to the government-owned Solar Energy Corporation of India (SECI). New Delhi-based Azure Power, whose officials too have been named along with former executives of Canadian public pension

fund manager CDPQ in the case, won a similar 4 GW tender.

SECI was unsuccessful in finding buyers for the power at the prices contracted with Adani and Azure. Adani, in 2021 and 2022, met personally with government officials and offered them bribes to sign power sale agreements with SECI, according to the US Attorney's Office.

After the promise of bribes, electricity distribution companies in Andhra Pradesh, Odisha, Tamil Nadu and Chhattisgarh entered into agreements with SECI. It alleges that ₹25 lakh per MW was paid to an official of the Andhra Pradesh government, after which the state agreed to purchase 7,000 MW (7 GW) of solar power from SECI. "Odisha purchased 500 MW of power through the same route," it said. These apart, the US Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) has charged Gautam and Sagar Adani and an Azure Power executive with 'violating the anti-fraud provisions of the federal securities laws'. Adani Group companies lost about \$27 billion in market value during the day.

Gunmen kill 50 'Shiites' in Pak

Peshawar, Nov 21: Heavily-armed militants Thursday ambushed dozens of vehicles carrying passengers in Pakistan's restive northwest, killing around 50 people, mostly Shiites, in one of the worst attacks in the region in recent years.

The militants attacked the convoy in Khyber Pakh tunkhwa's Kurram district bordering Afghanistan, which has witnessed deadly sectarian clashes between Shia and Sunni religious groups as well as militant attacks in the past resulting in dozens of deaths in recent months.

"Rescue authorities said around 50 people, including eight women and five children, were killed and 20 others injured in the attack. Most of the victims belonged to the minori ty Shia community," they said.

No group has claimed responsibility for the attack. However, the vehicles were ambushed in areas dominated by the banned Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan militant group, a local journal-

Nearly 50 vehicles were travelling in the convoy from Parachinar to Peshawar, the capital of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa when gunmen opened fire, police said. KPK government spokesperson had earlier said that there were nearly 200 vehicles in the convoy.

President Asif Ali Zardari and Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif strongly condemned the attack, terming it a 'cowardly and inhumane act.

Adani bribed Odisha officers Mahtab Odisha's Sardar Patel: CM

While addressing an event at the Vigyan Bhavan here to mark the 125th birth anniversary of Mahtab, the first chief minister of Orissa (now Odisha), Majhi said, "We know the contributions of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel in achieving the integration of the princely states into the Union of India. Likewise. Dr Mahtab was the 'Sardar Patel of Odisha', as he helped merge various princely states into the state of Odisha."

He called Mahtab a cynosure of 'solidarity and responsive administration'.

'Sold' Bolangir baby traced to Raipur

Bhubaneswar: The state government has traced a newborn, allegedly sold by her parents due to poverty in Bolangir district, to a private hospital in Chhattisgarh's Raipur, where she is reported to be in critical condition, officials said Thursday. The baby was reportedly handed over to a couple, Abha Mittal and Raj Kumar Mittal from Raipur, November 2, after her mother was discharged from the hospital, officials said. Despite repeated efforts by Deputy Chief Minister KV Singh Deo and other senior officials to convince the mother to reveal the couple's identity, she refused to disclose any information.

Truck runs over man at Palasuni

Bhubaneswar: Tension gripped Palasuni area here Thursday morning after a 55-year-old man was crushed under the wheels of a speeding truck while crossing the NH 16. A senior officer at the Mancheswar police station identified the deceased as Prashant Bej of Jajpur. He said the incident occurred at around 11am. Bej, who came by a bus from his native place, got down at Palasuni. However, on account of heavy traffic, he failed to cross to the other side for a long time. Finally, when he attempted to cross, a motorcyclist knocked him down. Before he could get up, a speeding truck ran over him, causing him die instantaneously.

London, Nov 21: It's an enormous price to pay for a little cup of coffee, but the man behind the pitch promises it won't leave a bitter taste behind as it comes with the sweetener of a share of a dairy farm.

A Scottish dairy is offering what it bills as the UK's most expensive cup o' joe: 272 British pounds (\$344) for a flat white a double shot of espresso topped with a layer of steamed milk and a fleeting work of foam art.

The costly cup is actually a perk for purchasing shares in Mossgiel Organic Dairy's crowdfunding campaign to enlarge its sustainable operation and produce more milk.

Investors who buy 34 shares in the farm get a certificate for a flat white that can be redeemed starting this weekend at one of 13 coffee shops in Scotland that use the dairy's milk.

"This coffee costs nearly 80 times the price of an average flat white in the UK — but it's much more than just a lovely drink," said owner Bryce Cunningham. "We know it sounds crazy, but when you break it down, it's a pretty good deal. How much is the future of farming worth?"

The price tops the eye-watering 265 pounds that Shot London, a coffee bar in the posh Mayfair and Marylebone neighbourhoods, charged for a flat white made with rare beans



graph reported in April that it was the most expensive coffee in Britain. Before launching the coffee promotion, Cunningham had already raised more than a third of the 300,000 pounds he is seeking from small investors as he tries to get a 900,000 pound loan that will help him double operations and expand out of Scotland and as far as coffee shops in London.

Shareholders receive other rewards, too, such as farm tours, milk delivery discounts and invites to special events. But investors are also given a standard warning that they could lose some or all of the money they invest — except for the coffee.

The tenant farm in Mauchline, about 25 miles (40-kilometre) south of Glasgow, was worked in the 18th century by poet Robert Burns, who penned 'Auld Lang Syne' and many oth-

er well-known works. Burns, who is considered the national poet of Scotland, wrote while working in the fields there for two years and his face graces each glass bottle of Mossgiel milk. Cunningham, a former service manager for Mercedes-Benz, took over the opera tion in 2014 after his father and grandfather died in 2014 from terminal illnesses.

The collapse of milk prices that year and other problems forced him to sell off most of the herd and reinvent the business as an organic farm. He uses a process to 'brew' the milk, instead of pasteurise it, that he said gives it the creamer taste and texture of raw milk without the health risks.





A cultural programme was also organised at Utkal University of Culture.

Oppn questions Adani's land purchase in Gandhamardan

Bhubaneswar, Nov 21: With the Adani Group facing charges by US prosecutors for allegedly pay USD 265 million (about ₹2,200 crore) bribe to Indian officials in exchange for favourable terms for solar power contracts, the opposition BJD and Congress Thursday demanded clarification on whether the company has any plans to go for mining in Gandhamardan hills where it has reportedly purchased land parcels.

The Adani Group, however, said the purpose for land acquisition is to enrich the local ecology through afforestation and there is no commercial intent.

Gandhamardan Range spanning Bargarh and Bolangir districts was declared as a Biodiversity Heritage Site (BHS) in 2023 when BJD was in power. BHS is an area with unique, ecologically fragile ecosystems with rich bio-

"The government should speak out on the purpose of the Adani Group acquiring land near Gandhamardan Hills, which reserves an estimated 207 million tonnes of bauxite. Since the state government is silent on the matter, suspicion of the people grows," said Bolangir's BJD MLA Kalikesh Singh Deo.

He claimed that the people of two districts protested against the plans of Bharat Aluminium Company Ltd (BALCO) to go for

bauxite mining in Gandhamardan Hills in 1980s.

"People are getting prepared to launch another round of agitation if required. The state government would be responsible if there is any unpleasant situation," he claimed.

Veteran Congress leader Narasingha Mishra said the party would launch a massive agitation if there is any plan for mining in Gandhamardan Hills, the treasure house of hundreds of medicinal plants.

"The hill is sacred for the locals who believe that Lord Hanuman had taken a medicinal plant from Gandhamardan Hills for treatment of Lord Ram's younger brother Laxman in the Ramayana," Mishra

Senior BJP leader and Union Minister Dharmendra Pradhan, however, said there was no proposal for mining in Gandhamar-

"Since BJD has no issue against the state government, it has been trying to rake up a non-issue,'

Pradhan said. Deputy Chief Minister KV Singh Deo, also a relative of BJD legislator, claimed that the Bolangir MLA is trying to create an issue out of nothing just to stay in the limelight.

Principal Chief Conservator of Forests Debidatta Biswal said that he has no information about the land purchase by Adani Group.

"There is no transfer of any forest land to any group," Biswal said. Adani Meanwhile,

Group in a statement said: "Mahanadi Mines and Minerals has acquired private land in Bolangir and Bargarh districts from willing landowners to transfer it to the Forest department of the Odisha government for afforestation purposes. The purpose of land acquisition is clearly mentioned in the sale deed with the land-

Mahanadi Mines and Minerals is a subsidiary of Adani Group.

"This land acquisition is not intended for any comhelp enrich the local ecology on account of compensatory afforestation. The land acquisition process is in line with the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change's com-

As per provisions of the Forest Conservation Act 1980, the company is required to provide an equal extent of non-forest government land for Compensatory afforestation for the diversion of forest land for non-forest purposes.

Bargarh's BJP MP Pradeep Purohit, who came to the limelight as a leader through the anti-Balco movement in the 1980s, said that not an inch of land from Gandhamardan will be given for mining purposes.

"The Opposition parties are interested in playing politics out of this. No mining activities will ever take place in Gandhamardan



During the raid, assets including two buildings. a farmhouse spread over four acres of land, 19 plots, deposits over ₹1.72 crore and ₹1.49 lakh in cash were found, it said.

When asked about the source of accumulating the properties, he could not give any satisfactory explanation, the statement said.

Following the raid, the Vigilance department registered a case against Panigrahi and arrested him Thursday, it added.

Centre seeks clarification

Bhubaneswar, Nov 21: The Ministry of Environment. Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC) Thursday sought clarification from the Odisha government over the Eco-retreat programme at Pentha beach, within Bhitarkanika Wildlife Sanctuary, in Kendrapara district following complaints that the mass tourism activity is posing serious threats to the nesting of Olive Ridley sea turtles.

Padma Mahanti, Deputy Inspector General (DIG) of Forests (C) in a letter to the Additional Chief Secretary of Forest, Environment and Climate Change department, Odisha, said the office had received a complaint from Alava Samantarav, a resident of Marshaghai in Kendrapara district, regarding the conduct of the Eco-retreat programme at Pentha

beach in Rajnagar. The venue falls within Bhitarkanika Wildlife Sanctuary.

"Concerns have been raised regarding the potential ecological impacts and possible non-compliance with environmental and wildlife conservation laws. In light of these concerns, this office seeks clarification and a detailed report on the following aspects: Whether the mass tourism activity, including the pitching of luxury tents, is aligned with the sanctuary's approved management plan, and whether the National Board for Wildlife (NBWL) clearance has been obtained for this mass tourism and luxury tenting programme, as required under Section 33 of Wildlife Protection Act, 1972," the letter read.

Along with the details of the clearances and permissions accorded to the programme, the Union ministry has also sought the names of the authorities who had issued these permissions.

Mahanti said given the ecological sensitivity of Bhitarkanika Sanctuary, the matter re quires urgent attention 'Therefore, we request you to get the matter enquired and provide a detailed response to the queries raised supported by relevant documentation, at the earliest, she added.

Earlier, environment activist Alaya Samantaray had urged the state government to stop the Eco-retreat programme.

In a letter to the regional office of MoEFCC, Samantaray urged the state authorities not to continue with the Eco-retreat programme at the beach with in Bhitarkanika Wildlife

Bhubaneswar, Nov 21: The state government has traced a newborn, allegedly sold by her parents due to poverty in Bolangir district, to a private hospital in Chhattisgarh's Raipur, where she is reported to be in critical condition, officials said Thursday.

In another case, a newborn, sold by her parents for ₹20,000 in Rayagada district, was rescued from neighboring Andhra Pradesh Wednesday.

The baby was subsequently placed at the special adoption agency (SAA) in Rayagada after being presented before the Child Welfare Committee (CWC).



The state government had initiated an inquiry into the suspected sale of two newborns.

In the Bolangir case, the baby was handed over to a couple, Abha Mittal and Raj Kumar Mittal from Raipur, November 2, after her mother was discharged from the hospital, officials

Despite repeated efforts by Deputy Chief Minister KV Singh Deo and other senior officials to convince the mother to reveal the couple's identity, she refused to disclose any information.

When reached Lathore police station, officials found the baby at Blue Bird Hospital in Raipur. Bolangir CWC spoke to the consulting doctor at the Raipur hospital and confirmed the child's critical condition through video calls.

District officials from both Bolangir and Raipur are now working together to rescue the child and ensure her safe return.

Bhubaneswar, Nov 21: In a major step towards enhancing the state's fisheries sector. Odisha will soon establish a Fisheries and Animal Resources University, as announced by the Fisheries and Animal Resources Develop Odisha

(F&ARD) Minister Gokulananda Mallik on the occasion of World Fisheries Day here Thursday.

versity will focus on advancing research, education, and training in the field of fisheries and animal resources, a move expected to boost the state's capacity in fish production and aquaculture.

Minister Mallik revealed that the department has already sought the approval of Chief Minister Mohan Charan Maihi for the establishment of the university. The initiative is part of the state's broader strategy to enhance its fisheries

infrastructure and create more educational opportunities for those wishing to pursue careers in the sector.

In addition to the university, the state government is also planning to set up an aqua park in Sambalpur, with an investment of ₹100

crore. This aqua park is expected to become a major hub increase in seafood aquaculture exports, earning and marine approximately ₹4,546 research, helping to improve the quality

of fish farmpast year ing in the region and provide new avenues for employment and entrepreneurship.

During his speech, Mallik emphasised Odisha's goal of becoming self-reliant in fish production, driven by both Central and State-sponsored initiatives. He highlighted the importance of two key schemes—Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampad Yojana (PMMSY) and Mukhyamantri



9 fishermen held for flouting fishing ban in Gahirmatha

Kendrapara, Nov 21: Forest personnel arrested nine fishermen and seized a trawler on the charges of catching fish inside the 'No Fishing Zone' of Gahirmatha Marine Sanctuary in the early hours of Thursday. Gahirmatha Marine Sanctu-

ary Ranger Pradosh Moharana said the Forest personnel also intercepted a trawler and seized three VHF sets, two GPS sets, one fish finder, 11 trawling nets, and seven mobile phones from the seized trawler.

Moharana said the fishermen had entered the prohibited zone of Gahirmatha Marine Sanctuary near Madeli mouth, just 15km from the coast.

All the nine arrested fishermen were booked under Sections 27, 29, 31 of Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, punishable under Section 51 of the said Act.

They were later produced before the JMFC Court of Rajnagar which remanded them to jail custody after rejecting their bail pleas.

This is the second seizure in the ongoing turtle nesting season, which began from November 1. Forest personnel of Gahirmatha Marine Sanctuary had November 10 intercepted a fishing vessel and arrested seven fishermen for illegally catching fish at the 'No Fishing Zone' of Gahirmatha.

Arribada to begin under tight security at Rushikulya mouth

Ganjam, Nov 21: Arribada, the annual mass nesting event of rare Olive Ridlev sea turtles. at Rushikulva river mouth near Ganjam is predicted to begin in the last week of November, experts said Wednesday.

These migratory turtles swim thousands of kilometres from regions like Costa Rica, Sri Lanka, and Japan to Odisha's shores to lay eggs.

Environmentalists and the Forest department anticipate the mass egg-laying season to commence in December and continue until the first week of January. In previous years, rising sea levels and coastal erosion posed significant threats to the turtles' nesting grounds.

This year, the Forest department has prepared new nesting Senior

beaches by leveling and restoring the coastline to provide a suitable habitat for the turtles. environmentalist Ravindra Sahu highlighted that

the coastline has been receding

since 2007, shrinking the beach area significantly. The district administration has relocated 142 fishermen families from the Podampeta region owing to the advancing sea and also to reduce human impact on the nesting process

Recognising the importance of safeguarding these endangered species, the Forest department has declared the area as 'No Fishing Zone' and constructed barricades along the coastline from Gokharkuda to Prayagi.

Tapan Nanda, Divisional Forest Officer emphasised that the Indian Coast Guard (ICG) personnel have been deployed to ensure uninterrupted nesting. Divyashankar Behera, DFO, Rambha confirmed that regular patrolling is underway to secure the area.

Trump's Bad COP

onald Trump's victory in the US presidential election has cast a dark shadow over the United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP29) in Baku. Having made no secret of his belief that climate change is a "hoax," Trump's return to power threatens to undo much of the progress made in combating the climate crisis, leaving global leaders and policymakers with ample reason to feel disheartened.

Trump is expected to ramp up domestic fossil-fuel production. During a meeting at Mar-a-Lago in May, he openly asked for \$1 billion in campaign contributions from oil and gas executives in exchange for promising to roll back regulations threatening their profits. His pick to lead the Environmental Protection Agency, former Congressman Lee Zeldin, has already vowed to "deregulate" the EPA.

During his first term, Trump withdrew the United States from the 2015Paris climate agreement – a decision later reversed by his successor, Joe Biden. He is widely expected to withdraw from it again. Notably, Argentine President Javier Milei, Trump's political ally, recalled his country's delegation from COP29 - a move that may signal Argentina's imminent departure from the accord.

The mood at COP29 was further dampened by the conspicuous absence of global leaders like Biden, French President Emmanuel Macron, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi, German Chancellor Olaf Scholz, and Chinese President Xi Jinping, all of whom skipped this year's summit. As the escalating climate crisis disproportionately affects the world's poorest populations, and the ongoing wars in the Middle East and Ukraine continue to generate massive greenhouse-gas emissions, prospects for meaningful climate action appear increasingly remote.

But the fight against climate change is not necessarily doomed. The ability to avert catastrophe will depend on the global response to Trump's obstructionism and whether other countries can come together to confront the

crisis, even without US leadership. It is also worth noting that the US has long been a reluctant participant in global climate initiatives, regardless of who occupies the White House. This re-

luctance is hardly surprising, given its position as the world's largest producer and net exporter of fossil fuels. Even under Biden, America's green policies have been primarily additive, focusing on expanding renewable-energy production rather than replacing

or reducing fossil-fuel extraction. As Indian journalist Nitin Sethi has noted. the US approach to climate negotiations has been to "retain, reinforce, and gain new competitive economic advantage," wielding "climate language as a tool" to advance its national interests. This helps explain many of America's policy positions. Over the years, the

US has blocked discussions on climate reparations and shifted the burden of mitigation and financing onto emerging economies like China and India while subjecting them to intense scrutiny. It has ensured that financing and mitigation measures remain voluntary rather than enforceable. At the same time, it has sought to benefit American companies

by prioritising enforcement of intellectual-property (IP) rights over the broader dissemination of green technologies. And it has favoured vague, non-binding language in international agreements on national mitigation goals, adaptation support, and compensation for loss and damage.

Given this reality, many negotiators believe that America's involvement in the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) is driven less by a commitment to multilateral cooperation and more by the pursuit of narrowly defined, self-serving goals. Moreover, the US frequently bypasses the UN system, favouring bilateral deals that align more closely with its economic and geopolitical interests.

Paradoxically, Trump's anticipated withdrawal from the Paris agreement could pave the way for more effective climate negotiations – a dynamic that also could prompt the Trump administration not to withdraw so that the US act as a spoiler.

Irrespective of Trump's policies, it is now clear that the COP process $\,$ is no longer fit for purpose. Earlier this month, I joined other academics and climate advocates in sending an open letter to UNFCCC Executive Secretary Simon Stiell and UN Secretary-General António Guterres, arguing that the current framework "simply cannot deliver the change" we need "to ensure a safe climate landing for humanity." Instead of hosting grand annual summits that often serve as platforms for fossil-fuel lobbyists to broker side deals, we called for "smaller, more frequent, solution-driven meetings."

Trust between high-income and lower-income economies is crucial for any collaborative climate effort. To promote transparency and accountability, governments must prioritise feasible near-term goals over distant, effectively meaningless targets, and rich countries must make genuine, well-defined, and transparent climate-financing commitments.

Importantly, climate finance must not take the form of loans, which often trap developing countries in perpetual cycles of debt and distress, exacerbating their external vulnerabilities. Equally pressing is the need to share the knowledge and technologies critical for both mitigation and adaptation. To be sure, achieving this would require a re-evaluation - or even an outright waiver – of existing IP rules, so that these vital resources are treated as global public goods and are accessible to all.

Even if a second Trump presidency disrupts multilateral arrangements, there is still significant potential for large international coalitions to tackle climate change. The clean-energy transition, led by China and other countries, is not just inevitable – it is already underway. As this shift becomes harder to ignore, even a US administration fixated on getting the best "deals" may realise it cannot afford to be left behind.

TAX EQUITY MUST

n a bid to project the government as pro-poor and obliterate the image of pro-rich and pro-corporate, the I-T department produced statistics and claimed that the income tax liability on individuals earning below ₹20 lakh a year, categorised as middle class, has reduced in the first ten years of the NDA government, while the burden on those earning above ₹50 lakh - considered rich - has increased considerably. In reality, the Indian middle class is increasingly burdened by our regressive tax system that favours the rich and corporate tycoons.

The government claims that the number of I-T returns filers above ₹50 lakh has increased five-fold from 1.85 lakh in 2013-14 to 9.39 lakh in 2023-24 while their tax liability has boomed by 3.2 times from ₹2.52 lakh crore to ₹9.62 lakh crore in same period. For those in the income bracket of ₹10-15 lakh, the average tax liability has reduced to ₹1.1 lakh in 2023-24, from ₹2.3 lakh in 2013-14. For individuals earning between ₹15-20 lakh, the average tax liability has shrunk to ₹1.7 lakh from ₹4.1 lakh in same period.

Actually, more people are entering the high income category not because of rise in real income but simply due to rise in nominal income spawned by inflation. Hence, a comparison of tax burden at two different points should adjust the income levels for nominal growth in income. If inflation is taken into consideration or income is linked to gold, middle classes will be found paying more taxes. Since, budget of 2013-14. the average price of per 10 gram gold was ₹29,190, while same was around ₹75,220 in 2023-24. But tax exemption limit has increased to ₹3 lakh in 2023-24 as against ₹2 lakh in 2013-14.

limit of ₹2 lakh in 2013-14 was worth 68.52 gm of gold then. However, at ₹3 lakh basic exemption limit, it is worth a tiny 39.88 gm now. In terms of gold value, the basic exemption should have been hiked to ₹5.15 lakh instead of ₹3 lakh. If we apply Cost Inflation Index (CII), ₹2 lakh in 2013-14 will be equivalent to ₹3.16 lakh in 2023-24. The CII is used to estimate the increase in the prices of goods and assets year-by-year due to inflation. With 2001-02 as base year having value of 100, the index value of 2013-14 is 220 and for 2023-24, it is 348.

Moreover, the new tax regime 2023-24 provides only standard deduction of ₹50,000 but does not provide most common old regime deductions and exemptions like Section 80C. Section 80D, Section 24 and many more. The tax rebate under Section 80C should have been revised to ₹2.37 lakh in 2023-24 from ₹1.5 lakh in 2013-14 by considering inflation. By this middle class pay more taxes and savings is discouraged.

It is also said that an individual opting for the new tax regime and having taxable income of up to ₹7.5 lakh will not be required to pay any taxes at

the time of filing ITR. But this rebate is not applicable to those having taxable income above ₹7.5 lakh. This ₹7.5 lakh of 2023-24 is equivalent to ₹4.74 lakh in 2013-14 if inflation is taken into consideration.

The tax burden falls upon poor and middle class through indirect taxes. Indirect taxes which include Union excise duties and the GST are levied on goods and services, and the final cost is paid by the consumer. The tax is considered regressive as it is the same for everyone, regardless of their income. People with lower incomes spend a larger proportion of their income on goods and services, so the effective tax rate is higher for them.

Advanced economies collect more direct tax and less indirect tax for these reasons. The share of indirect taxes - both Centre and state combined - in total taxes, which was dwindling steadily since 1980s has increased from 2010-11 onwards. On the other hand, the share of direct taxes, which had been swelling till 2010-11, has steadily recorded a downturn in recent years. While indirect taxes comprise around 65.8% of total taxes, direct taxes 34.2% in 2022-23. The increasing share of indirect taxes implies a heftier burden on lower-income individuals.

The GST has heightened the existing regressive nature of indirect taxes, disproportionately affecting low- and middle-income population. In its January 2023 report Survival of the Richest: The India Story, Oxfam India claimed that the poorest 50% pay 64.3% of total GST, while middle 40% pay 31.8% of total GST and top 10% pay 3.9% of total GST.

India is a tax haven for the rich as they do not have to pay wealth and inheritance taxes. This government has shown unusual favour to the rich by abolishing wealth tax in 2015-16; reducing maximum surcharge from 37% to 25% having taxable income above ₹10 crore; lowering GST on luxury goods in 2022-23, and reducing corporate taxes in 2019-20 by big margin. By contrast, middle-class citizens, who are savers, have been made to pay tax on insurance premiums, paltry interest received from savings bank accounts. Unlike the past, personal income taxes are making a larger share of government revenue than corporate taxes since 2022-23 due to past corporate tax cuts.

The middle class is barely growing, rather shrinking especially due to high indirect taxes, inflation, rising inequality, low real wages, costly realty, increasing household debt, escalating lifestyle expenses, and rise of health and educational expenditures. The current regressive impact of indirect taxes calls for immediate learning from global best practices. India should design policies that prioritise tax equity and reduce the disproportionate tax burden on low- and middle-income households.

According to a World Economic Forum report, 65% of primary school children today will eventually work in jobs that do not yet exist. In a developing country, access to education, healthcare, and basic opportunities varies widely, affected by socio-economic realities such as caste, religion, and region. The State must act as an equalizer, protecting all children's rights regardless of socio-economic status. In a just

and equitable state, every child deserves equal opportunity and protection. Recognising these principles

the United Nations formulated the Convention on the Rights of the Child in 1989, now the most widely ratified human rights treaty in history. This agreement presents children as individuals with inherent rights, not simply as dependents of parents. The treaty defines a child as anyone under 18 and lists around 40 rights governments are responsible for ensuring. These rights are universal, applying irrespective of a child's background, appearance, or circumstances. The treaty emphasises the interconnectedness and equal importance of these rights, which cannot be denied to any child.

Among these rights are those supporting children's growth and development, such as the right to a safe home, quality healthcare, and proper nutrition. Rights protecting children from harm guarantee safety from violence, abuse, and exploitation. Additional rights protect children from harmful labour and substances. Children are also entitled to education and services that help develop their skills and abilities. They have the right to

participate in society, express themselves, and engage in the fulfillment of their rights.

Schools play an essential role in realising these rights. Beyond family, schools offer a structured environment where children exercise their right to education and are entitled to a safe learning space, adequate nutrition through school meals, and facilities that support their development. India, through its Right to Education Act of 2009. has taken significant steps to guarantee every child's right to free and compulsory education. This act mandates that central and state governments ensure access to quality education. India's government directly manages nearly one million schools and sets policies for approximately half a million private schools. Through a range of centrally sponsored programmes, including the Integrated Child Development Scheme, Mid-Day-Meal (PM Poshan), Samagra Shiksha Abhivan, and mass immunisation and school health programmes, over 260 million children receive essential nutrition, quality education, basic healthcare, and social protection within school settings. Yet, as schooling access grows,

Delhi most polluted city

Air quality crisis persists in north India PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

New Delhi, Nov 21: Delhi emerged as the most polluted city in India, recording an average PM2.5 level of 243.3 micrograms per cubic metre air (µg/ m³), with pollution surging by 19.5 per cent in week-on-week increase, according to a report released Thursday.

According to the Air Quality Analysis Report by Respirer Living Sciences, which analysed PM2.5 levels across 281 Indian cities from November 3 to 16, Delhi was ranked last, holding position 281

The prominent pollutant was PM2.5—fine particles with a diameter of 2.5 micrometers or less, roughly the width of a human hair.

These particles can penetrate deep into the lungs and enter the bloodstream, posing significant health risks, according to the Central Pollution Control

The severe pollution underscores the compounded effects of vehicular emissions, industrial output, and stubble

Crisis fuels demand for CNG, BS-6 vehicles during wedding season

The enforcement of Stage IV of GRAP, which bans BS-3 and BS-4 diesel vehicles, has disrupted travel and transportation, particularly for those engaged in the wedding business. The Central Pollution Control Board imposed GRAP-IV measrestrictions, which came into effect at 8 AM Monday, aim to curb pollution caused by older diesel vehicles. However, the measure has had unintended consequences. Travel agencies report a sharp rise in demand for BS-6 and CNG vehicles, including cars like Ertiga, Innova, and traveller buses, as they scramble to meet commitments made before the ban. "The wedding season has added to the pressure. Many vehicles were pre-booked months in advance, and with this sudden ban, we had to scramble to adjust," said Sewak Tuar, a travel agency owner, "We are weddings and transportation needs are being heavily affected." he added.

Combined with cooler winter temperatures, these conditions are trapping pollutants closer to the ground, the report said.

It claimed that Delhi's pollution was part of a larger trend affecting the Indo-Gangetic Plain and several other northern states, including Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, and Punjab, which also recorded hazardous air quality levels.

Ronak Sutaria, Founder and CEO of Respirer Living Sciences, spoke to PTI about the

He said the spike in pollu-

tion levels every year around November marks a significant departure from the usual pattern, which typically sees such levels between mid-December and February.

'This shift not only highlights an unusual trend but also raises serious concerns about what we might face in the coming months," he said.

Another observation made was the stark difference in PM2.5 concentrations across the region.

Jammu, Nov 21: In a bid to ensure the safety of underage children, petrol pumps in Jammu have put up posters declaring "no fuel for vehicles driven by minors".

The Jammu and Kashmir Directorate of School Education (DSE) has also issued a circular prohibiting minor students from driving motor vehicles, including two-wheelers and four-wheelers, to school.

The poster, first displayed at petrol pumps in the Gandhi Nagar area on the Jammu-Pathankot highway reads, "No fuel for minors"

"The poster, which specifically focuses on minors riding two-wheelers without helmets or four-wheelers, is aimed at ensuring the safety of children," said an employee of the petrol pump.

This step has drawn praise from residents and encouraged the authorities to take proactive measures

"It has come to notice that some underage students are driving vehicles while going to schools or coaching centres Such an act has the potential of causing road accidents, endangering public safety, and is also in violation of the provisions of the Motor Vehicle Act," the DSE said in a circular issued Thursdav.

It further said, "In view of the above, it is impressed upon Heads of Institutions of all government and private schools & coaching centres to implement these instructions strictly. They should keep a close vigil to ensure

Students in slum areas face challenges

Several parents and students raised concerns saying many children are unable to attend classes regularly due to the dearth of smartphones, stable internet connections or multiple devices in their households

New Delhi, Nov 21: With Delhi schools switching over to online teaching due to high pollution levels, students living in the city's slum areas are facing significant accessibility challenges.

Families living in Lalbagh slum near Delhi's Azadpur area are struggling to adapt to limited resources, forcing children to share phones, miss lessons or entirely forego online school.

Soni Kumari, a 39-year-old mother of two who lives in Lalbagh, shared her struggles with managing online classes for her children due to limited access to mobile phones.

"I have only one mobile phone, which makes it difficult for my two daughters to attend their online classes. When their classes overlap, they fight over who gets to use the phone. If schools resumed offline classes, both of them

would be able to study properly," she said, while sweeping in front of her home.

Nine-year-old Krish, waiting for his friends to go out to play, said his mother has one phone which she takes to her work. He, therefore, fails to attend his online classes

"I can't attend online classes because my mother takes her phone to work. For me, online school feels like a holiday because I spend the whole day playing with my friends," he

were seen playing badminton. Similarly, Anu, an 11-yearold, who was playing with her younger sister, said her parents have two phones but one is a basic phone so her elder sister and she attend online classes on alternative days.

"Today, my sister, who is in class 6, is attending her classes So I'm looking after my younger sister because my mother is at work," she said.

Sunita, a 35-year-old mother, said pollution does not bother them much anymore.

"We have been living here for the past eight years, surrounded by a sewer on one side and piles of garbage on the other. But what is worrying us is that my child is not able to attend online classes as we do not have a smartphone," she said.

Sunita said she only has one feature phone.

"If the government keeps schools online for 15 days. that means my child will miss 15 days of lessons," she said expressing her concern.

A tea-seller in Lalbagh, busy serving his customers, said his child's online classes get disrupted due to poor internet connection in the area.

DELHI REELS UNDER POLLUTION

Govt declares staggered work timings for employees

New Delhi, Nov 21: The Centre of Thursday announced staggered working hours for its employees here to aid the fight against pollution as the city reeled under "very poor" air quality even though the AQI fell below the 400-mark after several days.

The 24-hour average Air Quality Index, recorded daily at 4 pm, stood at 371 Thursday, showing an improvement from 419 Wednesday due to increased wind speeds, according to data from the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB).

However, Delhi still ranked as the second most polluted city in the country only behind Bihar's Hajipur (AQI 403). While Delhi's AQI was the

worst in the country Monday and Tuesday, with readings exceeding 450 in the "severe plus" category, it recorded the third-worst ranking Wednesday before moving to the second place Thursday. The Centre, meanwhile, announced staggered working hours for its employees. According to an order issued by the Union Personnel Ministry, employees have been advised carpooling and use of public transport to minimise vehicular pollution. "Offices can operate from 9 am to 5.30 pm or from 10 am to 6.30 pm,' the order stated.

Bihar's Hajipur recorded the highest AQI in the country Thursday, with a reading of 403 in the "severe" category. followed by Delhi at 371, according to the CPCB's 24-hour data.

Out of 35 monitoring stations in Delhi, six reported "severe" air quality with AQI readings exceeding 400, while 28 stations fell into the "very poor" category with readings above

300, according to the SAMEER app, which provides hourly updates on the National Air Quality Index.

An AQI between 0 and 50 is considered "good," 51-100 "satisfactory," 101-200 "moderate," 201-300 "poor," 301-400 "very poor," 401-450 "severe," and above 450 "severe plus.'

At 5 pm Thursday, CPCB data identified PM2.5 as the primary pollutant, with its levels recorded at 168. PM2.5 particles, measuring 2.5 micrometers or smaller (about the width of a human hair), pose significant health risks as they can penetrate deep into the lungs and enter the bloodstream, according to CPCB. The Centre's Decision Support System (DSS) for Air Quality Management attributed 17.7per cent of Delhi's pollution Thursday to vehicular emissions. Stubble burning. another significant contributor, accounted for 17.3 per cent of PM2.5 levels Wednesday.

Delhi HC refuses to stay ED case against Kejriwal

New Delhi, Nov 21: The Delhi High Court Thursday refused to stay for now the proceedings against former CM and AAP chief Arvind Kejriwal in a money laundering case linked to purported irregularities in the state Excise Policy 2021-22.

Justice Manoj Kumar Ohri issued notice and sought the response of the Enforcement Directorate on a plea by the former Delhi Chief Minister challenging a trial court's order taking cognisance of a chargesheet in the case.

The matter will be heard December 20. Kejriwal sought setting aside of the trial court order and argued that cognisance of the chargesheet was taken by the special court in the absence of the required sanction for his prosecution as he was a public servant when the alleged offence was committed.

However, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the ED, submitted a sanction was obtained to prosecute Kejriwal and he would be filing an affidavit. Kejriwal's counsel said the relevant document was not supplied to them along with the supplementary chargesheet and claimed there was no sanction at the time of filing of the final report. The AAP convenor's lawyer

sought an early hearing after the court posted the hearing in January, 2025 and insisted an order on his plea for a stay on the proceedings be passed during the day owing to urgency. Mehta opposed the

Imphal/Guwahati, Nov 21: Manipur Assembly's 10 Kuki MLAs, including seven of the state's ruling BJP-led alliance, have demanded that AFSPA be extended to the entire state to recover looted arms.

The Centre November 14 reimposed the Armed Forces Special Powers Act (AFSPA) in Manipur's six police station areas, including the violence-hit Jiribam, with the Union Home Ministry asserting that the decision was taken given the "continuous volatile situation" there due to ethnic strife. Now. the entire state, except the areas under the jurisdiction of 13 police stations, is under AFSPA. In a joint statement, the 10 Kuki MLAs said, "The imposition of AFSPA as per orders dated 14 November, 2024 indeed needs



immediate review to extend the Act in the remaining 13 police jurisdictions.

They asserted that AFSPA should be imposed in the entire state in order to facilitate the recovery of the "more than 6.000 sophisticated weapons" looted by Meiteis since May 3 last year as it is a long overdue action required to contain the violence.

Ethnic violence between Meities and Kukis began May 3, 2023, after a 'Tribal Solidari-

ty March' was organised in the state's hill districts to protest the Meitei community's demand for Scheduled Tribe (ST) status. More than 220 people have been killed in the violence since then. Setback for Saji Cherian as court orders CBI probe

Kochi, Nov 21: In a blow to state Fisheries Minister Saji Cherian, the Kerala High Court Thursday ordered further probe into the allegation that he "insulted" the Constitution in a speech at an event in July 2022 by saying that certain words used by him "cannot be terms of respect generally".

The High Court's direction was used by the Congress-led UDF opposition and the BJP to demand Cherian's resignation or sacking from his ministerial post, while he said that further steps would be decided after going through the order.

Justice Bechu Kurian Thomas said that it was a matter of common perception in the Malayalam language that the words -- 'kuntham' and 'kudachakram' -- "when spoken in collocation with each other,

cannot be stated to be used in a respectful manner".

Cherian in his speech had used these words and also said that 'Constitution is ideal for looting the people', the High Court noted in its order. "Thus, the words used by the minister in his speech, like 'ideal Constitution to loot the people' or the words secularism, democracy, 'kuntham' (spear), 'Kudachakram' (a type of firecracker) cannot be terms

of respect generally. "But the question that begs the answer is whether the context in which those terms were used shows disrespect to the Constitution. The statement that the Indian Constitution is ideal for looting the people does not leave much room for discussion. There cannot even be two views on that statement," the High Court said. It further noted that the expression -- secularism, democracy, 'kuntham', 'kudachakram' was obviously referring to the Preamble which is a part of the Constitution.

"The said expression cannot be stated to be used with respect...," the High Court observed. The High Court noted that the investigating officer in his final report said there was no intention behind the words to disrespect the Constitution.

"It is difficult to comprehend the said conclusion and the manner in which such a conclusion was arrived at.. "When the statutory intention is explicit that no member of the public shall disrespect the Constitution, and when the words themselves can manifest the intention, the conclusion of the investigating officer (IO) is not legally tenable," the High Court said.

It said the conclusion arrived at by the IO was in haste, the investigation conducted was not proper and the magisterial court was wrong in accepting the final report.

"On a consideration of the entire circumstances, this court is of the view that the final report ought to be set aside and a fur ther investigation be conduct ed," the High Court said while allowing a plea by a lawyer challenging the decision of the magisterial court and the final report of the police.

The High Court further said that since the accused is a minister, investigation by an SHO would not suffice and a superior agency was required.





Adani indictment turns into political slugfest

Several Opposition parties including the TMC, CPI-M, CPI, AAP and NC stepped up the attack on the business conglomerate, calling for a JPC probe

New Delhi, Nov 21: The Adani group's indictment in the US over alleged bribery and fraud gave fresh ammunition to Opposition parties to demand a joint parliamentary committee probe into the business group's dealings, even as Congress leader Rahul Gandhi sought Gautam Adani's immediate arrest.

Addressing a press conference here, Gandhi claimed that it is now pretty clear and established in the US that the businessman has broken Indian as well as American laws.

Adani should be arrested immediately and interrogated while his "protector" and SE-BI chairperson Madhabi Puri Buch should be removed from her post and a probe initiated, the Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha said.

Taking a jibe at Prime Minister Narendra Modi's 'Ek hain to safe hain' slogan, Gandhi said as long as the prime minister and Adani are together, "they are safe" in India. "Modi ji will never arrest Adani because in the end he will be the one to get caught. There-

fore - 'if we are one, we are safe'," he said in a post on X. The Adani group denied the charges, saying the allegations by US prosecutors are baseless and that the conglomerate is compliant with all laws. It also said it will pursue all possible legal recourse.

The issue has given fresh impetus to the opposition camp's attacks on the government just ahead of the winter session of Parliament starting November 25, and is likely to dominate the proceedings of both houses.

Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge said a comprehensive JPC probe into all aspects of the Adani group's functioning, including its investments in foreign countries, and institutional erosion in India is the need of the hour.

Gandhi said the entire Opposition is together on the matter and will jointly raise the issue during the session, he said.

"I can guarantee that Adani won't be arrested or investigated in India because the Modi govsaid in a statement.

TMC general secretary Kunal Ghosh demanded a statement from Prime Minister Narendra Modi on charges of alleged bribery and fraud against the billionaire. National Conference president Farooq Abdullah said the Centre should take the allegations against Adani group seriously and investigate the matter thoroughly.

The CPI(M) demanded a CBI

probe into the entire affair and said the Modi government cannot hide behind a smokescreen anymore. CPI leader D Raja said "Only through a fair, unbiased probe can the truth be uncovered. In this context, the CPI demands that a joint parliamentary committee be formed to look into the growth, business malpractices and controversies surrounding the Adani Group and their bonhomie with Narendra Modi and the BJP."

The BJP, on the other hand, slammed Rahul Gandhi's attack on Prime Minister Modi as part of his long-running efforts to target its leader and noted that none of the four states named in American courts had a BJP government.

Patra also pointed out that the four states -- Andhra Pradesh, Odisha, Chhattisgarh Tamil Nadu -- where government functionaries were allegedly paid bribes of over \$250 million to secure favourable deals, were ruled by non-BJF formulations during the period mentioned in the indictment.

BITCOIN PONZI SCAM CASE

CBI questions audit company employee

Raipur, Nov 21: The CBI Thursday questioned Gauray Mehta, an audit company employee, in connection with its probe into the ₹6.600-crore Gain Bitcoin ponzi scam case here, officials said.

The central probe agency, which registered three cases related to the alleged scam in October, had called Mehta to appear before its investigation team as soon as possible after his name cropped up in purported tapes of Maharashtra political leaders discussing the encashment of the cryptocur rency worth crores.

Mehta has been tioned since the afternoon in connection with the case. The officers quizzed him regarding the tapes and documents related to alleged investments in cryptocurrency.

The officials said Mehta was also asked if he had shared the voice notes of the political leaders and if so, their details. The audit company employee is understood to have been asked about his role in the purported bitcoin transactions alleged in the notes, they said.

The Supreme Court handed over to the CBI in December 2023 10 cases related to the alleged Gain Bitcoin ponzi scam registered by police in various states against Variable Tech Pvt Ltd, Late Amit Bhardwaj, Ajay Bhardwaj and others for allegedly collecting Bitcoins worth around ₹6,600 crore from people through their multi-level-marketing scheme with false promises of 10 per cent monthly return in the form of the cryptocurrency. Bitcoins, a cryptocurrency, are not controlled by any central bank of any country.

Maharashtra sees 66.05 pc voter turnout Mumbai: The final turnout in Maharashtra Assembly polls was 66.05

per cent as per EVM votes, up from 61.1 per cent in 2019, Election Commission officials said Thursday. The polling percentage for the Nanded Lok Sabha bypoll was 67.81 per cent. Polls to the 288-member state assembly were held Wednesday, while votes will be counted Saturday, "The official figures for each Assembly constituency will depend on the count of postal ballots reported. The 66 per cent turnout figure refers specifically to the votes cast on electronic voting machines," the chief electoral officer said. The increase, excluding postal ballots, highlighted the EC's efforts to engage a broader electorate, the statement added. Kolhapur led with 76.63 per cent, followed by 75.26 per cent in Gadchiroli, which has some Left Wing Extremism affected pockets, while the lowest was in Mumbai island city at 52.07 per cent and 55.95 per cent in the metropolis' suburban district.

RG Kar: CPI(M) takes out rally to CBI office

Mehta said Malik was not an ordinary criminal and showed a purported photograph of Malik sharing the dais with terrorist Hafiz Saeed.

The top court said it could order trial to take place inside the jail premises and ask the judge to come to the national capital for the proceedings. The bench, however, noted all the accused persons in the matter had to be heard before it passes an order.

Mehta said Malik appearing in the Supreme Court physically raised security concerns previously. The bench said Malik could be allowed to appear virtually in the apex court proceedings and posted the matter November 28.

Israeli PM nixes ICC verdict

The International Criminal Court issued arrest warrants Thursday for Israeli Prime Minister Beniamin Netanyahu. his former defence minister and Hamas officials, accusing them of war crimes and crimes against humanity over their 13-month war in Gaza and the October 2023 attack on Israel respectively. Netanyahu condemned the arrest warrant against him, saying Israel "rejects with disgust the absurd and false actions". The decision turns Netanyahu and the others into internationally wanted suspects and is likely to further isolate them and complicate efforts to negotiate a cease-fire to end the fighting. But its practical implications could be limited since Israel and its major ally, the United States, are not members of the court and two of the Hamas officials were killed in the conflict.

The ICC is a court of last resort that only prosecutes cases when domestic law enforcement authorities cannot or will not investigate. Israel is not a member state of the court. The country has struggled to investigate itself in the past, rights groups say.

Despite the warrants, none of the suspects is likely to face judges in The Hague any time soon. The court itself has no police to enforce warrants, instead relying on cooperation from its member states.

Even so, the threat of arrest could make it difficult for Netanyahu and Gallant to travel abroad, although Russian President Vladimir Putin, who is wanted on an ICC warrant for alleged war crimes in Ukraine, recently showed he could still visit an ally when he traveled to Mongolia, one of the court's member states, and was not arrested.

Khan sought warrants in May, accusing Netanyahu and Gallant of crimes including murder, intentionally attacking civilians, and persecution.

In a statement at the time. Khan alleged that Israel "has intentionally and systematically deprived the civilian population in all parts of Gaza of objects indispensable to human survival" by closing border crossings into the territory and restricting essential supplies including food and medicine.

PUGNACIOUS DY UK PM TO TONY BLAIR, DIES AT 86

Nov 21: John London, Prescott, the pugnacious deputy Prime Minister to Britain's Tony Blair during his 10 years in government, has died aged 86 after a battle with Alzheimer's his family said Thursday.

Prescott, who served under Blair from 1997 to 2007, was known as a plain-speaking politician who bridged the divide between the traditional leftwing and the modernisers in the Labour Party.

"There was no one quite like him in British politics," Blair told BBC radio. "I don't think, to be honest. I'd ever met any one quite like John, and I still don't think I've ever met any one quite like him, and I'm very sad that he's passed.'

A proud trade unionist dubbed an old-school political "bruiser", he famously punched a member of the public during an election campaign in 2001, after he had been pelted with an egg.

"I was just thinking this morning about the time when someone smashed an egg on his head and he turned around and he punched the guy and laid him out. There were no rules that he really abided by," Blair

Prescott was born May 31 1938, in a seaside house in Wales. His father was a railway signalman, his mother a maid

He went into politics after coming ashore and he attended Oxford's Ruskin College, which offered courses for mature stu dents.

Prescott entered Parliament in 1970 and worked his way through the ranks, becoming a key player in the Labour Party's historic three election victories from 1997 to 2007.

'New US base in Poland raises nuclear danger'

Moscow, Nov 21: Russia said Thursday that a new US ballistic missile defence base in northern Poland will lead to an increase in the overall level of nuclear danger, but Warsaw said "threats" from Moscow only strengthened the argument for NATO defences.

The air defence base, situ ated in the town of Redzikowo near the Baltic coast, part of a broader NATO missile shield, was opened November 13.

"This is another frankly provocative step in a series of deeply destabilising actions by the Americans and their allies in the North Atlantic Alliance in the strategic sphere," Russian Foreign Ministry spokesperson Maria

Zakharova said. "This leads to undermining strategic stability, increasing strategic risks and, as a result. to an increase in the overall

level of nuclear danger.' Pawel Wronski, Poland's foreign ministry spokesper son, said there were no nuclear missiles at the base, which was

purely for defence.

"It is a base that serves the purpose of defence, not attack, Wronski said.

All countries reject climate finance draft

Baku, Nov 21: A draft text released early Thursday on a new climate finance package for the developing world was reiected by every single country signatory to the UN climate

The COP29 presidency, however, said the draft was far from final and invited countries to submit bridging proposals.

The next version, due Thursday night, will be leaner and packed with numbers aimed at finding the sweet spot for consensus, it said in a statement. The text shows that devel-

oped countries are still dodging a key question: how much climate finance are they ready to provide developing countries every year starting in 2025?

The developing world has repeatedly said it needs at least \$1.3 trillion annually, 13 times the \$100 billion pledged in 2009, to meet the growing challenges.

Although developed countries have yet to officially propose a figure, their negotiators indicated that European Union nations were discussing a global climate finance target of \$200 billion to \$300 billion per year.

However, in the words of Colombian Environment Minister Susana Muhamad, the critical objective of this COP is, right now, an "empty placeholder".

The problem is not that developed countries lack money; the problem is that they are playing geopolitics, she said in an impassioned speech, drawing applause from a plenary full

of negotiators, observers, and iournalists.

The G77, the largest negotiating bloc at the UN climate talks with over 130 developing nations, said they have been very clear that "we should not leave Baku without a quantum".

Adonia Ayebare, the G77 chair, denounced the developed countries' attempt to turn the climate finance package into a global investment goal that would draw funding from a variety of sources, including governments, private companies and investors.

"We are disappointed that the draft text doesn't even specify a quantum for provisional mobilization," said Bolivia's Diego Pacheco, on behalf of Like-Minded Developing Coun-

tries, which includes India. African Group of Negotiators chair Ali Mohamed said they were deeply concerned by the "lack of mention of quantum". "This quantum is the main mandate for which we are here at COP29.

European Union's climate Chief Wopke Hoekstra called the draft "imbalanced, unworkable, and not acceptable".

"Developed countries must stop playing games with our life and put a serious quantified financial proposal on the table,' he said. Pakistan, still reeling from the aftermath of the devastating 2022 floods, said an ambitious outcome on the climate finance package was particularly important for them, but the text lacked "concrete numbers on the quantum."

US regulators seek to break up Google

The authority forces **Chrome sale as part of** monopoly punishment

Washington, Nov 21: US regulators want a federal judge to break up Google to prevent the company from continuing to squash competition through its dominant search engine after a court found it had maintained an abusive monopoly over the past decade.

The proposed breakup floated in a 23-page document filed late Wednesday by the US Department of Justice calls for sweeping punishments that would include a sale of Goo-

gle's industry-leading Chrome web browser and impose restrictions to prevent Android from favouring its own search A sale of Chrome "will per-

manently stop Google's control of this critical search access point and allow rival search engines the ability to access the browser that for many users is a gateway to the internet,' Justice Department lawyers argued in their filing.

Although regulators stopped short of demanding Google sell Android too, they asserted the judge should make it clear the company could still be required to divest its smartphone operating system if its oversight committee continues to see evidence of misconduct.



The broad scope of the recommended penalties underscores how severely regulators operating under President Joe Biden's administration believe Google should be punished following an August ruling by US District Judge Amit Mehta that branded the company as a monopolist.

The Justice Department decision-makers who will inherit the case after President-elect Donald Trump takes office next vear might not be as strident. The Washington, DC court hearings on Google's punishment are scheduled to begin in April and Mehta is aiming to issue his final decision before

Labour Day If Mehta embraces the government's recommendations Google would be forced to sell its 16-year-old Chrome browser within six months of the final ruling. But the company cer tainly would appeal any punishment, potentially prolonging a legal tussle that has dragged on for more than four years.

Besides seeking a Chrome spinoff and a corralling of the Android software, the Justice Department wants the judge to ban Google from forging multibillion-dollar deals to lock in its dominant search engine as the default option on Apple's iPhone and other devices.

INDIAN CURRENCY FALLS 8 PAISE TO HIT ALL-TIME LOW OF 84.50 AGAINST US DOLLAR

Mumbai, Nov 21: The rupee depreciated 8 paise to settle at an all-time low of 84.50 against the US dollar Thursday. dragged down by massive selloff in domestic equity markets and surging crude oil prices amid a volatile geopolitical situation.

According to forex traders, the American currency strengthened due to safe-haven appeal amid escalating tension between Russia and Ukraine, while the continuous outflow of foreign funds also put pressure on the domestic unit.

At the interbank foreign exchange, the rupee opened at 84.41 and touched the lowest-ever level of 84.51 against the greenback during in tra-day. The unit ended the session at 84.50 against the dollar, surpassing its previous all-time low closing level of 84.46 recorded November 14.

On Tuesday, the rupee had settled flat at 84.42 against the US dollar. The foreign exchange mar-

ket was closed Wednesday on account of assembly elections in Maharashtra. "We expect the rupee to

trade around 84.5 against



the dollar by end December. A strong dollar continues to create a depreciating bias for currencies globally and is likely to sustain FPI outflows from Indian markets in the nearterm. However, interventions by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), supported by India's healthy foreign exchange reserves, should help keep rupee volatility in check," said Rajani Sinha, Chief Economist CareEdge Ratings.

FPIs have withdrawn approximately \$4 billion from Indian markets in November, following a record \$11 billion in outflows in October. While high US Treasury yields and a strong dollar have contributed to these outflows, other domestic factors have also been at play, such as muted corporate earnings and high valuations.

Meanwhile, the dollar index, which gauges the greenback's strength against a basket of six currencies, was trading lower by 0.02 per cent

Jio, Airtel, VIL lose subscribers; BSNL's surprise gain

New Delhi, Nov 21: Private telcos Reliance Jio, Bharti Airtel and Vodafone Idea cumulatively lost over one crore wireless subscribers in September, even as state-owned BSNL surprised with net adds of almost 8.5 lakh mobile users, as per monthly data released by TRAI.

Reliance Jio lost 79.69 lakh mobile subscribers in September compared to the previous month, Bharti Airtel (14.34 lakh users), and Vodafone Idea (15.53 lakh users). Bharat Sanchar Nigam Ltd (BSNL) added 8.49 lakh users to its wireless subscriber tally.

of Reliance Jio stood at 46.37 crore in September, while that of Bharti Airtel was 38.34 crore. The wireless user base of Vodafone Idea was 21.24 crore as of September 2024.

The wireless subscriber base



BSNL's gains in September pushed its subscriber tally to 9.18 crore. It is pertinent to mention that the three private telcos had hiked mobile tariffs by 10-27 per cent in July.

BSNL, however, refrained from following the footsteps of its larger rivals, and its Chairman and Managing Director

Robert Ravi recently ruled out an increase in tariffs, in the near future. "We can clearly say we are not going to increase our tariffs

in the near future," Ravi had told reporters in October. BSNL, in fact, is looking to proactively woo subscribers and claw back market share and recently launched a slew of new offerings and initiatives, ranging from spam blockers to automated SIM kiosks and direct-to-device services

According to TRAI subscriber data, with the sole exception of Odisha, all other service areas showed a decline in their wireless subscribers during September 2024. "As per the information re-

ceived from 1,167 operators in September 2024, in comparison to 1.219 operators in August 2024, the total Broadband Sub scribers decreased from 949.21 million at the end of August-24 to 944.40 million at the end of September-24 with a monthly decline rate of 0.51 per cent,' Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) said.

India must do an encore, if they are to define their true character.

The last time Australia won a series against India was a decade back. Since then they have won the ODI World Cup, the World Test Championship and the T20 World Cup. But none of those achievements appear to matter quite as much to Australian cricket fans as back-toback home defeats to India.

"I think for about half the change room we haven't won the Border-Gavaskar (Trophy), so it's kind of one of the last things to tick off I think for a lot of us," Australian skipper Pat Cummins said Thursday. "I also think almost every challenge that we've had thrown at us over the last few years, we've stepped up and done well. I think to do that for another year, another home summer would kind of cement the legacy of this team. So, yeah, we're all excited."

The anticipation has reached fever pitch. The back pages of some of Australia's papers have been printed Monday in Hindi.

In 2018-19 and 2020-21, India proved that lightning can strike twice with back-toback series wins in Australia, the first Asian team to do so. However, now the undeniable truth is that some of the stars driving this Indian unit are in the twilight of their hallowed PHOTO: CRICKET AUSTRALIA X

careers. How the five-match rubber against Cummins and his men unfolds could well decide their future.

Virat Kohli, Rohit, who will arrive before the second Test in Adelaide, and senior off-spinner Ravichandran Ashwin are facing that moment of reckoning again and an indifferent result could have repercussions.

Kohli's coronation as 'King Kohli' happened in 2014 in this very country with those four hundreds while Cheteshwar Pujara and Rishabh Pant still make appearances in the nightmares of the Aussie bowling quartet, which will certainly be playing their last BGT series together.
